NOTE: Chief of Staff Maureen Lemieux explained that the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) allows a budget of \$1,116,000 for furniture, fixtures and equipment (FFE) for the new Angier School. The MSBA budget number was developed in 2004 and was based on a total of \$2,400 per student for FF&E and technology. Student needs have evolved since 2004 and inflation has increased costs for furniture, equipment and technology. The MSBA does allow the City to spend additional funds in the furniture and technology budgets but the added costs needs to be funded by the City.

The budget developed by the School Department for furniture, fixtures and equipment exceeds the MSBA allocation by \$235,629, which results in a budget of \$2,907 per student for FF&E based on the bids received. The School Department's FFE budget is in line with similar elementary school projects that have occurred in the last three years. The above request is to transfer a total of \$235,629 from the owners contingency line item (\$182,748 to Furniture and

\$52,881 to Technology cover the additional costs above the MSBA allocation for furniture, fixtures and equipment. The Committee understood the need for the transfer and a motion to approve carried unanimously.
