<u>Note</u>: The Committee met jointly with the Public Facilities Committee to discuss the request to transfer \$65,000 to supplement the Public Building Department's repair and maintenance account and the consultants account, as well as transfers totaling \$24,197 to purchase a craftsperson vehicle. Public Buildings Commissioner Morse explained that the \$65,000 transfer provides funding for the Public Buildings Department to do additional work in Fiscal Year 2017. Commissioner Morse reviewed

the projects that the Department used to the contractual funds to complete or begin this fiscal year, which include the City Hall computer room air conditioning and window insulation, installation of an HVAC unit at the police annex, plumbing repairs, and solar energy consulting services.

Commissioner Morse stated that the department is using some of the requested funds to hire a consultant to vet a number of municipal sites for Phase 3 of the solar projects. In addition, the supplemental funds will allow the department to continue with building envelope maintenance to extend the life of building systems, and elevator repair projects.

Funds are available for transfer from the department's salary accounts because of a long-term vacancy in a plumbing position. A plumber recently hired to fill the vacant position. Councilor Fuller moved approval of the item in the Finance Committee, which carried unanimously. Councilor Albright moved approval of the item in the Public Facilities Committee and the motion carried unanimously.

#90-17 Transfer of \$75,000 to develop a Complete Streets Guidebook

Note: Director of Planning & Development Barney Heath presented the request for \$75,000 to hire consultants to develop a Complete Streets Guidebook for transportation and streetscape for both large and small projects. The book will include detailed standards for accessible design, crosswalk, traffic-calming methods, storm water management, street lighting, and bicycle lanes. It is critical that the City have a guidebook to follow to make those decisions and direct developers regarding what the City expects for these types of projects. Many other communities have developed this type of guidebook that lays out standards for both public and private developers. In addition, the guidebook will also help standardize the appearance in village centers in terms of streetscape.

It is a requirement of the Massachusetts Department of Transportation's (DOT) Complete Streets Grant Program, which the City is participating in and will continue to apply for that grant funding. The City released a Request for Qualifications to get the best possible consultant and get a scope of work for the \$75,000. There is no requirement from the DOT that the City hire a consultant but the City does not have the staff to develop the book. City staff will guide the consultant's work throughout the process. Once the guidebook is complete, in-house staff will keep the book up to date.

The Committee members agreed that it would be helpful for the initial work on the guidebook. They also stressed how important it will be to keep the book up to date once it is created. With that, Councilor Fuller moved approval, which carried unanimously.

#121-17 Appointment by His Honor the Mayor to the Taxation Aid Committee

<u>Note</u>: Director of Assessing Elizabeth Dromey and Emma Watkins joined the Committee to discuss Ms. Watkins' appointment to the Taxation Aid Committee. Ms. Watkins resume was provided and attached to the agenda. She is a resident of Newtonville and has worked in the human services field for the past twenty years. She is the Direction of the Cambridge Senior Center and in that role created programs and services that enrich the lives of older people. She is interested in serving on the Newton Taxation Aid Committee because it is an opportunity to help seniors and others who really need the support. The Committee's mission is to assist seniors who meet certain guidelines by helping them pay down their property taxes.

Ms. Dromey explained that the Taxation Aid Committee is comprised of the Chairman of the Board of Assessors, the Collector-Treasurer and three residents of the City. They meet to determine how to disburse funds that taxpayers voluntarily donated to provide tax aid to the elderly and disabled residents of Newton. The Committee's first order of business this year is to fundraise as the fund is at a very low level. Once the fund is at a healthy level, the Committee will do outreach to raise awareness of the program.

Committee members thanked Ms. Watkins for her willingness to serve on the Taxation Aid Committee. Councilor Norton moved approval of the appointment, which carried unanimously.
