#### Persevere in Purple Day!

On October 27th, join The Purple Wing Project and students across Newton as we wear the color purple to bring awareness to domestic violence and resources for the community. The Purple Wing Project is a youth-led organization based in Massachusetts. Their mission is to advocate, raise funds, and spread awareness to bridge the intersection between domestic violence and gun safety. They took action in the wake of the Supreme Court case, United States v. Rahimi, a pending case that contends an individual's ability to possess firearms under the Second Amendment while subject to a domestic violence restraining order. They are currently in collaboration with many local and regional organizations including, but not limited to REACH Beyond Domestic Violence, The Second Step, RESPOND Inc., Moms and Students Demand Action, Love Life Now Foundation, The Massachusetts Coalition to Prevent Gun Violence. # **October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month**

For nearly four decades now, the country has recognized October as National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. It is a time annually devoted to educating everyone about breast cancer (including metastatic breast cancer) and the importance of early detection and access to timely, high-quality care. Each year in the United States, about 240,000 cases of breast cancer are diagnosed in women and about 2,100 in men. About 42,000 women and 500 men in the U.S. die each year from breast cancer.

Are you up to date on your breast cancer screening? Early detection saves lives! Mammograms can often show a breast lump before it can be felt. Contact your healthcare provider to schedule an appointment.



While mammograms can help you to detect cancer before you can feel a lump, breast self-exams help you to be familiar with how your breasts look and feel so you can alert your healthcare professional if there are any changes. Learn how to do a self-exam <u>here</u>.

# **October is Youth Substance Use Prevention Month**

In his proclamation, President Biden emphasizes that it is important to rededicate ourselves to building a better future for America's children by providing families, educators and communities with access to life saving resources. According to SAMHSA's 2020 National Survey on Drug Use and Health, 8.2% of adolescents drank alcohol in the past month and 13.8% used illicit drugs in the past year. Early intervention is vital for youth. Every year that substance use is delayed while the adolescent brain develops, the risk of addiction and substance misuse decrease.

SAMHSA's national youth substance use prevention campaign<u>"Talk. They Hear</u> <u>You."</u> helps parents and caregivers, educators, and community members get informed, be prepared, and take action to prevent underage drinking and other substance use.

Newton Health & Human Services is partnering with the Holtzman Medical Group to offer the <u>updated 2023-2024 Moderna COVID-19 vaccine</u> for individuals 6 months and older. Due to shipping delays that are affecting clinics nationwide, there is a limited number of vaccines for individuals aged 11 and younger. You can also check <u>vaccines.gov</u> for other clinic locations near you. The Holtzman clinics will be taking place in the Druker Auditorium at the Newton Free Library located at 330 Homer Street, Newton, MA 02459.
