#423-01 <u>COMPTROLLER</u> requesting review and approval of the FY2001 Annual

Financial Audit.

ACTION: APPROVED 7-0

NOTE: Jim Powers, a principal with the firm of Powers and Sullivan, and Chris Rogers and Stacey Waters joined the Committee this evening. They presented an indepth report to the Committee regarding the management findings that were part of this year's annual audit. Basically, the financial statements this year are not complete at this time, but the Chairman wanted to have this presentation made to the Committee before the end of this aldermanic term. The City does an annual review of the spending and the receipts for the City for the entire fiscal year when we close the books on June 30th. Typically, Free Cash is certified and the audit is performed and presented in December with the management report, which determines if there are any material weaknesses in the City's financial workings.

During FY01, there was only one finding of any significance, relating to the reconciliation of cash and the closing of the Treasurer's cash to the Comptroller's receipts on a timely basis. This is an ongoing problem. The City has been dealing with this issue for well over five years. We are getting very close to having this issue resolved. Basically, Ed Spellman, the Treasurer, and his assistant are working to bring the city's books from July 1, 2001 current by March of 2002.

The Committee will continue to monitor the progress made by the Treasurer and the Assistant Treasurer. Basically, there are some additional personnel issues which will be taken care of. Most of the other issues are routine (i.e. fixed assets), and the Board will deal with these issues through the Finance Committee over the next three months.

After the presentation (please refer to the handout distributed by the Comptroller on December 7th), with the understanding that this will continue to be reviewed by the Committee, this item was approved 7-0.

#402-01 HIS HONOR THE MAYOR requesting an appropriation in the amount of

\$10,504.10 from Budget Reserve for the purpose of paying a judgement against the City of Newton arising out of an accident between a Parks and

Recreation Department vehicle and another vehicle.

ACTION: APPROVED 7-0

NOTE: Donnalynn Kahn was present this evening and presented the facts surrounding this accident. It was clear that both of these vehicles were totaled. The City's vehicle was worth \$2,500 and the other vehicle was of much greater value. It was determined that the city's driver, in this case, was at fault, therefore, the City has no other recourse but to pay the judgement in the amount of \$10,504.10.

With that understanding, the Committee voted 7-0 to approve this item.

#426-01 HIS HONOR THE MAYOR requesting acceptance of and authorization to

expend the sum of \$12,000, received as a grant from the Massachusetts Historical Commission. These funds will be used to increase awareness and recognition of the East Parish, West Parish and South Burying

Grounds.

ACTION: APPROVED 7-0

NOTE: Mike Kruse, Director of Planning and Development, was present this evening. He explained that these funds will be matched by the City to be used for historic landscape preservation and increase awareness and recognition of these burying grounds. This grant is designed to be completed in two parts. The City is in the process of trying to get these locations on the National Register of Historic Places, and in order to do that, we must update the existing master plan (completed in 1990) to reflect the current needs and priorities of each of these locations. This will help to generate a comprehensive plan to restore and maintain these resources. \$6,480 will be reimbursed by the Department of Environmental Management, and the City's matching funds are \$5,520.

The Committee was very much interested in continuing this project. With that, the Committee voted 7-0 to approve this request.

#425-01 <u>HIS HONOR THE MAYOR</u> requesting that the sum of \$6,000 be transferred within the FY02 Planning Department budget in order to allow the Department to pay for temporary clerical services contracted during a period of vacancies in two administrative positions as follows:

FROM: Administrative Salaries

(0111401-511001)......\$6,000

TO: Clerical Services

(0111401-5313).....\$6,000

ACTION: APPROVED 7-0

NOTE: The Committee understood that, due to vacancies in the department, there was a requirement to move money from the salary account into the clerical services account. The Committee had no problem with this transfer. The positions covered by this item have now been filled and, therefore, this money is being required to pay the temp bill.

With that understanding, the Committee voted 7-0 to approve this request.

#403-01 <u>HIS HONOR THE MAYOR</u> requesting an appropriation in the amount of

\$7,600 from Budget Reserve for the purpose of funding payments for new

police recruits attending police academy training. These funds are necessary because there are more recruits than was originally anticipated.

ACTION: APPROVED 7-0

NOTE: Bob McDonald, Acting Police Chief, was present this evening. He reviewed the status of various personnel accounts and funding accounts in the Department. It was first thought that monies might be able to be transferred from salary accounts in order to pay for this additional cost. Based upon Acting Chief McDonald's comments to the Committee, it was determined that Budget Reserve was appropriate to be used for this funding purpose.

With that understanding, the Committee voted 7-0 to approve this item.

#424-01 CITY CLERK requesting authorization for annual holiday disbursement

of the sum of \$200 from the Kenrick Fund for holiday gifts to the Newton

needy.

ACTION: APPROVED 7-0

NOTE: Since this is an annual occurrence and appropriate use of this fund, the Committee, without debate, voted 7-0 to approve this item.

#389-00(VII)2 COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS requesting that sidewalk

betterment #389-00(VII), approved by the Board of Aldermen on October 2, 2000, be withdrawn. Said betterment was assessed to Mr. Ching-Yun Chen, 120 Prospect Street, in the amount of \$1,908.

NOTE: This sidewalk will not be installed, at the request of the property owner, therefore, the Committee voted 7-0 to approve this item.
