Dear Members of the Zoning and Planning Committee:

At Peter Harrington's request, I will be making a brief presentation to your committee on Monday, Feb. 28, 2022 in support of docketed item #42-22, the "Citizens petition to amend the village center district."

My remarks will focus on the necessity of village centers having open green space that will act as a social gathering space thereby enhancing the vibrancy of the village center. I will propose that village centers that lack a social gathering space are more correctly called "commercial districts".

Utile Design's analysis of village centers presented on 9-13-2021 included a Venn Diagram that illustrates which "Metrics of Success" 11 of Newton's village centers have achieved (see attached slide). Given that the definition of "village center" includes having a social gathering space, I propose that the presence of reasonably large green open space be added as a fourth metric of success. The attached slide expands Utile's analysis and illustrates which of the four metrics of success are achieved by 11 of Newton's village centers.
