#110-05(4) <u>HIS HONOR THE MAYOR</u> submitting proposed Water/Sewer rate adjustments for FY06 for Board of Aldermen approval. Said rates to be implemented on July 1, 2005.

#177-05 <u>HIS HONOR THE MAYOR</u> requesting that the sum of \$90,000 be appropriated from Salary Reserve for the purpose of supplementing the FY05 General Fund Health Insurance budget for several municipal departments.
