**SERVICING, REPAIRING, INSTALLATION AND PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE OF  
AIR CONDITIONING EQUIPMENT, ELECTRICAL AND PNEUMATIC  
CONTROLS AND HEATING EQUIPMENT**

**IT IS THE INTENTION OF THE CITY OF NEWTON PUBLIC BUILDINGS DEPARTMENT TO  
AWARD UP TO FOUR (4) CONTRACTORS FOR THIS WORK.**

The City is soliciting prices for services as set forth in the Specifications below. It is the City's intent to award up to four (4) separate contracts to the responsible and eligible bidders submitting the lowest Proposed Contract Prices on Bid Form 24-49. The City will award one (1) contract to the lowest responsible and eligible bidder ("Principal Contract") and second, third, and fourth contracts to the second, third, and fourth lowest responsible and eligible bidders ("Back Up Contracts"). The Principal Contract estimated amount shall be equal to 30% of the amount of the lowest responsible and eligible bidder's bid; the estimated Back Up Contract amounts for the second and third lowest responsible and eligible bidders shall each be equal to 25% of the amount of their bids; and the estimated Back Up Contract amounts for the fourth lowest responsible and eligible bidders shall each be equal to 20% of the amount of their bids. **The City will use its best efforts to assign contractors to sites in proportion to their estimated contract percentage amount, subject to such modifications as may be in the City's best interest. It is possible that one or all Back Up Contract contractors will receive no work under its contract.**

Bids will be received until **10:30 a.m., Thursday, February 29, 2024** at the Purchasing Department, Room 108, Newton City Hall, 1000 Commonwealth Ave., Newton, MA 02459. Bids will not be accepted nor may submitted bids be corrected, modified or withdrawn after the deadline for bids. Following the deadline for bids, all bids received within the time specified will be publicly opened and read aloud.

Contract Documents will be available for pickup on the City's website at [www.newtonma.gov/bids](http://www.newtonma.gov/bids) or for pickup at the Purchasing Department **after 10:00 a.m., February 15, 2024**. There is no charge for contract documents.

During the bidding period, the City of Newton shall make available, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m., all facilities for all bidders to visit the facilities with designated City personnel. **The City strongly encourages each bidder to visit each site; bidders will be responsible for all work under this Contract whether they visit sites or not.** *Bidders may contact Art Cabral / Public Buildings to arrange viewing at (617) 796-1600 or (617) 594-2457.*

The term of the contracts shall extend from **July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025**. The City, at its sole discretion, shall have the option to renew any or all contracts for **two (2) additional one (1) year terms**, with no change in a contract's price and terms and conditions. The exercise of each option to renew shall be subject to appropriation of funding therefor.

All bids must be accompanied by a bid deposit in an amount that is not less than five percent (5%) of the value of the bid, including all add alternates. Bid deposits, payable to the City of Newton, shall be either in the form of a bid bond, or cash, or a certified check on, or a treasurer's or cashier's check issued by, a responsible bank or trust company. **All bids shall be submitted as one ORIGINAL and one COPY.** Bidders are reminded that the bid deposit covers the City for damages when a bidder withdraws its bid after the bid submission date. **Be advised that to the extent permitted by the law the City will retain all bid deposits for withdrawn bids.**

All bids are subject to the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 149, Section 44 A-J. **Wages are subject** to minimum wage rates determined by the Massachusetts Department of Labor and Industries pursuant to M.G.L. Chapter 149, Sec. 26 to 27H. The schedule of wage rates applicable to this contract is included in the bidding documents. In addition, the prevailing wage schedule will be updated annually for all public construction projects lasting longer than one (1) year. You will be required to pay the rates set out in any updated prevailing wage schedule. Increases in prevailing wage schedules will not be the basis for change order requests. The successful bidder will be required to provide a Certificate of Insurance demonstrating current coverage of the type and amounts set forth in the Project Manual. The successful bidder will be required to furnish a **Performance and Labor and Materials Payment Bonds**, each in the amount of **100%** of the contract total.

**The costs of any bond and any insurance required in this Invitation For Bid are the responsibility of the bidder; such costs will not be reimbursed by City and should be included in your bid.**

Note that Massachusetts law imposes certain documentation requirements for public contracts, including but not limited to, contractor DCAMM certification, bid, performance and payment bonds, and non-collusion and tax certifications. A contract is not effective until it is signed by the City Mayor, and the Mayor will not sign until all documentation requirements have been met. Once an award is made, a contract must be executed promptly so the City can start scheduled work. The City cannot pay for work done without a contract. If a vendor unduly delays submitting all required paperwork, the City will be under no obligation to pay a vendor promptly even after a contract is effective, it could bar the vendor from future bids as not responsible and may require the City to obtain services from another vendor or contractor.

All City of Newton bids are available on the City's web site, [www.newtonma.gov/bids](http://www.newtonma.gov/bids) Invitation for Bid. It is the sole responsibility of the contractor downloading these bids to ensure they have received any and all addenda prior to the bid opening. Addenda's will be available online within the original bid document as well as a separate file. If you download bids from the internet site and would like to make it known that your company has done so, you must fax the Purchasing Dept. The City will reject any and all bids in accordance with the above referenced General Laws. In addition, the City reserves the right to waive minor informalities in any or all bids, or to reject any or all bids (in whole or in part) if it be in the public interest to do so.

**INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS**

**ARTICLE 1 - BIDDER'S REPRESENTATION**

- 1.1 Each General Bidder (hereinafter called the "Bidder") by making a bid (hereinafter called "bid") represents that:
1. The Bidder has read and understands the Bidding Documents, Contract Forms, General Conditions, Conditions of the Contract, General Requirements and Project Specifications (collectively, referred to as the "Contract Documents") and the bid is made in accordance therewith.
  2. The Bidder has had the opportunity to visit the approximately 60 worksites listed at pp. 45-47 below ("Worksites") **The City will use its best efforts to assign contractors to sites in proportion to their estimated contract percentage amount, subject to such modifications as may be in the City's best interest.** and is familiar with the local conditions under which the work has to be performed.
- 1.2 Failure to so examine the Contract Documents, visit the worksites, or become familiar with local conditions will not relieve any Bidder from any obligation under its bid as submitted.

**ARTICLE 2 - REQUEST FOR INTERPRETATION**

- 2.1 Bidders shall promptly notify the City of any ambiguity, inconsistency, or error which they may discover upon examination of the Contract Documents, the site, and local conditions.
- 2.2 Bidders requiring clarification or interpretation of the Contract Documents shall make a written request to the *Chief Procurement Officer*, at [purchasing@newtonma.gov](mailto:purchasing@newtonma.gov) or via facsimile (617) 796-1227. The City will only answer such requests if received by **Friday, February 23, 2024 at 12:00 noon**. In the event that the bid opening date is changed, the deadline for informational requests may also change as provided in an addendum issued by the City.
- 2.3 Interpretation, correction, or change in the Contract Documents will be made by addendum which will become part of the Contract Documents. The City will not be held accountable for any oral communication.
- 2.4 Addenda will be emailed to every individual or firm on record as having taken a set of Contract Documents. Addenda will be emailed to every individual or firm on record as having taken a set of Contract Documents. Receipt of all addenda issued must be acknowledged in the Bid Form. **YOUR FAILURE TO ACKNOWLEDGE ALL ADDENDA MAY RESULT IN YOUR BID BEING REJECTED AS NON-RESPONSIVE.**
- 2.5 Copies of addenda will be made available for inspection at the location listed in the Invitation for Bids (IFB) where Contract Documents are on file, in addition to being available online at [www.newtonma.gov/bids](http://www.newtonma.gov/bids).
- 2.6 Bidders or proposers contacting ANY CITY EMPLOYEE regarding an IFB, outside of the Purchasing Department, once an IFB has been released, may be disqualified from the procurement process.
- 2.7 Bidders downloading information off the internet web site are solely responsible for obtaining any addenda prior to the bid opening. If the bidder makes itself known to the Purchasing Department, at [purchasing@newtonma.gov](mailto:purchasing@newtonma.gov) or via facsimile (617) 796-1227, it shall be placed on the bidder's list. Bidders must provide the Purchasing Department with their company's name, street address, city, state, zip, phone, fax, email address and **INVITATION FOR BID #24-49**.

**ARTICLE 3 - MBE PARTICIPATION**

- 3.1 Notice is hereby given that the Mayor's Affirmative Action Plan for the City of Newton in effect at the time of this solicitation is applicable to all construction contracts in excess of \$10,000.00.
- 3.2 Notice is hereby given that the City of Newton Minority/Women Business Enterprise Plan and the Supplemental Equal Employment Opportunity Anti-Discrimination and Affirmative Action Program in effect at the time of this solicitation are applicable to all City contracts for goods and services in excess of \$50,000.00.

## ARTICLE 4 - PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- 4.1 Bids shall be submitted on the "Bid Form #24-49," attached.
- 4.2 All entries on the Bid Form shall be made by typewriter or in ink.
- 4.3 Where so indicated on the Bid Form, sums shall be expressed in both words and figures. Where there is a discrepancy between the bid sum expressed in words and the bid sum expressed in figures, the words shall control.
- 4.4 Bid Deposits shall be submitted in the amount specified in the IFB. They shall be made payable to the City and shall be either in the form of cash, certified check, treasurer's or cashier's check issued by a responsible bank or trust company, or a bid bond issued by a surety licensed to do business in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; and shall be conditioned upon the faithful performance by the principal of the agreements contained in the bid. Bidders are reminded that the bid deposit covers the City for damages when a bidder withdraws its bid after the bid submission date. **Be advised that to the extent permitted by the law the City will retain all bid deposits for withdrawn bids.**

Bid deposits of the four (4) lowest responsible and eligible Bidders shall be retained until the execution and delivery of the City-Contractor agreement.

- 4.5 The Bid, including the bid deposit shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope with the following plainly marked on the outside:

- 4.6 Date and time for receipt of bids is set forth in the IFB.
- 4.7 Timely delivery of a bid at the location designated shall be the full responsibility of the Bidder. In the event that Newton City Hall is closed on the date or at the time that bids are due, the date and time for receipt of bids shall be on the next business day following that the Newton City Hall and the Purchasing Department are open.
- 4.8 Bids shall be submitted with one (1) **original** and one (1) **copy**.
- 4.9 Massachusetts law requires all employees who work on Massachusetts public works construction sites must have no Less than 10 hours of OSHA-approved safety and health training. See M.G.L. c.30, §39M( c), M.G.L. c.30, §39S(a)(1), M.G.L. c.149, §44E(2) & M.G.L. c.149, §44F(2).
1. This requirement will apply to any general bid or sub bid submitted.
  2. This law directs the Massachusetts Attorney General to restrain the award of construction contracts to any contractor who is in violation to this requirement and to restrain the performance of these contracts by non-complying contractors.
  3. The contractor and all subcontractors on this project must certify on the Bid Form compliance with the applicable requirement. Non-compliance with this law will disqualify the bidder.

## ARTICLE 5 - ALTERNATES

- 5.1 Each Bidder shall acknowledge alternates (if any) in Section C on the Bid Form.
- 5.2 In the event an alternate does not involve a change in the amount of the base bid, the Bidder shall so indicated by writing "No Change", or "N/C" or "0" in the space provided for that alternate.
- 5.3 Bidders shall enter on the Bid Form a single amount for each alternate which shall consist of the amount for work performed by the Contractor.
- 5.4 The low Bidder will be determined on the basis of the sum of the base bid and the accepted alternates.

## ARTICLE 6 - WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

- 6.1 Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the time designated for receipt of bids on written or electronic request. Electronic withdrawal of bids must be confirmed over the Bidder's signature by written notice postmarked on or before the date and time set for receipt of bids.
- 6.2 Withdrawn bids may be resubmitted up to the time designated for the receipt of bids.
- 6.3 No bids may be withdrawn within sixty (60) days, Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after the opening of the bids.

## ARTICLE 7 - CONTRACT AWARD

- 7.1 The City is soliciting prices for services as set forth in the Specifications at pp. 44-57 below. It is the City's intent to award up to four (4) separate contracts to the responsible and eligible bidders submitting the lowest Proposed Contract Prices on Bid Form 24-49. The City will award one (1) contract to the lowest responsible and eligible bidder ("Principal Contract") and second, third and fourth contracts to the second, third and fourth lowest responsible and eligible bidders ("Back Up Contracts"). The Principal Contract estimated amount shall be equal to 30% of the amount of the lowest responsible and eligible bidder's bid; the estimated Back Up Contract amounts for the second and third lowest responsible and eligible bidders shall each be equal to 25% of the amount of their bids; and the estimated Back Up Contract amounts for the fourth lowest responsible and eligible bidders shall each be equal to 20% of the amount of their bids. In the event the City receives fewer than four (4) contract awards, contract awards shall be in the same proportions as if four bids were received. **The City will use its best efforts to assign contractors to Worksites in proportion to their estimated contract percentage amount, subject to such modifications as may be in the City's best interest. It is possible that the Back Up Contract contractor will receive no work under its contract.** Contracts will be awarded within sixty (60) days, Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays excluded, after the opening of bids.
- 7.2 The City reserves the right to waive minor informalities in or to reject any or all Bids if it be in the public interest to do so.
- 7.3 The City reserves the right to reject any bidder who has failed to pay any local taxes, fees, assessments, betterments, or any other municipal charge, unless the bidder has a pending abatement application or has entered into a payment agreement with the collector-treasurer.
- 7.4 As used herein, the term "lowest responsible and eligible Bidder" shall mean the Bidder (1) whose bid is the lowest of those bidders possessing the skill, ability and integrity necessary for the faithful performance of the work; (2) who has met all the requirements of the invitation for bids; (3) who shall certify that he is able to furnish labor that can work in harmony with all other elements of labor employed or to be employed in the work; (4) who, where the provisions of section eight B of chapter twenty-nine apply, shall have been determined to be qualified thereunder.
- 7.5 Subsequent to the award and within five (5) days, Saturday, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after the prescribed forms are presented for signature, the successful Bidder shall execute and deliver to the City a contract in the form included in the Contract Documents in such number of counterparts as the City may require.
- 7.6 In the event that the City receives low bids in identical amount from two or more responsible and eligible Bidders, the City shall select the successful Bidder by a blind selection process chosen by the City such as flipping a coin or drawing names from a hat. The low Bidders who are under consideration will be invited to attend and observe the selection process.

## ARTICLE 8 - TAXES

- 8.1 The Bidder shall not include in this bid any tax imposed upon the sale or rental of tangible personal property in this Commonwealth, such as any and all building materials, supplies, services and equipment required to complete the work.
- 8.2 The City is exempt from payment of the Massachusetts Sales Tax, and the Bidder shall not include any sales tax on its bid. The City's exemption Number is E-046-001-404.

## ARTICLE 9 – PROPRIETARY SPECIFICATIONS

- 9.1 The City has used a proprietary specification to describe the supply listed in the specifications. Such specifications are permitted under M.G.L. c. 30, §39M(b), provided that the City states in writing that use of the proprietary specification is in its best interest and that it will accept an “equal” of the item specified. An item is considered equal if (i) it is at least equal in quality, durability, appearance, strength, and design; (ii) will perform the intended function at least equally; and (iii) conforms substantially, even with deviations, to the detailed requirements contained in the specifications. In the event that the Bidder wishes to substitute an equal item, it may do so either in its bid or proposal or after the contract is awarded but before a contract is executed, it being understood that the award shall be conditioned on the Bidder providing the item originally specified or an equal item accepted by the City and identified in the contract. In no event shall the Bidder be entitled to offer, or the City obliged to consider, the substitution of an item as equal after execution of a contract. In the event the Bidder substitutes or attempts to substitute an “equal” item after that date, it shall be in breach thereof and be liable for actual and consequential damages resulting from its failure to perform as agreed. The City shall have the sole right to determine whether or not said item is equal.
- 9.2 The required determination and justification have been duly prepared, and a copy may be requested in accordance with the Massachusetts Public Records Law, M.G.L. c. 66, §10.

**E.** The undersigned agrees that, if s/he is selected as general contractor, s/he will within five days, Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after presentation thereof by the awarding authority, execute a contract in accordance with the terms of this bid and furnish a labor and materials or payment bond, each of a surety company qualified to do business under the laws of the commonwealth and satisfactory to the awarding authority and each in the sum of the contract price, the premiums for which are to be paid by the general contractor and are included in the contract price.

The undersigned hereby certifies that s/he is able to furnish labor that can work in harmony with all other elements of labor employed or to be employed on the work and that s/he will comply fully with all laws and regulations applicable to awards made subject to section forty-four A of M.G.L. The undersigned understands that any employee found on a worksite subject to this section without documentation of successful completion of a course in construction safety and health approved by the United States Occupational Safety and Health Administration that is at least 10 hours in duration shall be subject to immediate removal.

The undersigned further certifies under the penalties of perjury that this bid is in all respects bona fide, fair and made without collusion or fraud with any other person. As used in this subsection the word "person" shall mean any natural person, joint venture, partnership, corporation or other business or legal entity. The undersigned further certifies under penalty of perjury that the said undersigned is not presently debarred from doing public construction work in the Commonwealth under the provisions of section twenty-nine F of chapter twenty-nine, or any other applicable debarment provisions of any other chapter of the General Laws or any rule or regulation promulgated thereunder.



In the event, that the contract is abandoned by the PRINCIPAL, or in the event that the Oblige terminates the employment of the PRINCIPAL or the authority of the PRINCIPAL to continue the work said SURETY hereby further agrees that said SURETY shall, if requested in writing by the Oblige, take such action as is necessary to complete said contract.

**GENERAL CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION**

**1.0 DEFINITIONS**

**1.1 THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS**

The term "Contract Documents" sometimes also referred to as the "Contract", means the contract entered into between the City of Newton (hereinafter "City") and the Contractor. It includes the Invitation for Bid, General Bid Form, Contract Form, these General Conditions of the Contract, Supplements and Amendments to the General Conditions (if any), Contract Specifications, Drawings, all addenda issued prior to execution of the contract, the Bid Bond, the Labor and Material Payment Bond, or other assurances of completion, the applicable wage rate determinations, and other documents listed in the Agreement and modifications issued after execution of the contract.

**1.2 THE WORK**

The term "Work", sometimes also referred to as the "Project", means the construction and services required by the Contract Documents, whether completed or partially completed, and includes all other labor, materials, equipment, and services provided or to be provided by the Contractor to fulfill the Contractor's obligation.

**1.3 OWNER**

The term "Owner" is the City of Newton.

**1.4 CONTRACT OFFICER**

The term "Contract Officer" means the person appointed by the Owner to administer the terms of the Contract between the Owner and the Contractor, who is also empowered to take certain actions under this Agreement.

**1.5 CONTRACTOR**

1.5.1 The Contractor, sometimes referred to as the General Contractor, is the person or entity identified as such throughout the Contract Documents as if singular in number. The term Contractor means the Contractor or its authorized representative.

1.5.2 The Contractor shall supervise and direct the Work, using the Contractor's best skill and attention. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for and have control over construction means, methods, techniques, sequences and procedures, and for coordinating all portions of the Work under the Contract.

**1.6 SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION**

The term "Substantial Completion" means the value of the work remaining to be performed by the Contractor is, in the estimate of the awarding authority, less than one percent (1%) of the original contract price.

**2.0 CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION**

**2.1 PRE-CONSTRUCTION CONFERENCE**

2.1.1 Prior to commencement of the Work, the Contractor shall meet in conference with representatives of the Owner regarding the Owner's requirements under the Contract for administration of the quality assurance program, safety program, labor provisions, the schedule of work, and other Contract procedures.

2.1.2 For larger Project Work that required an estimate and/or quote, the Contractor shall begin work upon receipt of a written Notice to Proceed from the Contract Officer or designee. The Contractor shall not begin work prior to receiving such notice.

**2.2 CONTRACT PERIOD**

The Contractor shall complete all work required under this contract within the timeframe specified elsewhere in this document, or within the time schedule established in the notice to proceed issued by the Contracting Officer.

## **2.3 REJECTION OF DEFECTIVE MATERIALS AND WORK**

The Owner's inspection of the Work shall not relieve the Contractor of any of its responsibilities to fulfill the Contract obligations, and defective work shall be corrected without cost to the Owner. Unsuitable work may be rejected by the Owner, notwithstanding that such work and materials have been previously overlooked or misjudged by the Owner and accepted for payment. If the Work or any part thereof shall be found defective at any time before the final acceptance of the whole Work, the Contractor shall forthwith correct such defect in a manner satisfactory to the Owner, and if any material brought upon the site for use in the Work, or selected for the same, shall be rejected by the Owner as unsuitable or not in conformity with the Contract requirements, the Contractor shall forthwith remove such materials from the vicinity of the Work.

## **2.4 CHANGES**

2.4.1 All changes in the work including any increase, decrease, or other equitable adjustment in the Contract price or in the time for performing the Contract, shall be authorized in writing by the Owner and/or Contract Officer prior to commencement.

## **2.5 CONTRACT PRICE**

The Contract Price that is stated in the Contract Form, and including authorized adjustments, is the upset contract total of potential work for the Contractor for the performance of the Work under the Contract Documents.

## **2.6 APPLICATIONS FOR PAYMENT**

2.6.1 Once each month, on a date established by the Owner at the beginning of the Work, the Contractor shall deliver to the Owner an itemized Application for Payment, supported by such data substantiating the Contractor's right to payment as the Owner may require, and reflecting a minimum of 5% retainage until the final acceptance and payment by the Owner.

2.6.2 The Owner shall make payment to the Contractor within 30 days of receipt of said application, less any applicable retainage.

2.6.3 The Owner may make changes in any application for payment submitted by the Contractor for:

- i. Retention based on the value of its claims against the Contractor,
- ii. Retention of 5% of the approved amount of the Application for Payment.
- iii. Contested or disputed charges in whole or in part.

## **2.7 FINAL PAYMENT**

The acceptance by the Contractor of the last payment due under this Contract or the execution of the Final Certificate of Completion, shall operate as a release to the Owner from all claims and liability related to this Contract.

## **2.8 GUARANTY AND WARRANTY**

### **2.8.1 WARRANTY**

The Contractor warrants to the Owner that materials and equipment furnished under the Contract will be of good quality and new unless otherwise required or permitted by the Contract Documents, that the Work will be free from defects not inherent in the quality required or permitted, and that the Work will conform with the requirements of the Contract Documents. Work not conforming to these requirements, including substitutions not properly approved and authorized, may be considered defective. If required by the Owner, the Contractor shall furnish satisfactory evidence as to the kind and quality of materials and equipment.

### **2.8.2 GENERAL GUARANTY**

If at any time during the period of one (1) year from the date of Substantial Completion of the Work to be performed under this Contract, any part of the Work shall, in the reasonable determination of the Owner, require replacing or repairing due to the fact that it is broken, defective, or otherwise does not conform to the Contract Documents, the Owner will notify the Contractor to make the required repairs or replacement. If the Contractor shall neglect to commence such repairs or replacement to the satisfaction of the Owner within ten (10) days from the date of giving or mailing such notice, then the Owner may employ other persons to make the same. The Contractor agrees, upon demand, to pay to the Owner all amounts which the Owner expends for such repairs or replacements. During this one year guarantee period any corrective work shall be performed in accordance with the applicable terms of this Contract. For items of work completed after use and occupancy has been taken, the one year guarantee shall commence at the time the Owner accepts such items. This one year guarantee shall not limit any express guaranty or warranty provided elsewhere in the Contract.

## **2.9 INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS**

2.9.1 The Contractor shall provide insurance coverage as listed below. This insurance shall be provided at the Contractor's expense and shall be in full force and effect during the full term of this Contract.

Worker's Compensation: Per M.G.L. c.. 149, s. 34 and c.. 152 as amended.

### COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY

### VEHICLE LIABILITY

Personal Injury	\$500,000 each person \$1,000,000 aggregate
Property Damage	\$300,000 each occurrence \$500,000 aggregate

## **2.9.2 OWNER AS CO-INSURED**

The Owner shall be named as additional insureds on the Contractor's Liability Policies.

## **2.9.3 CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE, POLICIES**

- i. The Contractor shall not commence the work until proof of compliance with this Section 2.9 has been furnished to the Owner by submitting one copy of a properly endorsed insurance certificate issued by a company authorized to write insurance in the Commonwealth. This certificate shall indicate that the contractual liability coverage is in force.
- ii. The Contractor shall file the original and one certified copy of all policies with the Owner within fifteen (15) days after contract award. If the Owner is damaged by the Contractor's failure to maintain such insurance and to so notify the Owner, then the Contractor shall be responsible for all reasonable costs attributable thereto.

## **2.9.4 CANCELLATION**

Cancellation of any insurance required by this contract, whether by the insurer or the insured, shall not be valid unless written notice thereof is given by the party proposing cancellation to the other party and Owner at least thirty days prior to the effective date thereof, which shall be expressed in said notice.

## **2.10 INDEMNIFICATION**

The Contractor shall take all responsibility for the Work and take all precautions for preventing injuries to persons and property in or about the Work; shall bear all losses resulting to or on account of the amount or character of the Work. The Contractor shall pay or cause payment to be made for all labor performed or furnished and for all materials used or employed in carrying out this Contract. The Contractor shall assume the defense of, and indemnify and save harmless the Owner, and the Owner's officers and agents from all claims relating to labor performed or furnished and materials used or employed for the Work; to inventions, patents and patent rights used in and in doing the Work unless such patent infringement is due to a product or process specified by the Owner; to injuries to any person or corporation received or sustained by or from the Contractor and any employees, and subcontractors and employees, in doing the work, or in consequence of any improper materials, implements or labor used or employed therein; and to any act, omission or neglect of the Contractor and any employees therein.

## **2.11 BONDS**

The Contractor shall provide the Owner with a performance and with a payment or labor and materials bond in the form provided by the Owner, executed by a surety company licensed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Division of Insurance. Such bond shall be in an amount equal to at least one half of the Contract price unless otherwise stated in the Contract Documents. All bonds shall be accompanied by a current power of attorney.

## **2.12 TERMINATION**

### **2.12.1 TERMINATION FOR CAUSE**

- i. The Owner may terminate this contract for cause if it determines that any of the following circumstances have occurred:
  - a. The Contractor is adjudged bankrupt or has made a general assignment for the benefit of its creditors.
  - b. A receiver has been appointed of the Contractor's property.
  - c. All or a part of the Work has been abandoned.
  - d. The Contractor has sublet or assigned all or any portion of the Work, the Contract, or claims thereunder, without the prior written consent of the Owner, except as provided in the Contract.
  - e. The Owner has determined that the rate of progress required on the project is not being met.
  - f. The Contractor has substantially violated any provisions of this Contract.
- ii. The Owner may complete the Work, or any part thereof, and charge its expense of so completing the Work or part thereof, to the Contractor.
- iii. The Owner may take possession of and use any materials, machinery, implements and tools found upon the site of said Work. The Owner shall not be liable for any depreciation, loss or damage to said materials, machinery, implements or tools during said use and the Contractor shall be solely responsible for their removal from the Project site after the Owner has no further use for them.

### **2.12.2 TERMINATION - NO FAULT**

- i. In the event that this Contract is terminated by the Owner, prior to the completion of construction and termination is not based on a reason listed in Paragraph 2.12.1, the Contractor shall be compensated for its costs incurred on the Project, including reasonable costs of de-mobilization, covering the period of time between the last approved application for payment and the date of termination.
- ii. Payment by the Owner pursuant to Section 2.7 shall be considered to fully compensate the Contractor for all claims and expenses and those of any consultants, subcontractors, and suppliers, directly or indirectly attributable to the termination, including any claims for lost profits.

## **2.13 PERMITS, FEES, AND NOTICES**

- 2.13.1 The Contractor shall secure and the Owner shall pay for any local permit(s), required to execute any aspect of the Work where such permit is mandated. The Contractor shall coordinate all efforts required to obtain this permit. All other permits and governmental fees, licenses, and inspections necessary for proper execution and completion of the Work shall be secured and paid for by the Contractor.
- 2.13.2 The Contractor shall comply with and give notices required by laws, ordinances rules, regulations, and lawful orders of public authorities bearing on performance of the Work.
- 2.13.3 If the Contractor performs Work that it knows or reasonably should know is contrary to laws, statutes, ordinances, building codes, and rules and regulations without such notice to the Owner, the Contractor shall assume full responsibility for such Work and shall bear the attributable costs.

## **2.14 SAFETY REQUIREMENTS**

- 2.14.1 The Contractor shall comply with all Federal, State, and local safety laws and regulations applicable to the Work performed under this Contract.

## **2.15 TEMPORARY HEATING**

Only as required in performance of the work

## **2.16 AVAILABILITY AND USE OF UTILITY SERVICES**

2.16.1 The City shall make all reasonably required amounts of utilities available to the Contractor from existing outlets and supplies, as specified in the Contract. Unless otherwise provided in the Contract, the amount of each utility service consumed shall be charged to or paid for by the Contractor at prevailing rates charged to the City or, where the utility is produced by the City, at reasonable rates determined by the Contracting Officer. The Contractor shall carefully conserve any utilities furnished without charge.

## **2.17 DISPUTES**

2.17.1 "Claim," as used in this section, means a written demand or written assertion by one of the contracting parties seeking, as a matter of right, the payment of money in a sum certain, the adjustment or interpretation of contract terms, or other relief arising under or relating to the contract. A claim arising under the Contract, unlike a claim relating to the Contract, is a claim that can be resolved under a Contract clause that provides for the relief sought by the claimant. A voucher, invoice, or other routine request for payment that is not in dispute when submitted is not a claim. The submission may be converted to a claim by complying with the requirements of this section, if it is disputed either as to liability or amount or is not acted upon in a reasonable time.

2.17.2 All disputes arising under or relating to this Contract, including any claims for damages for the alleged breach thereof which are not disposed of by agreement, shall be resolved under this section.

2.17.3 All claims by the Contractor shall be made in writing and submitted to the Contract Officer for a written decision. A claim by the City against the Contractor shall be subject to a written decision by the Contract Officer.

2.17.4 The Contract Officer shall, within thirty (30) days after receipt of the request, decide the claim or notify the Contractor of the date by which the decision will be made.

2.17.5 The Contract Officer's decision shall be final unless the Contractor (1) appeals in writing to a higher level in the City, (2) refers the appeal to an independent mediator or arbitrator, or (3) files suit in a court of competent jurisdiction. Such appeal must be made within thirty (30) days after receipt of the Contract Officer's decision.

2.17.6 The Contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of this Contract and/or any authorized change thereof, pending final resolution of any request for relief, claim, appeal, or action arising under or relating to the Contract and/or any authorized change thereof, and comply with any decision of the Contract Officer.

## **2.18 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES**

2.18.1 If the Contractor fails to complete the Work within the time specified in the contract, or any extension thereof, the Contractor shall pay to the City as liquidated damages, the sum of \$250.00 for each day of delay. Completion dates are specified in the Contract for separate phases of the work, and the amount of liquidated damages shall be assessed on each and every phase which is delayed. To the extent that the Contractor's delay or nonperformance is excused under another section in this Contract, liquidated damages shall not be due the City. The Contractor remains liable for damages caused other than by delay.

2.18.2 If the City terminates the Contractor's right to proceed pursuant to section 2.12.1, the resulting damage will consist of liquidated damages until such reasonable time as may be required for final completion of the Work together with any increased costs to the City in completing the Work.

2.18.3 If the City does not terminate the Contractor's right to proceed, the resulting damage will consist of liquidated damages until the Work is completed or accepted.

## **3.0 SALES TAX EXEMPTION AND OTHER TAXES**

3.0.1 To the extent that materials and supplies are used or incorporated in the performance of this Contract, the Contractor is considered an exempt purchaser under the Massachusetts Sales Act, Chapter 14 of the Acts of 1966.

3.0.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for paying all other taxes and tariffs of any sort, related to the Work.

## **3.1 PROHIBITION AGAINST LIENS**

The Contractor is prohibited from placing a lien on the City's property. This prohibition shall apply to all subcontractors at any tier and all materials suppliers.

**3.2 ORDER OF PRECEDENCE**

In the event of a conflict between these General Conditions and the Specifications, the General Conditions shall prevail. In the event of a conflict between the Contract and any applicable state or local law or regulation, the state or local law or regulation shall prevail; provided that such state or local law or regulation does not conflict with, or is less restrictive than applicable federal law, regulation, or Executive Order. In the event of such a conflict, applicable federal law, regulation, and Executive Order shall prevail.

**3.3 EXAMINATION AND RETENTION OF CONTRACTOR'S RECORDS**

The City of Newton shall, until three (3) years after final payment under this Contract, have access to and the right to examine any of the Contractor's directly pertinent books, documents, papers, or other records involving transactions related to this Contract for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts, and/or transcriptions.

**4.0 CITY NOISE ORDINANCE**

All leaf blowers or related equipment must comply with the City's Noise Ordinance. Gas blowers are only permissible from Labor Day to Memorial Day and must not exceed 65 decibels. From Memorial Day to Labor Day only battery powered blowers will be allowed

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# SUPPLEMENTAL CONDITIONS - COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

## Article 1. METHOD OF PAYING SUBCONTRACTORS

**(General Laws, Chapter 30, Section 39F as most recently amended by Chapter 450, §76 of the Acts of 1996)**

(1.) Every contract awarded pursuant to section forty-four A to L, inclusive, of chapter one hundred and forty-nine shall contain the following subparagraphs (a) through (i) and every contract awarded pursuant to section thirty-nine M of chapter thirty shall contain the following subparagraphs (a) through (h) and in each case those subparagraphs shall be binding between the general contractor and each subcontractor.

(a) Forthwith after the general contractor receives payment on account of a periodic estimate, the general contractor shall pay to each subcontractor the amount paid for the labor performed and the materials furnished by the subcontractor, less any amount specified in any court proceedings barring such payment and also less any amount claimed due from the subcontractor by the general contractor.

(b) Not later than the sixty-fifth day after each subcontractor substantially completes his work in accordance with the plans and specifications, the entire balance due under the subcontract less amounts retained by the awarding authority as the estimated cost of completing the incomplete and unsatisfactory items of work, shall be due the subcontractor; and the awarding authority shall pay that amount to the general contractor. The general contractor shall forthwith pay to the subcontractor the full amount received from the awarding authority less any amount specified in any court proceedings barring such payment and also less any amount claimed due from the subcontractor by the general contractor.

(c) Each payment made by the awarding authority to the general contractor pursuant to subparagraphs (a) and (b) of this paragraph for the labor performed and the materials furnished by a subcontractor shall be made to the general contractor for the account of that subcontractor, and the awarding authority shall take reasonable steps to compel the general contractor to make each such payment to each such subcontractor. If the awarding authority has received a demand for direct payment from a subcontractor for any amount which has already been included in a payment to the general contractor or which is to be included in a payment to the general contractor for payment to the subcontractor as provided in subparagraphs (a) and (b), the awarding authority shall act upon the demand as provided in this section.

(d) If, within seventy days after the subcontractor has substantially completed the subcontract work, the subcontractor has not received from the general contractor the balance due under the subcontract including any amount due for extra labor and materials furnished to the general contractor, less any amount retained by the awarding authority as the estimated cost of completing the incomplete and unsatisfactory items of work, the subcontractor may demand direct payment of the balance from the awarding authority. The demand shall be by a sworn statement delivered to or sent by certified mail to the awarding authority, and a copy shall be delivered to or sent by certified mail to the general contractor at the same time. The demand shall contain a detailed breakdown of the balance due under the subcontract and also a statement of the status of completion of the subcontract work. Any demand made after substantial completion of the subcontract work shall be valid even if delivered or mailed prior to the seventieth day after the subcontractor has substantially completed the subcontract work. Within ten days after the subcontractor has delivered or so mailed the demand to the awarding authority and delivered or so mailed a copy to the general contractor, the general contractor may reply to the demand. The reply shall be by a sworn statement delivered to or sent by certified mail to the awarding authority and a copy shall be delivered to or sent by certified mail to the subcontractor at the same time. The reply shall contain a detailed breakdown of the balance due under the subcontract including any amount due for extra labor and materials furnished to the general contractor and of the amount due for each claim made by the general contractor against the subcontractor.

(e) Within fifteen days after receipt of the demand by the awarding authority, but in no event prior to the seventieth day after substantial completion of the subcontract work, the awarding authority shall make direct payment to the subcontractor of the balance due under the subcontract including any amount due for extra labor and materials furnished to the general contractor, less any amount (i) retained by the awarding authority as the estimated cost of completing the incomplete or unsatisfactory items of work, (ii) specified in any court proceedings barring such payment, or (iii) disputed by the general contractor in the sworn reply; provided, that the awarding authority shall not deduct from a direct payment any amount as provided in part (iii) if the reply is not sworn to, or for which the sworn reply does not contain the detailed breakdown required by subparagraph (d). The awarding authority shall make further direct payments to the subcontractor forthwith after the removal of the basis for deductions from direct payments made as provided in parts (i) and (ii) of this subparagraph.

(f) The awarding authority shall forthwith deposit the amount deducted from a direct payment as provided in part (iii) of subparagraph (e) in an interest-bearing joint account in the names of the general contractor and the subcontractor in a bank in Massachusetts selected by the awarding authority or agreed upon by the general contractor and the subcontractor and shall notify the general contractor and the subcontractor of the date of the deposit and the bank receiving the deposit.

The bank shall pay the amount in the account, including accrued interest, as provided in an agreement between the general contractor and the subcontractor or as determined by a decree of a court of competent jurisdiction.

(g) All direct payments and all deductions from demands for direct payments deposited in an interest-bearing account for accounts in a bank pursuant to subparagraph (f) shall be made out of amounts payable to the general contractor at the time of receipt of a demand for direct payment from a subcontractor and out of amounts which later become payable to the general contractor and in the order of receipt of such demands from subcontractors. All direct payments shall discharge the obligation of the awarding authority to the general contractor to the extent of such payment.

(h) The awarding authority shall deduct from payments to a general contractor amounts which, together with the deposits in interest-bearing accounts pursuant to subparagraph (f), are sufficient to satisfy all unpaid balances of demands for direct payment received from subcontractors. All such amounts shall be earmarked for such direct payments, and the subcontractors shall have a right in such deductions prior to any claims against such amounts by creditors of the general contractor.

(i) If the subcontractor does not receive payment as provided in subparagraph (a) or if the general contractor does not submit a periodic estimate for the value of the labor or materials performed or furnished by the subcontractor and the subcontractor does not receive payment for same when due less the deductions provided for in subparagraph (a), the subcontractor may demand direct payment by following the procedure in subparagraph (d) and the general contractor may file a sworn reply as provided in that same subparagraph. A demand made after the first day of the month following that for which the subcontractor performed or furnished the labor and materials for which the subcontractor seeks payment shall be valid even if delivered or mailed prior to the time payment was due on a periodic estimate from the general contractor. Thereafter the awarding authority shall proceed as provided in subparagraph (e), (f), (g) and (h).

## **Article 2. METHOD OF PAYING GENERAL CONTRACTORS**

**(General Laws, Chapter 30, Section 39K as most recently amended by Chapter 145 of the Acts of 1991 and Chapter 151 of the Acts of 1993.)**

Every contract for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, remodeling, repair or demolition of any public building by the commonwealth, or by any county, city, town, district, board, commission or other public body, when the amount is more than five thousand dollars in the case of the commonwealth and more than two thousand dollars in the case of any county, city, town, district, board, commission or other public body, shall contain the following paragraph:--Within fifteen days (forty-five days in the case of the commonwealth, including local housing authorities) after receipt from the contractor, at the place designated by the awarding authority if such a place is so designated, of a periodic estimate requesting payment of the amount due for the preceding month, the awarding authority will make a periodic payment to the contractor for the work performed during the preceding month and for the materials not incorporated in the work but delivered and suitably stored at the site (or at some location agreed upon in writing) to which the contractor has title or to which a subcontractor has title and has authorized the contractor to transfer title to the awarding authority, less (1) a retention based on its estimate of the fair value of its claims against the contractor and less (2) a retention for direct payments to subcontractors based on demands for same in accordance with the provisions of section thirty-nine F, and less (3) a retention not exceeding five per cent of the approved amount of the periodic payment. After the receipt of a periodic estimate requesting final payment and within sixty-five days after (a) the contractor fully completes the work or substantially completes the work so that the value of the work remaining to be done is, in the estimate of the awarding authority, less than one per cent of the original contract price, or (b) the contractor substantially completes the work and the awarding authority takes possession for occupancy, whichever occurs first, the awarding authority shall pay the contractor the entire balance due on the contract less (1) a retention based on its estimate of the fair value of its claims against the contractor and of the cost of completing the incomplete and unsatisfactory items of work and less (2) a retention for direct payments to subcontractors based on demands for same in accordance with the provisions of section thirty-nine F, or based on the record of payments by the contractor to the subcontractors under this contract if such record of payment indicates that the contractor has not paid subcontractors as provided in section thirty-nine F. If the awarding authority fails to make payment as herein provided, there shall be added to each such payment daily interest at the rate of three percentage points above the rediscount rate then charged by the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston commencing on the first day after said payment is due and continuing until the payment is delivered or mailed to the contractor; provided, that no interest shall be due, in any event, on the amount due on a periodic estimate for final payment until fifteen days (twenty-four days in the case of the commonwealth) after receipt of such a periodic estimate from the contractor, at the place designated by the awarding authority if such a place is so designated. The contractor agrees to pay to each subcontractor a portion of any such interest paid in accordance with the amount due each subcontractor.

The awarding authority may make changes in any periodic estimate submitted by the contractor and the payment due on said periodic estimate shall be computed in accordance with the changes so made, but such changes or any requirement for a corrected periodic estimate shall not affect the due date for the periodic payment or the date for the commencement of interest charges on the amount of the periodic payment computed in accordance with the changes made, as provided herein; provided, that the awarding authority may, within seven days after receipt, return to the contractor for correction, any periodic estimate which is not in the

required form or which contains computations not arithmetically correct and, in that event, the date of receipt of such periodic estimate shall be the date of receipt of the corrected periodic estimate in proper form and with arithmetically correct computations. The date of receipt of a periodic estimate received on a Saturday shall be the first working day thereafter. The provisions of section thirty-nine G shall not apply to any contract for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, remodeling, repair or demolition of any public building to which this section applies.

All periodic estimates shall be submitted to the awarding authority, or to its designee as set forth in writing to the contractor, and the date of receipt by the awarding authority or its designee shall be marked on the estimate. All periodic estimates shall contain a separate item for each filed subtrade and each sub-subtrade listed in sub-bid form as required by specifications and a column listing the amount paid to each subcontractor and sub-subcontractor as of the date the periodic estimate is filed. The person making payment for the awarding authority shall add the daily interest provided for herein to each payment for each day beyond the due date based on the date of receipt marked on the estimate.

A certificate of the architect to the effect that the contractor has fully or substantially completed the work shall, subject to the provisions of section thirty-nine J, be conclusive for the purposes of this section.

### **Article 3. CLAIMS FOR UNFORESEEN CONDITIONS**

**(General Laws, Chapter 30, Section 39N as most recently amended by Chapter 774 of the Acts of 1972)**

Every contract subject to section forty-four A of chapter one hundred and forty-nine or subject to section thirty-nine M of chapter thirty shall contain the following paragraph in its entirety and an awarding authority may adopt reasonable rules or regulations in conformity with that paragraph concerning the filing, investigation and settlement of such claims:

If, during the progress of the work, the contractor or the awarding authority discovers that the actual subsurface or latent physical conditions encountered at the site differ substantially or materially from those shown on the plans or indicated in the contract documents either the contractor or the contracting authority may request an equitable adjustment in the contract price of the contract applying to work affected by the differing site conditions. A request for such an adjustment shall be in writing and shall be delivered by the party making such claim to the other party as soon as possible after such conditions are discovered. Upon receipt of such a claim from a contractor, or upon its own initiative, the contracting authority shall make an investigation of such physical conditions, and, if they differ substantially or materially from those shown on the plans or indicated in the contract documents or from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in work of the character provided for in the plans and contract documents and are of such a nature as to cause an increase or decrease in the cost of performance of the work or a change in the construction methods required for the performance of the work which results in an increase or decrease in the cost of the work, the contracting authority shall make an equitable adjustment in the contract price and the contract shall be modified in writing accordingly.

### **Article 4. CLAIMS FOR DELAY**

**(General Laws, Chapter 30, Section 390 as added by Chapter 116 of the Acts of 1973)**

Every contract subject to the provisions of section thirty-nine M of this chapter or subject to section forty-four A of chapter one hundred forty-nine shall contain the following provisions (a) and (b) in their entirety and, in the event a suspension, delay, interruption or failure to act of the awarding authority increases the cost of performance to any subcontractor, that subcontractor shall have the same rights against the general contractor for payment for an increase in the cost of his performance as provisions (a) and (b) give the general contractor against the awarding authority, but nothing in provisions (a) and (b) shall in any way change, modify or alter any other rights which the general contractor or the subcontractor may have against each other.

(a) The awarding authority may order the general contractor in writing to suspend, delay, or interrupt all or any part of the work for such period of time as it may determine to be appropriate for the convenience of the awarding authority; provided however, that if there is a suspension, delay or interruption for fifteen days or more or due to a failure of the awarding authority to act within the time specified in this contract, the awarding authority shall make an adjustment in the contract price for any increase in the cost of performance of this contract but shall not include any profit to the general contractor on such increase; and provided further, that the awarding authority shall not make any adjustment in the contract price under this provision for any suspension, delay, interruption or failure to act to the extent that such is due to any cause for which this contract provides for an equitable adjustment of the contract price under any other contract provisions.

(b) The general contractor must submit the amount of a claim under provision (a) to the awarding authority in writing, as soon as practicable after the end of the suspension, delay, interruption of failure to act and, in any event, not later than the date of final payment under this contract and, except for costs due to a suspension order, the awarding authority shall not approve any costs in the claim incurred more than twenty days before the general contractor notified the awarding authority in writing of the act of failure to act involved in the claim.

## **Article 5. DECISIONS AND APPROVALS BY ENGINEER OR ARCHITECT**

**(General Laws, Chapter 30, Section 39P, as added by Chapter 1164 of the Acts of 1973)**

Every contract subject to section thirty-nine M of this chapter or section forty-four A of chapter one hundred forty-nine which requires the awarding authority, any official, its architect or engineer to make a decision on interpretation of the specifications, approval of equipment, material or any other approval, or progress of the work, shall require that the decision be made promptly and, in any event, no later than thirty days after the written submission for decision; but if such decision requires extended investigation and study, the awarding authority, the official, architect or engineer shall, within thirty days after the receipt of the submission, give the party making the submission written notice of the reasons why the decision cannot be made within the thirty day period and the date by which the decision will be made.

## **Article 6. PREFERENCE IN EMPLOYMENT, WAGES**

**(General Laws, Chapter 149 Section 26 as most recently amended by Chapter 665 of the Acts of 1986 and Chapter 552 of the Acts of 1991).**

In the employment of mechanics and apprentices, teamsters, chauffeurs and laborers in the construction of public works by the commonwealth, or by a county, town or district, or by persons contracting or subcontracting for such works, preference shall first be given to citizens of the commonwealth who have been residents of the commonwealth for at least six months at the commencement of their employment who are male veterans as defined in clause Forty-third of section seven of chapter four, and who are qualified to perform the work to which the employment relates; and secondly, to citizens of the commonwealth generally who have been residents of the commonwealth for at least six months at the commencement of their employment, and if they cannot be obtained in sufficient numbers, then to citizens of the United States, and every contract for such work shall contain a provision to this effect. Each county, town or district in the construction of public works, or persons contracting or subcontracting for such works, shall give preference to veterans and citizens who are residents of such county, town or district. The rate per hour of the wages paid to said mechanics and apprentices, teamsters, chauffeurs and laborers in the construction of public works shall not be less than the rate or rates of wages to be determined by the commissioner as hereinafter provided; provided, that the wages paid to laborers employed on said works shall not be less than those paid to laborers in the municipal service of the town or towns where said works are being constructed; provided, further, that where the same public work is to be constructed in two or more towns, the wages paid to laborers shall not be less than those paid to laborers in the municipal service of the town paying the highest rate; provided, further, that if, in any of the towns where the works are to be constructed, a wage rate or wage rates have been established in certain trades and occupations by collective agreements or understandings in the private construction industry between organized labor and employers, the rate or rates to be paid on said works shall not be less than the rates so established, provided, further that in towns where no such rate or rates have been so established, the wages paid to mechanics and apprentices, teamster, chauffeurs and laborers on public works, shall not be less than the wages paid to the employees in the same trades and occupations by private employers engaged in the construction industry. This section shall also apply to regular employees of the commonwealth or of a county, town or district, when such employees are employed in the construction, addition to or alteration of public buildings for which special appropriation of more than One Thousand Dollars are provided. Payments by employers to health and welfare plans, pension plans and supplementary unemployment benefit plans under collective bargaining agreements or understandings between organized labor and employers shall be included for the purpose of establishing minimum wage rates as herein provided.

## **Article 7. HOURS OF WORK**

**(General Laws, Chapter 149 Section 34 as most recently amended by Chapter 552 of the Acts of 1991).**

Every contract, except for the purchase of material or supplies, involving the employment of laborers, workmen, mechanics, foremen or inspectors, to which the commonwealth or any county or town, subject to section thirty, is a party, shall contain a stipulation that no laborer, workman, mechanic, foreman or inspector working within the commonwealth, in the employ of the contractor, subcontractor or other person doing or contracting to do the whole or a part of the work contemplated by the contract, shall be required or permitted to work more than eight hours in any one day or more than forty-eight hours in any one week, or more than six days in any one week, except in case of emergency, or, in case any town subject to section thirty-one is a party to such a contract, more than eight hours in any one day, except as aforesaid, provided, that in contracts entered into by the

department of highways for the construction or reconstruction of highways there may be inserted in said stipulation a provision that said department, or any contractor or subcontractor for said department, may employ laborers, workmen, mechanics, foremen and inspectors for more than eight hours in any one day in such construction or reconstruction when, in the opinion of the commissioner of labor and industries, public necessity so requires. Every such contract not containing the aforesaid stipulation shall be null and void.

#### **Article 8. WORK BY FOREIGN CORPORATIONS**

**(General Laws, Chapter 30 Section 39L, as most recently amended by Chapter 3 of the Acts of 1967).**

The Commonwealth and every county, city, town, district, board, commission or other public body which, as the awarding authority, requests proposals, bids or sub bids for any work in the construction, reconstruction, alteration, remodeling, repair or demolition of any public building or other public works (1) shall not enter into a contract for such work with, and shall not approve as a subcontractor furnishing labor and materials for a part of any such work, a foreign corporation which has not filed with such awarding authority a certificate of the state secretary stating that such corporation has complied with sections three and five of chapter one hundred and eighty-one and the date of such compliance, and (2) shall report to the state secretary and to the department of corporations and taxation any foreign corporation performing work under such contract or subcontract, and any person, other than a corporation, performing work under such contract or subcontract, and residing or having a principal place of business outside the Commonwealth.

# BUILDING MAINTENANCE SERVICE CONTRACT

## SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The following provisions supplement the General Conditions of the Contract for Non-Technical Services. In the event of conflict or discrepancy between the General Conditions and these Special Conditions, the provisions of the Special Conditions shall govern.

### 1.0 SUMMARY OF WORK

A. The Work under the Contract consists of:

1. Furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment and supervision necessary to accomplish the work described herein, in accordance with all specifications and requirements of the Project Manual.
2. All work either shown on the Drawings (if any) or included in the specifications unless specifically indicated as not to be done.

B. In addition, the work under the Contract includes:

1. Work outside the Project Site as called for in the Contract Documents and as required for the performance of the Work.
2. The restoration of any items damaged or destroyed by encroaching upon areas outside the Project Site.
3. Providing and restoring, where appropriate, all temporary facilities.

C. The Proposed Contract Price shall be complete costs, including overhead, profit, insurance, transportation, and all other costs connected with, or incidental to, the work described.

### 2.0 PROJECT SITE

A. The areas of work for this contract shall be various buildings within the City of Newton as specified on Work Orders to be issued from time to time during the term of this Contract.

### 3.0 NOTICE TO PROCEED/FAILURE TO COMMENCE WORK

A. From time to time during the term of this Contract, the Contractor shall be issued notice to proceed in the form of a written Work Order issued by the Public Building Department or, in the case of an Emergency as so deemed by the City of Newton, a verbal request by authorized designees of the City of Newton, listing specific work items to be performed in accordance with this Contract, . The Contractor shall commence performance of the work within the time specified in the Work Order, and in no event within less than the time limits stated in the Work Specifications contained in the Project Manual.

B. In the event the contractor fails to commence performance within the specified time, and/or notifies the City of its inability to do so, the City shall call upon the second Contractor awarded pursuant to this bid (if any) to perform the required work.

C. In the event the second Contractor awarded pursuant to this bid is unable to commence performance within the required time, or if there is no second Contractor, the City reserves the right to contract for the work on the open market at the then prevailing rate and to deduct from any monies due or that may thereafter become due to the contractor the difference between the price stated for the work in the contract and the actual cost thereof to the City.

D. In the event of Contractor's repeated failure to commence work within the time required by these specifications, the City shall exercise all provisions contained in the General Conditions regarding default, suspension or termination of this contract.

#### 4.0 PAYMENT

- A. Upon completion of the work specified in the Work Order, the Contractor may submit an invoice to the Public Building Department for the work performed. The Contractor will be paid only upon accepted completion of the work authorized. It shall be Contractor's responsibility to notify the Public Building Department upon completion of the work and to insure the work is promptly inspected by a Building Department representative.

#### 5.0 COMMUNICATIONS

- A. All notices, demands, requests, instructions, approvals and claims must be in writing.
- B. Any such notice shall be deemed to have been given as of the time of delivery, or of actual receipt in the case of telegrams or, in the case of mailing, when it should have been received in due course of post.
- C. For communicating purposes, the office address of the Contractor shall be that stated on the signature page of the contract; that of the City shall be as stated in the Invitation for Bids. Any subsequent change in address of either party shall be communicated to the other in writing.

#### 6.0 PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS

- A. The City will furnish to the Contractor, without charge, all copies of any specifications generated as may be reasonably necessary in the performance of the contract work.

#### 7.0 COORDINATION

The Contractor shall:

- A. Supply to the City the name and telephone number of a responsible person who may be contacted during off-hour emergencies during the term of the Contract.
- B. Cooperate at all times with the City and the Project Manager, and ensure the cooperation of his key personnel and that of his subcontractors.

#### 8.0 CONDUCT OF THE WORK

- A. The work must be completed in a continuous uninterrupted operation. The Contractor must use sufficient workforce and adequate equipment to complete all the necessary work requirements within a minimum period of time.
- B. The work may be conducted between the hours of 6:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on Monday through Friday. No work shall be done on holidays, Saturdays or Sundays except as specifically requested and authorized by the City.
- C. Under no circumstances will the contractor be paid at a premium or overtime rate for any work performed without the express advance authorization of the City.
- D. The Contractor is responsible for the security of partially completed work until the project is finally accepted by the City.

#### 9.0 ALTERATION

- A. The Contractor shall patch, repair and/or replace all existing materials and surfaces remaining exposed after installation of new work which have been affected by alteration or removal of existing work. All patch and repair work shall match existing.

## 10.0 GENERAL DIRECTIONS

### A. Damage to Persons and Property

Any damage to buildings, roads, public roads, bituminous concrete areas, fences, lawn areas, trees, shrubbery, electric or telephone poles, underground utilities, etc., shall be repaired by the Contractor at his own expense. Damaged property shall be returned to its original condition prior to the damages within a reasonable time period, except all utility outages shall be repaired immediately.

### B. Protection of Persons and Property

The Contractor shall, at all times, leave an unobstructed way along the roadways and walks, and shall maintain barriers and lights for the protection of all persons and property in all locations where he has materials stored or work going on, and during the entire time such work is going on or material is stored.

### C. Shutdown of Services

The Contractor's attention is especially called to the fact that continuous operation of building utilities and services is mandatory. During the period of construction of the new work and/or alterations to the existing work, the progress and sequence of installation shall be carefully planned and approved by the City. If any building is to be left without heat, hot water, city water, electricity, gas, sanitary facilities, or any other services, the Contractor shall provide reasonable written notice to the City before proceeding.

### D. Care of Work

All work is to be carefully protected so that no injury will come to it from water, frost, accident, or any other cause and any injury which may come to any of the work shall be repaired immediately by the Contractor at his own expense and without additional cost to the City. This shall also apply to any abutting or adjoining work on premises. The Contractor shall be responsible for any damage and in the event of such damage, the Contractor shall repair the damage immediately at his own cost and without additional cost to the City.

### E. Removal of Debris

Debris of any nature shall be completely removed from the site at the end of each days work and disposed of in accordance with all Federal, State and local regulations.

### F. The Contractor is responsible for the security of all work until it is accepted by the City.

## 11.0 TEMPORARY UTILITIES

- A. Prior to execution of the Work, the Contractor shall confer with a representative of the Public Building Department regarding the use of utilities and facilities at the worksite. No City utilities or facilities are to be used by the Contractor in the performance of this Contract without the prior approval of the City.

## 12.0 SUBMISSION OF PAYROLLS

- A. The Contractor shall, with each invoice submitted during the term of this Contract, submit to the City two (2) legible copies of his payrolls documenting the wages paid to all employees performing on site labor relating to the work of this Contract. These copies shall be prepared on forms supplied by the City.

## 13.0 DRAWINGS (IF APPLICABLE)

- A. The drawings attached herein and such drawings as may be issued per addendum, shall constitute an integral part of this section and shall serve as the working drawings.
- B. Drawings shall not be scaled. Field verification is directed since actual locations, dimensions and levels are existing.
- C. All items not specifically mentioned in the specifications or noted on the drawings, but which are obviously necessary to make a complete working installation, shall be included.


#### 14.0 MATERIALS

- A. Unless specifically so stated to the contrary the use of a manufacturer's name or style number is not restrictive, and is intended solely as an identification of the type and quality of the materials and services required. In all cases, the words "or approved equal" if not inserted are implied.
- B. An item equal to that named or described in the specifications may upon written approval of the City be furnished by the Contractor. An item shall be considered equal to the item so named or described if (1) it is at least equal in quality, durability, appearance, strength and design; (2) it will perform at least equally the function imposed by the general design for the public work being contracted for or the material being purchased; (3) it conforms substantially, even with deviations, to the detailed requirements for the item in the specifications.
- C. The name and identification of all materials other than the one specifically named shall be submitted to the City in writing for approval, prior to purchase, use or fabrication of such items. Approval shall be at the sole discretion of the City, shall be in writing to be effective, and the decision of the City shall be final. The City may require tests of all materials so submitted to establish quality standards at the Contractor's expense.
- D. For the use of material other than the one specified, the Contractor shall assume the cost of and responsibility for satisfactorily accomplishing all changes that may be required in the work as shown. All directions, specifications and recommendations by manufacturers for the installation, handling, storing, adjustment, and operation of their equipment shall be complied with and responsibility for proper performance shall continue to rest with the Contractor.
- E. The Contractor shall not have any right of appeal from the decision of the City condemning any materials furnished if the Contractor fails to obtain the approval for substitution in accordance with these provisions. If any substitutuin is more costly, the Contracotr shall pay for such costs

#### 15.0 WARRANTY AND INDEMNIFICATION

- A. In addition to other guarantees or warranties required under law or other sections of the specification, the Contractor warrants all materials furnished and labor performed under this Contract to be free from defects or errors in workmanship or installation for a period of one year from the date of Completion of the work, as certified by the Project Manager. The Contractor shall indemnify the Authority for the full cost of any damage to the property that may result by reason of such defects or errors and shall indemnify the Authority from and against any and all claims, demands, losses, costs, expenses, liabilities and damages, including reasonable attorney's fees and expenses, arising out of or on account of this Contract, including but not limited to claims brought against the Authority for alleged infringement of patents based upon any methods of construction or application of materials furnished under the Contract.
- B. The Contractor shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the City and its departments, officers, employees, servants, and agents from and against all actions, causes of actions, claims, demands, damages, costs, loss of services, expenses and compensation, including attorney's fees and interest arising out of or resulting directly or indirectly from the services rendered pursuant to this Contract, provided that any such action, cause of action, claim, demand, damage, cost, loss of service, expense, compensation (1) in any way grows out of bodily injury, sickness, disease or death, or to injury to or destruction of tangible property, which (2) is caused in whole or in part by any act or omission of the Contractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, regardless of whether or not it is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder.

**PART I - GENERAL**

**1.01 DESCRIPTION**

**A. Work included:**

Provide all the on-call labor, materials, equipment, transportation, and supervision necessary for the satisfactory servicing, repairing, installations and preventative maintenance of all Air Conditioning Equipment, Heating Systems and Control Systems at City Hall, Schools and other City buildings, all as listed in these Specifications, as directed by the Public Buildings Department during the period of July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025 with the option to extend for two (2) additional one year periods, with no change to the contract terms and conditions and price pending available funding.

These Specifications include, but are not limited to, the following types of equipment and controls in each facility, where applicable.

1. Refrigeration Cycle Equipment:  
Compressors, motors, pumps, condensers, refrigerants, evaporators, valves, belts, gauges, linkages, piping, and fittings.
2. Air Handling Systems:  
Exhaust fans, motors, bearings, belts, air handlers, dampers and filters.
3. Control Systems - Electrical and Pneumatic:  
Thermostats, air piping, relays, electric starters, switches, electric wiring, gauges, control valves, damper operators, air compressors, air dryers, and controllers.
4. Heating Systems - Water and Steam  
Piping, traps, pumps, motors, and valves.

**B. Additional Work at the City's Sole Option (Preventative Maintenance)**

**This work is to be done at selected locations throughout the City, only if directed to do so by the Public Buildings Department, in accordance with a schedule to be determined by the Public Buildings Department in consultation with this Contractor. The general order of work shall be determined by the condition of the various items of equipment, usage patterns of the City buildings for purposes of access to the items and seasonal considerations. It is anticipated that some of this work can be accomplished as "fill-in" work scheduled around other repair and servicing operations.**

**C. Existing Conditions**

During the bidding period, the City of Newton shall make available, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m., all facilities for all bidders to visit the facilities with designated City personnel. **The City strongly encourages each bidder to visit each site; bidders will be responsible for all work under this Contract whether they visit the facilities or not.**

D. The successful bidders shall be responsible to make repair to all equipment within the facilities shown in Section 1.01E and other facilities as may be added during the course of this contract. Should a repair be requested the successful bidder cannot accomplish that, it will be the successful bidder's responsibility to coordinate with other contractors to have such repair done. The cost of such repair shall not exceed the rates as submitted on the bid form.

## **1.02 QUALITY ASSURANCE**

### **A. Qualifications of Workmen:**

- 1) This Contract will be awarded to up to four (4) contractors whose primary business is heating, ventilation and air conditioning mechanical system maintenance, repair, and service of equipment of the magnitude as covered under this Contract, and who has employees regularly under his employ who perform all required mechanical/electrical maintenance service and repair functions as required.
- 2) The Contractors shall have been in the HVAC Mechanical Maintenance service and repair business/division for at least ten (10) years, and must have at least three (3) similar customers who can be used as references **and submitted at the time of the bid**
- 3) The service personnel assigned to maintain the included mechanical systems will be qualified to service the equipment type under contract as well as all associated pneumatic, electric, electronic and direct digital controls. Each service person assigned to this contract and working for the City of Newton shall have the requisite trade licenses issued by the State of Massachusetts. Only fully licensed personnel are to be assigned to perform any of the described or related work.
- 4) Ensure all requests for service are responded to within the required time parameters. The intent is to have the personnel available when required but NOT to man the City with (7) SEVEN, when that number of personnel is not required. Copies of the licenses of the proposed personnel to perform work for the City of Newton shall be submitted at the time of the bid.
- 5) Apprentices may perform supervised work under this contract for the City of Newton, with the PRIOR Approval of the City of Newton Public Buildings Department.

### **B. Rejection:**

In the acceptance or rejection of heating, ventilation and air conditioning mechanical system maintenance, repair, and service operations and results, no allowance will be made for lack of skill on the part of workmen.

### **C. Codes and Standards:**

Comply with all applicable codes, standards and regulations.

The Contractor shall acquire and maintain all service manuals for the various pieces of equipment covered under this Contract.

## **1.03 SAFETY**

Take the necessary precautions for the safety of employees on the work, and comply with applicable OSHA provisions to prevent accidents or injury to persons on, about or adjacent to the premises where the work is being performed.

## **1.04 SUBMITTALS**

No initial submittals required.

Submit two copies of maintenance and operation manuals for any new equipment installed; Deliver one to location of equipment and one to Public Buildings Department. See 1.07 B below.

## **1.05 PRODUCT HANDLING**

### **A. Protection:**

Use appropriate means necessary to protect materials before, during and after installation and to protect adjacent existing surfaces.

### **B. Replacements:**

In the event of damage to City property, immediately make repairs and replacements necessary to the approval of the Public Buildings Department and at no additional cost to the City.

#### **1.06 JOB CONDITIONS**

##### **A. Scheduling:**

The Contractor shall provide the phone number of a dispatcher, regularly employed by him; This number shall be manned twenty-four hours a day, seven days per week; recorded message taking devices are not acceptable.

After receiving a service call from the Public Buildings Department, commence work within the following time limits:

1. Emergency work requests must start within 1 (one) hour.
2. All other work requests must start within one (1) workday unless extended by Public Buildings Department.

Before commencing work, contact the Public Buildings Department (phone 617-796-1600) and/or the Building Custodian to determine the exact location and extent of the required work.

The Building Custodian will provide access and electrical outlets to all areas where the servicing is required.

##### **B. Notification:**

Within twenty-four (24) hours after services have been completed, notify the Public Buildings Department via telephone, (617) 796-1600 or via e-mail, ([acabral@newtonma.gov](mailto:acabral@newtonma.gov)), that the work has been completed.

##### **C. Work Results Required:**

All service call problems shall be eliminated on the first call; first call-back for the same problem Will be paid for at 50 % of the Contract service rate; second call-back for the same problem will be paid for at 25% and any subsequent call-backs will not be paid for by the City of Newton.

#### **1.07 PROCEDURES**

##### **A. Work Order:**

The Contractor shall have with him, on each service call, a Work Order listing:

1. For repairs - the type and quantity of material used and the time consumed for that call;

This work order slip must be signed by the Building Custodian/Representative as evidence of the number of hours on the job at the building and must be in accordance with the building log that is onsite

A copy of the signed order shall be attached to its appropriate invoice.

The Contractor can use his own Work Order Form or one supplied by the City. A sample of the City's form is included at the end of this Specification.

2. A copy of the Work Order Form is to be left on site daily with the Building Custodian/Representative and emailed the next business day to: [acabral@newtonma.gov](mailto:acabral@newtonma.gov)

##### **B. Invoicing:**

Invoices, one for each work order, will be mailed in duplicate no later than Wednesday of each week for the work performed During the previous week. The invoice shall have a copy of the work order form, signed by the Custodian or Public Buildings Department representative, as well as a copy of the School dude work order form. Copies of the contractor's invoices for these Materials shall be submitted with the invoice for each repair.

The School dude work order forms for work to be accomplished shall be provided to the Contractor by the Public Buildings and/or School Department daily and as Emergencies occur.

Failure to invoice within the above-mentioned period shall be grounds for termination. Each invoice must reflect the Building Work Order Number assigned to that service call. The Number consists of 6 digits, (e.g. 113101 etc.)

Each invoice will be based on time and materials, labor costs will be reflected separately and will be billed in accordance with the applicable contract hourly rates. Material used will be reflected on the invoice by quantity and unit costs including applicable 10% surcharge. Each invoice shall have a complete break-out of labor, materials and any other miscellaneous charges as well as copies of the invoices for the materials used. Bill labor charges on the actual time used to perform the required Work in a facility. No Paid Travel time from facility to facility is allowed.

**Labor charges shall not be billed traveling to the original job site at the beginning of the day that work is to be performed. All charges for mileage, tolls, etc. shall be included within the hourly rate as submitted on the bid form.**

In addition, each invoice shall be supplemented with a written service report **SIGNED DAILY BY THE BUILDING REPRESENTATIVE** (in duplicate) reflecting:

1. Location and date
2. Time of **START** and **FINISH** of work for each day
3. Number of workmen for each day
4. Brief description of work performed
5. Name and number of parts replaced, with a statement if rebuilt or new parts or components were used.
6. Recommendation or comments pertaining to the repair work
7. An example of a Service Slip to be used and attached to each invoice is shown below on Page 58

C. Materials:

All removed parts and components shall be replaced by new parts. Used materials without trade-in allowance to the City of Newton must be removed from the building; used materials with trade-in allowance shall be returned to the vendor and credit shown on the invoice.

D. Meetings and Estimates

1. The Contractor shall agree to meet with the Public Buildings Department or School Department, when requested, for the Discussion and review of various problems encountered, and to provide a written status report at each meeting.
2. The Contractor shall, at the request of the City, investigate and offer "Not to Exceed" Time and Materials estimates and/or quotations of work to be done, at no cost to the City. These estimates shall be submitted within 5 calendar days from the date of the request from the City of Newton unless granted an extension in time in writing from the City of Newton
3. Invoicing shall be billed showing actual time and materials on the job but shall not exceed the Estimated Cost approved by the Public Buildings Department without the **PRIOR** approval of the Public Buildings Department

## 1.08 CONTRACT RATES

A. Repairs, Standard Rate:

The Standard Rate shall apply to any repair that does not meet the criteria for Premium Rate.

The Contractor shall perform routine repairs as directed by the City during the term of this contract. The Contractor shall be compensated for such repairs at the Standard Rate shown on the bid form. Materials used during routine repairs will be reimbursed at Contractor's cost plus 10%

B. Repairs, Premium Rate:

The Premium Rate shall apply to any repair, which the City requests the Contractor to commence between 4:30 p.m. and 6:30 a.m. Monday through Friday, and anytime on Saturday, Sunday or a legal holiday.

The Contractor shall be compensated for Premium Rate repairs at the Premium Rate shown on the bid form. Materials used during Premium Rate repairs will be reimbursed at Contractor's cost plus 10%.

Under no circumstances shall any work performed by the Contractor be compensated at the Premium Rate unless the City has given **PRIOR** authorization to treat the work as a Premium Rate repair.

## **PART 2 - PRODUCTS**

### **2.01 REPAIR AND REPLACEMENT MATERIALS**

All repair and replacement materials used shall be first quality with preference given to replacement parts as manufactured by the original equipment manufacturer (OEM); use these parts whenever available and always when a manufacturer's warranty still in effect would otherwise be voided.

In the event new major parts or components costing over seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) should be required, the Contractor shall advise the Public Buildings Department or its designee in writing and obtain approval Prior to performing said Work. In an emergency situation, the Public Buildings Department or its designee's approval may be obtained by telephone (617-796-1600). The City reserves the right to purchase items costing over fifteen-hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) directly if it be in its interest to do so.

## **PART 3 - EXECUTION**

### **3.01 REPAIR AND REPLACEMENT**

#### **A. Repair**

Examine the unit for causes, which may have led to the failure; repair not only the failed portion, but also rehabilitate any other elements which appear to be in need of preventative maintenance.

Comply firstly with the servicing techniques required and/or recommended by the manufacturer of the item and secondly with generally accepted repair practices for the class of items to which the unit belongs.

In particular, for any item still believed to be under warranty, conform exactly to manufacturer's requirements; advise the City of any recourse it may have with the original equipment manufacturer.

As a part of repair, check all field-adjustable settings and field-measurable tolerances. Reset these to original factory compliance; advise the City of any such settings/tolerances that cannot be repaired or for which the cost of repairs suggests that a replacement unit be considered.

#### **B. Replacement:**

Notify Public Buildings Department immediately upon initial examination of any unit that cannot be repaired or for which the cost of repairs suggests that a replacement unit be considered.

Furnish only either the duplicate item from the original manufacturer or a first-quality similar item from an established manufacturer who maintains a dealer/service network of support in the Greater Boston area.

Replacement units must be either an exact physical and functional equal or have only acceptable differences from the original – coordinate with Public Buildings Department Facilities Manager in this case before providing the replacement unit.

#### **C. Guarantee**

All labor, materials and replacement furnished under the contract shall be fully guaranteed, including the cost of removal and reinstallation (if part of the original work order) for one (1) year. In the event of failure, provide warranty service immediately upon notification.

### **3.02 PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE**

Provide, as directed, all the labor, materials, equipment, transportation, and supervision necessary for the preventative maintenance of all air conditioning equipment, heating equipment and control systems at City Hall, Schools and other buildings including but not limited to the following types of equipment and controls:

#### ***CONDENSING UNITS -AIR COOLED***

##### ***Services Performed***

##### **Preseason Inspection**

1. Review manufacturer's recommendation for start-up.
2. Test motor.
3. Energize crankcase heater per manufacturer's recommendations.
4. Remove all debris from within and around the unit.
5. Inspect electrical connections, contractors, relays, operating and safety controls. Replace defective components.
6. Check compressor oils level. Acid test oil.
7. Change oil and refrigerant filter dryer as required.

##### **Seasonal Start-up**

1. Inspect system with leak detector.
2. Check belts, pulleys and mounts. Adjust and/or replace as required.
3. Lubricate fan and motor bearings per manufacturer's recommendations.
4. Check motor operating conditions.
5. Check fan blades.
6. Check and clean coil and straighten fins if required.
7. Check vibration eliminators.
8. Check and test all operating and safety controls.
9. Check operating conditions. Adjust as required.
10. Add refrigerant if required.
11. Log all operating data.

##### **Mid-season Inspection**

1. Lubricate motor and fan bearings per manufacturer's recommendations.
2. Check belts, pulleys and mounts. Adjust and/or replace as required.
3. Check operating conditions. Adjust as required.
4. Add refrigerant if required.
5. Log all operating data.

##### **Seasonal Shut-down**

1. Shut down as per applicable procedure
2. Acid test oil sample.
3. Note repairs required prior to start-up.

#### ***EXHAUST FANS***

##### ***Services Performed***

##### **Annual Inspection**

1. Inspect belts and adjust as required.
2. Lubricate motor and bearings as required.
3. Inspect starter and disconnect switch.

##### ***Temperature Control Systems***

##### ***Services Performed***

- 1 Regularly and systematically examine, adjust, calibrate, and clean all thermostats, humidity controls, relays, motors and accessories directly pertaining to the control system(s).
- 2 Regularly and systematically furnish lubricants and lubricate such components as air compressors, valve packing glands, damper bearings, linkages and switches directly pertaining to the control system.
- 3 Replace valve-packing materials of control valves as often as may be necessary in order to maintain the valves without leaking.
- 4 When in our judgement conditions warrant, we will repair or replace worn parts or complete controls with new part or reconditioned controls.

## **AIR COMPRESSOR**

### **Services Performed**

1. Test the pressure gauge(s) and cutout and cut—in pressure. Use test gauge to test accuracy of gauge on machine.
2. Check safety valve.
3. On two-stage compressor(s), check intermediate pressure.
4. Listen for knocks, and inspect for mechanical failures.
5. Test compression, correct or repair as necessary.
6. On water-cooled compressor(s) check for incrustation or excessive corrosion.
7. Clean moisture traps in system.
8. Change oil in crankcase.
9. Check controls, belts, pulleys, alignment, etc.
10. Check air-cooled heat—exchanger.
11. Check motor, bearings, starting switches, controller, pressure switches, etc.
12. Clean equipment touch up or repaint as required.
13. Comply with lubrication schedule.

## **Air Dryers**

### **Services Performed**

1. Remove panels.
2. Clean condenser cooling-coil fins and fan blade.
3. Remove dirt or dust from all interior parts.
4. Lubricate motor and fan bearings.
5. Check for refrigerant leaks.
6. Clean drain traps.
7. Start unit and observe operation.
8. Check frame of unit with ohmmeter for proper electric ground.
9. Replace panels.

## **Air Handling Units**

### **Services Performed**

#### **1. Fans:**

- A. Clean buildup, dust, and dirt from fan blades.
- B. Clean inside of fan housing and casing, noting structural irregularities, condition of insulation, loose bolts, and foundation and vibration isolation.

#### **2. Bearings: (with pillar blocks, sleeve or ball bearings)**

- A. Lubricate bearings, change oil, and perform pressure lubrication according to manufacturer's instructions. Take care not to over-lubricate.
- B. Remove top housing and examine retainers and slings.

#### **3. Drivers: (belt and direct)**

- A. Inspect for excessive belt wear indicating misalignment, overloading, or improper belt tension.
- B. If belts are worn they should be replaced to prevent untimely breakdown. (Multi-belt drives should be replaced in matched sets.) Adjust belt tension with a scale and straight edge.
- C. Check rigid couplings for alignment on direct drives, and for tightness of assembly.
- D. Inspect flexible couplings for alignment and wear.

#### **4. Coils:**

- A. Examine coils for leakage at joints and bends.
- B. Clean coil exterior by brushing, vacuuming, blowing, or chemical cleaning.

- B. Humidifier or wet coils (city water, spray, steam pan grids, etc.) will require additional attention to avoid scaling and odors.
- 5. **Freeze Protection:**
  - A. Check pitch of coil to drainage point and blow down with compressed air.
  - B. Inspect test controls and devices used for freeze protection.
  - C. Clean face & bypass dampers and lubricate damper operators.
- 6. **Controls:**
  - A. Inspect and clean dampers, control linkage and control motors.
  - B. Lubricate as necessary.
  - C.

**Coils, Preheat. Reheat** (This applies to coils that are not part of an air washer or air handling unit, but are remotely located from such units.)

**Services Performed**

1. Vacuum or blow out the fins, coils, etc.
2. Remove obstructions to airflow.
3. Check coils, correct or report any leaks.
4. Test and inspect controls that protect against freezing.

**Fans, Propeller**

**Services Performed**

1. Clean unit, especially fan blades.
2. Inspect pulleys, belts, couplings, etc.; adjust tension and tighten mountings as necessary. change badly worn belts.
3. Perform required lubrication.
4. Clean motor with vacuum or low-pressure air (less than 40 psi). check for obstructions in motor cooling and air flow.
5. Touch up paint for preservation.
6. Remove tags, start unit and check for vibration and noise

**FAN COIL UNITS**

**Services Performed**

**Annual Inspection**

1. Inspect motor and lubricate.
2. Lubricate fan bearings.
3. Inspect coil(s) for leaks.
4. Test operation of unit controls.

**Motors**

Application: This guide is for squirrel-cage, wound-rotor and synchronous motors 5 horsepower and above. The maintenance specified by this guide is not intended to require disassembly of the motor.

**Services Performed**

1. Clean motor with a clean rag or vacuum. clean areas otherwise inaccessible by blowing with clean dry air using not more than 40 pounds per square inch pressure. Clean surfaces and ventilation passages thoroughly.
2. Visually inspect winding for cleanliness. Look for coating of oil or grease.
3. Check air gap uniformity.
4. Inspect squirrel-cage rotors for broken or loose bars and evidence of local heating.
5. On wound-rotor and synchronous motors thoroughly clean the collector rings and/or commutators. Inspect them for roughness and eccentricity. Examine brushes for fit, free play, chipped toes or heels, heat cracks, wear and contact pressure.
6. Perform lubrication according to manufacturer's instructions.
7. Inspect for moisture and protection from water.
8. If motor has not been operated for an extended period, check insulation resistance with a megger. If insulation resistance has dropped the windings should be dried out before the motor is started.
9. Check motor mountings, supports and couplings for tightness or other defects.
10. Remove tags, and return unit to service.

## ***Boilers: Cast Iron and Steel and Electric Boilers***

### ***Services Performed***

1. General:
  - a. Review manufacturer's instructions.
  - b. Blow down boiler heavily before removing "from the line".
  - c. Remove fly ash and soot from flue passages.
  - d. Gag safety valves.
  - e. Check fire sides, valves, and trim and mark position of leaks.
  
2. Water sides:
  - a. Remove hand hold and manhole plates.
  - b. Clean interior of boiler, wash down shell and drums to remove mud, loose scale, and deposits.
  - c. Check tube ends for leakage and corrosion.
  - d. Examine complete waterside for extent of corrosion, and feed connections, gauge glass, and steam pressure gauge outlets.
  - e. Clean gauge glass and siphon loops to limit controls.
  - f. See that pet cocks and try cocks open freely.
  
3. Exterior and fire sides
  - a. Examine and clean water column and feed water regulators, high and low side alarms, drains, gauge glasses, siphon loops, pet and try cocks.
  - b. Look for signs of overheating, leakage, wear, abrasion, corrosion of pressure parts, or erosion of metal
  - c. Check tubes for evidence of blisters and pock marks.
  - d. Test all non-return and stop valves, clean and replace as necessary.
  - e. Check fusible plugs, if used, replace yearly.
  - f. Check and clean bonnets, flues, uptakes, for defective metal. Replace if necessary.
  - g. Check exterior structure for strains and tension.
  - h. Check condition of door gaskets.

## ***Burner, Gas***

### ***Services Performed***

1. Check boiler room for adequate ventilation in accordance with burner requirements.
2. Check operation of all gas controls and valves including:  
Manual gas shutoff; petal gas regulator; safety shutoff valve (solenoid); automatic gas valve/petal solenoid valve, butterfly gas valve, motor, and linkage to air louver; safety petal solenoid (if used).
3. Check flue connections for tight joints and minimum resistance to air flow. see that combustion chamber, flues, breaching, and chimney are clear before firing.
4. Draft regulators should give slightly negative pressure in the combustion chamber at maximum input.
5. On forced draft burners, gas manifold pressure requirements should correspond with modulating (butterfly) valve in full open position and stable at all other firing rates.
6. Take c02 flue gas temperature readings for determination of efficiency of the unit. c02 for atmospheric gas burners should be 8 to 9.5%. For forced draft burners 9 to 10%. flue gas temperature should be at 300 to 600 f. Combustion efficiency should be approximately 80%. If efficiency is low, check baffling.
7. Check burner for flashback and tight shutoff of fuel.
8. Check operation of controls. Clean and adjust as necessary.
9. Satisfactory operation and adjustments should conform with manufacturer's instructions.

## ***Burner, Oil and Hot Air Furnace***

### ***Services Performed***

1. Test and inspect burner (with or without firing) at rated pressure for leaks.
2. Timed trial for ignition for pilots and burners should be in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
3. Check operation of automatic safety controls and combustion flame safeguards for abnormal discharge of oil on ignition failure and sensors for presence of flame.
4. Check pre-ignition purging capability of burner, combustion chamber, boiler passes, and breeching. Stack dampers should be fully open during purge and light off period.
5. Check delivery of fuel in relation to its response to the ignition system.

6. Ignition transformer to supply dependable arc, adjust and regulate as required for clearance and air gap.
7. Clean and adjust draft regulation and air shutter on natural draft burner to ensure access air quantities are minimum for complete combustion.
8. On mechanical draft burners clean and check power driven fan blower.
9. Check and clean filters, water separators, primary and secondary strainers.
10. Clean, check operation, and adjust controls and safeties.
11. Check constant level device to see that burner maintains proper oil level (within 1/3") at rated output.
12. Check to ensure that energy cannot feedback and energize ignition devices or feed valves after a control shuts off burner.
13. Clean or replace nozzles or cups, and check for tight shut off of fuel.
14. Check stacks for smoke or haze and adjust burner accordingly.

### ***Hot Water Heaters and Converters***

Application: This guide does not apply to boilers that generate steam for domestic water.

#### ***Services Performed***

1. With system in operation determine if steam and water leaks exist (interior and exterior).
2. Drain and flush tanks (storage and expansion).
3. Remove rust, scale and note rate of corrosion.
4. Apply coating, paint or touch up as required.
5. Remove coil or elements, clean and examine condition.
6. **Clean and adjust as required: thermometers, aquastats, pressure reducing and relief valves and gauges, temperature relief and steam regulating control valves.**
7. Check operation and condition of all traps, clean pump, blow out dirt from motor, check controls, switches, starters. check condition of packing or seal and replace as required.

### ***Tanks, Water (all types)***

#### ***Services Performed***

1. Examine exterior of tank including fittings, manholes, and handholes for leaks, signs of corrosion, and correct as indicated.
2. Drain and flush tank.
3. Inspect structural supports and repair or replace damaged insulation or covering.
4. Clean, test and inspect sight glasses, valves, fittings, drains and controls.
5. Touch up or repaint exterior of covering as required. Fill and return to service.

### ***Pump Centrifugal (NOT INTEGRAL WITH MOTOR)***

#### ***Services Performed***

1. While pump is in operation, note performance, stuffing box operation, pressure gauge, flow indicators.
2. Shut down, drain pump housing, note if suction and discharge valves are holding.
3. Remove gland.
4. examine shaft sleeve for wear, replace as necessary.
5. Adjust gland evenly, finger tight.
6. On pumps with oil ring lubrication, drain oil, flush, then fill to proper oil level with new oil.
7. Perform lubrication in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
8. Clean strainers.
9. Put pump into operation. stop and start pump, noting undue vibration noise, pressure and action of check valve.
10. If test is satisfactory, start pump again, and adjust to slight leakage through gland.
11. When pump reaches normal operating temperatures, check alignment between pump and drive.

### ***Refrigeration Machine (Centrifugal & Reciprocating)***

#### ***Services Performed***

1. Compressor:
  - a. Drain, flush and change oil in reservoirs including filters, strainers and traps. Do not change oil in reciprocating machines unless contaminated.
  - b. Clean and inspect main, auxiliary oil pumps, including packing, seals, alignment, pulleys, belts and couplings.

- c. Check speed increaser, drain oil from gear box; flush and inspect gears for indication of wear, pitting and misalignment.
- d. Remove head from oil coolers; inspect and clean tubes. change oil filters.
- e. Refill oil sump.
- f. Remove access caps to compressor internals and clean where possible.
- g. Clean and adjust pilot positioner for guide vanes.
- h. Examine bearing for clearances and wear.
- i. Clean and lubricate coupling.
- j. Check hot and cold alignment between drive and driven compressor.
- k. Check all relief valve rupture discs.
- l. Test entire system for refrigerant leaks.
- m. Calibrate and adjust all gauges and instruments.
- n. Check safety controls for setting operation, tighten electrical connections and clean where indicated.
- o. Review manufacturer's literature for further details on service required on compressor.
- p. Perform maintenance on purge unit in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
- q. Leave equipment and area clean and free of debris.

2. Water Cooled Condensers:

- a. Review log and note condenser performance by inlet and outlet temperatures, head pressure and temperature of refrigerant.
- b. Remove condenser heads.
- c. Remove mud, debris, scale and other sediment collected during operation.
- d. Clean water boxes and tube sheets. scrape and paint with epoxy.
- e. Clean tubes with nylon brush or other similar material and inspect for signs of corrosion.
- f. Blow trapped water from tubes after cleaning if unit is exposed to freezing temperature
- g. Replace heads installing new gaskets.
- h. Chemically test scale if necessary.
- i. If condenser is chemically cleaned neutralize after cleaning.

***Air Conditioning Machine Package Unit***

***Services Performed*** prior to cooling season

- 1. Remove panels, clean entire unit.
- 2. Clean drip pan and drains. Paint as necessary.
- 3. Check bolts, nuts, electrical connections, anchors, etc.
- 4. Drain condenser, clean chemically, and neutralize. Clean and paint condenser heads, if needed.
- 5. Adjust or replace vibration eliminators.
- 6. Observe belt wear. Replace worn belts and/or adjust belt tension.
- 7. Check alignment of motor, fan, etc.
- 8. Replace filter, if required.
- 9. Check for refrigerant leaks.
- 10. Check oil level.
- 11. Check fan, motor and motor controls.
- 12. Clean fan blades, or rotor, and lubricate bearings.
- 13. Run machine and check operation, water supply, and control valves, suction and discharge pressures, need for refrigerant, recheck for leaks, functioning of controls, temperature of discharge, air, etc.
- 14. Restore panels and clean up area and machine.

***Valves, Regulating***

**APPLICATION: Single or double seated; diaphragm or spring loaded, pilot operated valves.**

***Services Performed***

- 1. Clean strainer
- 2. Check valve head and seats for wear and or cuts
- 3. Replace valve if seats need regrinding
- 4. Examine steam quality for foreign matter if valves are damaged
- 5. Examine pilot lines for dirt
- 6. Check steam gauges
- 7. Check diaphragms for failures
- 8. Check binding valve stem

9. Adjust weighted lever or spring control tension

**VALVES. MOTOR OPERATED**

***Services Performed***

1. Clean unit and make visual examination of all parts.
2. Operate from limit to limit. Observe operation, look for binding, sluggishness, action of limits etc.
3. Determine if valve seats and holds properly
4. Apply graphite to moving parts of valve
5. Lubricate motor and gear box as necessary
6. Inspect contacts, brushes , motor, control, switches, etc. clean and adjust

- B. Other duties and requirements of law which may not be specified in this section apply and are inherently a part of the Contract.

#### 2. WAGE RATES

- A. The rate per hour to be paid to mechanics, apprentices, teamsters, chauffeurs, and laborers employed on the Work shall not be less than the rate of wages in the attached "Minimum Wage Rates" as determined by the Commissioner of Labor and Industries. This schedule shall continue to be the minimum rate of wages for said employees during the life of this Contract.
- B. Keep posted on the site a legible copy of said schedule. Keep on file the wage rates and classifications of labor employed on this Work in order that they may be available for inspection by the Owner, Administrator, or the Architect.
- C. Apprentices employed pursuant to this determination of wage rates must be registered and approved by the State Apprenticeship Council wherever rates for journeymen or apprentices are not listed.
- D. Pay reserve police officers employed on the Work the prevailing rate of wages paid to regular police officers as required by M.G.L. c149, Sec. 34B, as amended. Such police officers shall be covered by Workmen's Compensation Insurance and Employers Liability Insurance by the Contractor.
- E. **The Contractor and all subcontractors shall, on a weekly basis throughout the term of the contract, provide to the City of Newton certified payroll affidavits verifying compliance with M.G.L. c.149, Sec. 27, 27A and 27B.** The Contractor is obligated to provide such records to the City directly on a weekly basis. The City may assess a penalty of \$100 for each day beyond the required submission date that such records are received, which amount shall be deducted from any amounts to the Contractor from the City. In the event of chronic late submissions, the City shall report the same to the Office of the Attorney General.
- F. The Contractor and all subcontractors shall provide a Statement of Compliance within 15 days of the completion of its portion of the work. This statement shall be submitted to the Owner on the form found elsewhere in this section.
- G. The Contractor shall maintain accurate and complete records, including payroll records, during the Contract term and for three years thereafter.

For multi-year CM AT RISK projects, the awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. The annual update requirement is not applicable to 27F "rental of equipment" contracts. The updated wage schedule must be provided to all contractors, including general and sub-contractors, working on the construction project.
- This wage schedule applies only to the specific project referenced at the top of this page and uniquely identified by the "Wage Request Number" on all pages of this schedule.
- An Awarding Authority must request an updated wage schedule if it has not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the date of issuance of the wage schedule. For CM AT RISK projects (bid pursuant to G.L. c.149A), the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the bid for the first construction scope of work must be within 90-days of the wage schedule issuance date.
- The wages schedules shall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project as required by M.G.L. c. 149, § 27. The wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract awarded for the project. The wage schedule must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site for the life of the project in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 § 27. The wages listed on the wage schedule must be paid to employees performing construction work on the project whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or a sub-contractor.
- Apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Massachusetts Division of Apprentices Standards (DAS). Apprentices must keep their apprentice identification card on their persons during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wages schedule. Any apprentice not registered with DAS regardless of whether they are registered with another federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the journeyworker's rate.
- Every contractor or subcontractor working on the construction project must submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years. Each weekly payroll report must contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports to DLS. For a sample payroll reporting form go to <http://www.mass.gov/dals/pw>.
- Contractors with questions about the wage rates or classifications included on the wages schedule have an affirmative obligation to inquire with DLS at (617) 626-6953.
- Contractors must obtain the wages schedules from awarding authorities. Failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay the prevailing wage rates listed on the wages schedule to all employees who perform construction work on the project is a violation of the law and subjects the contractor or subcontractor to civil and criminal penalties.
- Employees not receiving the prevailing wage rate set forth on the wages schedule may file a complaint with the Fair Labor Division of the office of the Attorney General at (617) 727-3465.

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# **The Massachusetts Prevailing Wage Law**

## **M.G.L. ch. 149, §§ 26 – 27**

### **NOTICE TO AWARDING AUTHORITIES**

- 'The enclosed wage schedule applies only to the specific project listed at the top and will be updated for any public construction project lasting longer than one (1) year.
- 'You should request an updated wage schedule from the Division of Occupational Safety if you have not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the date of issuance of the enclosed wage schedule.
- 'The wage schedule shall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project for which it has been issued.
- 'Once a contractor has been selected by the awarding authority, the wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract for that project.

### **NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS**

- The enclosed wage schedule, and any updated schedule, must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site during the life of the project.
- The wages listed on the enclosed wage schedule must be paid to employees on public works projects regardless of whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or any sub-contractor.
- The enclosed wage schedule applies to all phases of the project including the final clean-up. Contractors whose only role is to perform final clean-up must pay their employees according to this wage schedule.
- All apprentices must be registered with the Massachusetts Division of Apprentice Training in order to be paid at the reduced apprentice rates. If a worker is not registered with the Division of Apprentice Training, they must be paid the “total rate” listed on the wage schedule regardless of experience or skill level. **WEEKLY PAYROLL RECORDS REPORT  
& STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE**

In accordance with Massachusetts General Law c149, §27B, a true and accurate record must be kept of all persons employed on the public works project for which the enclosed rates have been provided. A Payroll Form has been printed on the reverse of this page and includes all the information required to be kept by law. Every contractor or subcontractor is required to keep these records and preserve them for a period of three years from the date of completion of the contract.

In addition, every contractor and subcontractor is required to submit a copy of their weekly payroll records to the awarding authority. This is required to be done on a weekly basis. Once collected, the awarding authority is also required to preserve those records for three years.

In addition, each such contractor, subcontractor or public body shall furnish to the Department of Labor & Workforce Development/Division of Occupational Safety within fifteen days after completion of its portion of the work a statement, executed by the contractor, subcontractor or public body who supervises the payment of wages, in the following form:
