The following is a message from the Newton School Committee sent out to the school community a few minutes ago:

Dear NPS Families,

The School Committee arrived at the Education Center ready to begin negotiations at 8:30 a.m. We are committed to continuing to work hard to create, revise, and update proposals that respond to the needs identified by the NTA.

Our goal is to settle a contract that honors our staff for the hard work they do every day. This means providing a salary and benefits package that responds to the needs of our employees and allows us to establish and sustain the supports needed in our classrooms and school buildings.
