

We are pleased to submit this letter proposal to provide professional landscape architecture and engineering services for the replacement of the backstop at the primary Newton North baseball field. The new backstop is intended to reduce the number of foul balls that currently leave the field premises. In essence, our continuing work constitutes the implementation of a strategy adopted during the recent feasibility study process.

Our basic scope of services shall include the following:

- 1. Site Survey + Baseplan- we will complete a field survey to locate all relevant site features and prepare a simple site baseplan for use in the development of designs and bid documents. The survey is needed because the field was constructed differently compared to what is shown on the final school/field construction plans.
- 2. Soil Borings + Geotechnical Assistance- Weston & Sampson will secure the services of a boring contractor to complete soil borings within the project vicinity. Borings will be observed by our personnel and a brief technical memo will be prepared identifying findings. The borings are required in order to confirm soil conditions and corresponding backstop support post foundation design requirements. We will need assistance from the City to

coordinate access and to pay for any police details that may be required during this operation, which is likely to encompass one day or less of field time.

3. Preliminary Designs- starting with preferences identified during the recent feasibility study, Weston & Sampson will prepare preliminary design documents, including plans, details, specifications and estimates for the backstop improvements. Documents will be prepared in accordance with City of Newton requirements.

If desired, Weston & Sampson will be prepared to meet with community representatives to discuss the project and present illustrative graphics conveying the nature of all desired improvements. We will also meet with you, your staff and other departments to review comments pertaining to the preliminary design submittal.

Upon the conclusion of the preliminary design phase, the scope and design of all backstop/field improvements will be fixed and the preparation of final designs and bid ready construction documents will commence.

4. Final Designs + Construction Documents- upon the receipt of preliminary design approvals, final designs and bid ready construction documents, including plans, details, specifications, and estimates will be prepared. When finished, the documents will be submitted for review by you and your staff and other departments. We anticipate that final design documents will represent a 95% complete level. After the receipt of comments and attendance at any design review meetings, we will prepare final construction documents. We assume that we will be providing final technical specifications and plans and we are prepared to assist the City in the compilation of the front end or "Boiler Plate" specifications.

Weston & Sampson will furnish plans and specifications in paper and electronic formats. The cost of publishing contract documents has not been included in this proposal.

We have established the following fee schedule for the work described above:

Subject: Request to Raise White Goods Collection Fees

The Department of Public Works initiated a fee based curbside collection of white goods in October 2011. At that time, we contracted with CRTR, which was the only vendor capable of meeting our requirements. A new contract with CRTR was amended to so that their service would expire in June, 2016 and the cost per collection/stop will increase from \$18 to \$25.

Accordingly, we need to revise the City Ordinance to reflect the new \$25 cost for collection as follows:

Sec. 11-15. White Goods:

White goods may be removed and disposed of by the Department of Public Works upon application to the Commissioner of Public Works by the owner or occupant of a building or premises who shall pay a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per stop, which will include one cathode ray tube item (TV or computer monitor). Each additional cathode ray tube item (TV and/or computer monitor) shall be charged an additional \$25.00 fee. All other white good items, as defined in Section 11-1 shall be included in each stop for no additional charge. All white goods offered for removal by application shall be of such form and so prepared and placed as the Commissioner of Public Works may specify or accept, otherwise they shall not be removed by the city. (Ord. No. Z-87, 05-16-11)




Dedham Street Drainage Improvements – Newton, MA

Project Description

The project includes improving an existing stormwater utility on Dedham Street by replacing the existing undersized 12-inch storm drain (extending from approximately Brush Hill Road to the culvert at Dedham Street over South Meadow Brook) with 700 linear feet of 36-inch and 42-inch reinforced concrete pipe. The scope of work also includes reconnection to existing catch basins, installation of new catch basins, construction of new manholes, and curb to curb paving. The purpose of this project is to alleviate flooding at the property located at #229 Dedham Street and also to prevent upstream manholes from overflowing during heavy rain events, which poses a hazard to public safety.

The project also includes repairs to the existing 7-foot high by 10-foot wide cast-in-place reinforced concrete box culvert at Dedham Street over South Meadow Brook that was evaluated and found to be structurally deficient. The culvert has an overall length of 62-feet. The intent of the culvert improvements is to address specific deficiencies that were identified as part of the structural evaluation. The existing culvert is in fair to poor condition, and is reaching its intended service life and is in need of rehabilitation. As part of the drainage improvements portion of the project, a new 42-inch diameter drain pipe will be installed through the south culvert wall.
