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




- The environmental and health damages to abutters and the larger community of tree removal must be mitigated through planting replacement trees and/or cash payment into the City's tree fund.
- Payment or replacement trees may only be waived if the application process provides acceptable certification that the protected tree is dead, diseased, or dangerous or that removal of the protected tree will improve the overall health of the tree canopy.
- Trees on lots adjacent to construction sites must be protected from damage.




