## REFERRED TO PROGRAMS & SERVICES AND FINANCE COMMITTEES

#36-04 <u>HIS HONOR THE MAYOR</u> requesting an appropriation in the amount of

\$219,436 from Budget Reserve for the purpose of funding current and future snow and ice and tree emergency expenses in the Parks and

Recreation Department.

**ACTION: APPROVED 7-0** 

**NOTE:** Fran Towle and Bob DeRubeis were present from the Parks and Recreation Department this evening. They presented some backup information dated December 30<sup>th</sup> (which was attached to the Committee agenda this evening). This explained that they seek to replace their "seed money" for costs associated with tree emergencies and snow and ice control. Thusfar, the department has expended \$184,068 for equipment rental, \$32,115 for department overtime, and \$3,253 for tree equipment rental. They provided information relative to the five contracts that they will be using this winter for snow and ice control as well as tree emergencies.

As part of the review of this item the Committee discussed the role that the Parks and Recreation Department plays in supporting the Public Works Department in its snow removal efforts. The Committee understood that the schools (including parking lots) and municipal buildings (including the Senior Center) are handled by this Department. Many of the employees who work in Parks and Recreation work with the Public Works Department to accomplish this.

It was understood that the contractors had not yet been paid for the work performed in the two previous snowstorms. An analysis was done at the Programs and Services Committee on 1/7 that showed that the contractors had not submitted all of the necessary paperwork (including insurance documents) in order for their contracts to be processed so that they could subsequently be paid. The Programs and Services Committee (including

the Finance Chairman) requested that both the Public Works and Parks and Recreation Departments expedite the filing of paperwork to ensure that these contracts could be signed and the contractors can be paid in short order.

The attached information shows the names of these companies and facts relative to the processing of their contracts. It is expected that, by the end of this week, all contracts will be signed and checks for these contractors will be cut manually.

With that understanding, the Committee voted 7-0 to approve this item.

## REFERRED TO PUBLIC FACILITIES AND FINANCE COMMITTEES

#39-04 <u>HIS HONOR THE MAYOR</u> requesting an appropriation in the amount of

\$548,480 from Budget Reserve for the purpose of supplementing the

Department of Public Works control of snow and ice budget.

**ACTION:** APPROVED 7-0

<u>NOTE</u>: This item is similar to the previous item in that backup information was presented by Commissioner Bob Rooney and Brian Connolly of the PublicWorks Department requesting that funds be appropriated to the following accounts; (\$197,765) Overtime Snow and Ice, (\$13,647) Special Compensation, (\$270,475) Rental of Vehicles and Equipment, (\$17,083) Sand and Salt, (\$33,525) Auto Parts/Lube/Vehicle Maintenance, (\$5,985) Meals. A spreadsheet showing the various costs for snow and ice control efforts from December 2<sup>nd</sup> through 22<sup>nd</sup> was submitted to the Committee for review.

The Committee reviewed this request carefully. There has been a total of 26" of snow and a cost of \$214,843 in Overtime, \$239,942 for Overtime for workers from other departments, \$326,775 for rental of equipment, \$177,043 for sand and salt, and \$31,525 on vehicle maintenance. To date, the Public Works Department has spent \$779,735 on control of snow and ice. The Committee also reviewed some re-cap information on these storms that was presented by Brian Connolly.

The Committee was satisfied with the information presented in regards to this request. This appropriation should replenish the proper accounts in the hopes of carrying the City through the next month or so for what it might need for control of snow and ice.

There are only two contracting companies working for the Public Works Department in this function (Paolini Corp. and Jewett Construction). One of these contractors has brought in all of the required paperwork and the other is very close to having the required final insurance documents filed. Both of these contracts will be signed and checks cut within this week, as assured by both Mr. Rooney and Mr. Connolly.

With that understanding, the Committee voted 7-0 to approve this item.
