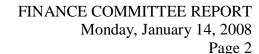

NOTE: The Committee was joined this evening by Ed Spellman, Treasurer/Collector and City Solicitor Dan Funk. Mr. Funk explained that the total amount of fees and penalties assessed to the City as the result of this processing error was \$275,000. To date, \$175,000 of that amount has been waived (as the result of appeals made by the City). It is hoped that a total of another \$90,000 will be waived before this issue is settled. The cost of processing all of these appeals, etc. will be at a total of \$37,000 to the City (for legal services).

The Committee understood the need to support this appropriation and certainly appreciated the fact that the City has been able to get the fees waived to this point. After very brief discussion, the Committee voted 8-0 to approve this appropriation request.

NOTE: Judy Jacobsen of the Community Preservation Committee was present this evening. She gave a brief overview of this proposed acquisition project. The Committee then heard a brief report (of discussion which took place in the Committee on Community Preservation on 11/27/07). Following that, the Committee heard a brief presentation from Mayor Cohen and Public Buildings Commissioner Nick Parnell.

The Committee also reviewed the most recent documentation submitted (which was distributed as an attachment to this evening's agenda; see attached).

Although there were many members of the public present this evening, the remainder of discussion on these items was done in Committee only. After each member of the Committee had the opportunity to make statements regarding their views on these two items, votes were taken. DUE TO THE FACT THAT THERE ARE CONFLICTING COMMITTEE REPORTS ON BOTH OF THESE ITEMS, A DETAILED VERBAL REPORT WILL BE GIVEN BY THE CHAIRMAN OF FINANCE ON THE FLOOR OF THE BOARD ON TUESDAY, JANUARY 22ND.

On the motion to approve item #360-07, the Committee voted 2 in favor, 4 opposed (Ald. Coletti, Lennon, Salvucci and Gentile) and 2 abstaining (Ald. Johnson and Schnipper). Therefore, the motion to approve failed to carry. There was no motion to substitute denial of this item.

On the motion to approve item #360-07(2), the Committee voted 1 in favor, 5 opposed (Ald. Coletti, Lennon, Salvucci, Gentile and Freedman) and 2 abstaining (Ald. Johnson and Schnipper). There was no motion to substitute denial of this item.

All other items were held. The Committee adjourned at approximately 10:50 p.m.
