FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 2007

#283-07 <u>HIS HONOR THE MAYOR</u> requesting an appropriation in the amount of \$15,000 from Budget Reserve for the purpose of increasing the Law Department account for outside legal services. This sum will cover the cost of paying the attorney retained to negotiate the closeout of the construction of Newton South High School, as well as allowing the Department to retain the services of Gayle Smalley to complete the task of recodifying the City's ordinances. [09-11-07 @ 4:10 PM]

ACTION: APPROVED 6-0

NOTE: City Solicitor Dan Funk was present this evening, along with Associate City Solicitor Ouida Young. They explained that these funds are requested to cover two needs of the Law Department. The first need is to provide further funding to pay Attorney Robert Garrity (of Garrity and Knisely) to assist in the close-out of the Newton South construction project. These funds are needed because the original appropriation of \$25,000 (approved in late 2005) has now been exhausted. Attorney Garrity has worked with the Law Department throughout this closeout process, which has now resulted in the execution of a Settlement Agreement with Travelers Casualty and Surety Company to complete the "punch list" work on this project. The funds requested (\$7,500) will cover legal fees incurred during July 2007 (settlement negotiations) and to pay Attorney Garrity for any further legal expenses related to the project close-out.

The second component to this appropriation request (for the remaining \$7,500) is to retain the services of former Associate City Solicitor Gayle Smalley, under contract, in order to finish the ordinance recodification project and as a short-term legal consultant. Gayle has worked with City Clerk David Olson towards recodification of the City Ordinances, however, the project is not complete yet. Additionally, as the Law Department transitions files and projects that Gayle has worked on over her tenure, her continued periodic input on an as-needed basis will assist the Department in moving forward in a timely manner on many of the pending tasks.



The Committee understood the need for the services of both of these attorneys and, after very brief discussion, voted 6-0 to approve this appropriation request.

<u>NOTE</u>: Chief Joseph LaCroix joined the Committee this evening, along with Chief Budget Officer Susan Burstein, to discuss this request.

The Committee reviewed the details of the discussion had by the Public Safety/Transportation Committee on September 9th (see attached report excerpt) as well as had some discussion with Chief LaCroix relative to the capital needs for the department. There was also discussion regarding the current pieces of equipment that are available through Pierce Fire Engine Co. (which will be the inventory that the City will choose from to purchase this replacement apparatus).

Committee members understood that this requested appropriation is expected to cover the needs of the Department to purchase this apparatus. Members also understood the need to replace this equipment in as timely a manner as possible.

The Mayor submitted (attached) a letter dated September 21, 2007 declaring this item to be an emergency measure. Committee members supported this declaration, and understood that there will be a need to take a separate vote on the floor of the Board on October 1st to enact the emergency preamble for this appropriation (to enable the Chief to go ahead and expedite the purchase of this vehicle without having the wait the usual 20 days before expending these funds).

The Committee voted 6-0 to approve this item.
