She currently serves on the Massachusetts Energy Efficiency Advisory Council, which oversees the state's \$4B utility three-year programs. She served on the Board of the Northeast Clean Energy Council for 5 years, where she chaired the Governance and Nomination Committee. She is currently seeking opportunities for part-time advisory roles and corporate board seats where she feels she can provide value.

Ms. Arcate has served on the Joint Nominating Committee of the ISO-NE Board of Directors. While at National Grid she served on the subsidiary Boards of New England Power Company, Granite State Electric Company and the Yankee Nuclear Companies.
