The City of Newton invites sealed bids in accordance with M.G.L. c.30, §39M from Contractors for:

COOPERATIVE BID TO SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF READY-MIX CONCRETE

Bids will be received until:

10:00 a.m., Thursday, June 13, 2024

at the Purchasing Department, Room 108, Newton City Hall, 1000 Commonwealth Avenue, Newton, MA 02459. Bids will not be accepted nor may submitted bids be corrected, modified or withdrawn after the deadline for bids. Immediately following the deadline for bids, all bids received within the time specified will be publicly opened and read aloud.

This is a cooperative bid issued by the City of Newton ("City") as lead jurisdiction for the Towns of Arlington, Brookline, and Watertown, and the Cities of Waltham and Newton (collectively, the "Bid Participants") for a firm fixed cost contract for Ready Mix Concrete for the period from July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025. The contract may be extended for one (1) additional one year term on the same terms and conditions as the initial term. (Each Bid Participant will be responsible for its own contract and/or purchase order(s) and any extension.)

For purposes of this procurement, the term "City" shall mean the City of Newton acting on behalf of itself and the Bid Participants.

The estimated cubic yards required pursuant to this bid is 6,102. (See Estimated Quantities at p. 8 below.)

A bidder's prices shall apply to all deliveries made. Quantities provided are based on past experience. There shall be no guarantee as to the minimum amount of a Bid Participant's overall requirements ordered from a Vendor pursuant to this contract.

Contract Documents will be available on line at www.newtonma.gov/bid after 10:00 a.m., May 30, 2024.

There will be no charge for contract documents. All bids must be accompanied by a bid deposit in an amount that is not less than five percent (5%) of the value of the bid, including all add alternates.

Bids must be submitted with one (1) Original and one (1) Copy.

The term of the awarded contract **shall** be the contract amount for the contract term (July 1, 2024-June 30, 2025). Each Bid Participant shall have the option, at its sole discretion, to extend the agreement for one (1) additional one (1) year term with no change in the contract price and terms and conditions. The exercise of each option to renew shall be subject to appropriation and /or continuation of funding.

A certain portion of wages paid by the selected bidder may be subject to minimum wage rates determined by the Massachusetts Department of Labor and Industries pursuant to M.G.L. c. 149, § 26 to 27H. The schedule of wage rates applicable to this contract is included in the bidding documents. In addition, the prevailing wage schedule will be updated annually for all public construction projects lasting longer than one (1) year. You will be required to pay the rates set out in any updated prevailing wage schedule. Increases in prevailing wage schedules will not be the basis for change order requests. The successful bidder will be required to provide a Certificate of Insurance demonstrating current coverage of the type and amounts set forth in the Project Manual. Wages are paid to drivers for all "on-site" work. The successful bidder will be required to furnish a Labor and Materials Payment Bond in the amount of 50% of the contract total.

The costs of any insurance required in this Invitation For Bid (IFB) are the responsibility of the bidder; such costs will not be reimbursed by City and should be included in your bid.

Once a bidder has downloaded this bid from the internet website www.newtonma.gov/bids, it should email purchasing@newtonma.gov its company's Name, address, EMAIL, phone, fax AND the INVITATION FOR BID NUMBER and Project Title, so that we may add you to the Bidders List and you will be notified of any/all addendums.

¹ According to the Department of Labor Standards, drivers who haul ready-mix concrete to public construction projects are not covered by the Prevailing Wage Law while off-site, including time spent over-the-road and picking-up materials. These drivers are covered by the Prevailing Wage Law while on-site at the public construction project.

The City reserves the right to reject any and all bids in accordance with the above referenced General Laws. In addition, the City reserves the right to waive any informalities in any or all bids, or to reject any or all bids (in whole or in part) if it be in the public interest to do so.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

ARTICLE 1 - BIDDER'S REPRESENTATION

- 1.1 Each General Bidder (hereinafter called the "Bidder") by making a bid (hereinafter called "bid") represents that:
 - 1. The Bidder has read and understands the Bidding Documents, Contract Forms, General Conditions, Conditions of the Contract, General Requirements and Project Specification (collectively, referred to as the "Contract Documents") and the bid is made in accordance therewith.
 - 2. The Bidder is familiar with the local conditions under which the work has to be performed.
- 1.2 Failure to so examine the Contract Documents or become familiar with local conditions will not relieve any Bidder from any obligation under the bid as submitted.

ARTICLE 2 - REQUEST FOR INTERPRETATION

- 2.1 Bidders shall promptly notify the City of any ambiguity, inconsistency, or error which they may discover upon examination of the Contract Documents, the site, and local conditions.
- 2.2 Bidders requiring clarification or interpretation of the Contract Documents shall make a written request to the *Chief Procurement Officer*, at purchasing@newtonma.gov or via facsimile (617) 796-1227. The City will answer such requests if received by Friday, June 7, 2024 at 12:00 noon. In the event that the bid opening date is changed, the deadline for informational requests may also change as provided in an addendum issued by the City.
- 2.3 Interpretation, correction, or change in the Contract Documents will be made by addendum which will become part of the Contract Documents. The City will not be held accountable for any oral representation.
- 2.4 Addenda will be emailed to every individual or firm on record as having taken a set of Contract Documents.
- 2.5 Copies of addenda will be made available for inspection at the location listed in the Invitation for Bids where Contract Documents are on file, in addition to being available online at www.newtonma.gov/bids.
- 2.6 Bidders or proposers contacting ANY CITY EMPLOYEE regarding an this Invitation For Bid (IFB) outside of the Purchasing Department, once an IFB or RFP has been released, may be disqualified from the bidding process.
- Bidders downloading information off the internet web site are solely responsible for obtaining any addenda prior to the bid opening. If bidders makes themselves known to the Purchasing Department, at purchasing@newtonma.gov or via facsimile (617) 796-1227, they shall be placed on the bidder's list. Bidders must provide the Purchasing Department with their company's name, street address, city, state, zip, phone, fax, email address and include on their bid INVITATION FOR BID #24-77.

ARTICLE 3 - MBE PARTICIPATION

- 3.1 Notice is hereby given that the Mayor's Affirmative Action Plan for the City of Newton in effect at the time of this solicitation is applicable to all construction contracts in excess of \$10,000.00.
- 3.2 Notice is hereby given that the City of Newton Minority/Women Business Enterprise Plan and the Supplemental Equal Employment Opportunity Anti-Discrimination and Affirmative Action Program in effect at the time of this solicitation are applicable to all City contracts for goods and services in excess of \$50,000.00.
- 3.3 Copies of the Plans and Program referred to in Sections 3.1 and 3.2 are available at: www.newtonma.gov/government/purchasing.

ARTICLE 4 - PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- 4.1 Bids shall be submitted on the "Bid Form #24-77," attached hereto.
- 4.2 All entries on the Bid Form shall be made by typewriter or in ink.
- 4.3 Where so indicated on the Bid Form, sums shall be expressed in both words and figures. Where there is a discrepancy between the bid sum expressed in words and the bid sum expressed in figures, the words shall control.
- 4.4 Bid Deposits shall be submitted in the amount specified in the IFB. They shall be made payable to the City and shall be either in the form of cash, certified check, treasurer's or cashier's check issued by a responsible bank or trust company, or a bid bond issued by a surety licensed to do business in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; and shall be conditioned upon the faithful performance by the principal of the agreements contained in the bid. Bidders are reminded that the bid deposit covers the City for damages when a bidder withdraws its bid after the bid submission date. Bid advised that to the extent permitted by law the City will retain all bid deposits for withdrawn bids.

Bid deposits of the three (3) lowest responsible and eligible Bidders shall be retained until the execution and delivery of the City/Contractor agreement.

- 4.5 The Bid, including the bid deposit shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope with the following plainly marked on the outside:
 - * GENERAL BID FOR: #24-77
 - * NAME OF PROJECT: Cooperative Bid Supply and Delivery of Ready Mix Concrete
 - * BIDDER'S NAME, BUSINESS ADDRESS, AND PHONE NUMBER
- 4.6 Date and time for receipt of bids is set forth in the IFB.
- 4.7 Timely delivery of a bid at the location designated shall be the full responsibility of the Bidder. In the event that Newton City Hall is closed on the date or at the time that bids are due, the date and time for receipt of bids shall be on the next business day following that the Newton City Hall and the Purchasing Department are open.
- 4.8 Massachusetts law requires all employees who work on Massachusetts public works construction sites must have no Less than 10 hours of OSHA-approved safety and health training. See M.G.L. c.30, §39M(c), M.G.L. c.30, §39S(a)(1), M.G.L. c.149, §44E(2) & M.G.L. c.149, §44F(2).
 - 1. This requirement will apply to any general bid or sub bid submitted.
 - 2. This law directs the Massachusetts Attorney General to restrain the award of construction contracts to any contractor who is in violation to this requirement and to restrain the performance of these contracts by non-complying contractors.
 - 3. The contractor and all subcontractors on this project must certify on the Bid Form compliance with the applicable requirement. Non-compliance with this law will disqualify the bidder.

ARTICLE 5 - ALTERNATES

- 5.1 Each Bidder shall acknowledge Alternates (if any) in Section C on the Bid Form.
- 5.2 In the event an Alternate does not involve a change in the amount of the base bid, the Bidder shall so indicated by writing "No Change", or "N/C" or "0" in the space provided for that Alternate.
- 5.3 Bidders shall enter on the Bid Form a single amount for each Alternate which shall consist of the amount for work performed by the Contractor.
- 5.4 The low Bidder will be determined on the basis of the sum of the base bid and the accepted alternates.

ARTICLE 6 - WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the time designated for receipt of bids on written or electronic request. Electronic withdrawal of bids must be confirmed over the Bidder's signature by written notice postmarked on or before the date and time set for receipt of bids.

- 6.2 Withdrawn bids may be resubmitted up to the time designated for the receipt of bids.
- 6.3 No bids shall be withdrawn within thirty days, Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after the opening of the bids.

ARTICLE 7 - CONTRACT AWARD

- 7.1 The City is soliciting bids to provide the estimated materials and labor set forth in the Item Sheet attached at pp. 21-24 hereto and in the attached Specifications. It is the City's intent to award one (1) contract to the responsive and eligible Bidder offering the lowest Total Cost as set forth in Item C of Bid Form #24-77. The Total Cost shall be the same for the first year of the contract as well as for extensions, if any. Contracts will be awarded within sixty (60) days, Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays excluded, after the opening of bids.
 - 7.2 The City of Newton reserves the right to waive minor informalities in or to reject any or all Bids if it be in the public interest to do so.
 - 7.3 The City reserves the right to reject any bidder who has failed to pay any local taxes, fees, assessments, betterments, or any other municipal charge, unless the bidder has a pending abatement application or has entered into a payment agreement with the collector-treasurer.
 - 7.4 As used herein, the term "lowest responsible and eligible Bidder" shall mean the Bidder (1) whose bid is the lowest of those bidders possessing the skill, ability and integrity necessary for the faithful performance of the work; (2) who has met all the requirements of the invitation for bids; (3) who shall certify that he is able to furnish labor that can work in harmony with all other elements of labor employed or to be employed in the work; (4) who, where the provisions of section eight B of chapter twenty-nine apply, shall have been determined to be qualified thereunder.
 - 7.5 Subsequent to the award and within five (5) days, Saturday, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after the prescribed forms are presented for signature, the successful Bidder shall execute and deliver to the City a Contract in the form included in the Contract Documents in such number of counterparts as the City may require.
 - 7.6 In the event that the City receives low bids in identical amount from two or more responsive and responsible Bidders, the City shall select the successful Bidder by a blind selection process chosen by the City such as flipping a coin or drawing names from a hat. The low Bidders who are under consideration will be invited to attend and observe the selection process.

ARTICLE 8 - TAXES

- 8.1 The Bidder shall not include in this bid any tax imposed upon the sale or rental of tangible personal property in this Commonwealth, such as any and all building materials, supplies, services and equipment required to complete the work.
- 8.2 The City is exempt from payment of the Massachusetts Sales Tax, and the Bidder shall not include any sales tax on its bid. The City's exemption Number is E-046-001-404.

ARTICLE 9 – PROPRIETARY SPECIFICATIONS

- 9.1 The City may have used a proprietary specification to describe the supply listed in the specifications. Such specifications are permitted under M.G.L. c. 30, §39M(b), provided that the City states in writing that use of the proprietary specification is in its best interest and that it will accept an "equal" of the item specified. An item is considered equal if (i) it is at least equal in quality, durability, appearance, strength, and design; (ii) will perform the intended function at least equally; and (iii) conforms substantially, even with deviations, to the detailed requirements contained in the specifications. If the Bidder wishes to substitute an equal item, it may do so either in its bid or proposal or after the contract is awarded but before a contract is executed, it being understood that the award shall be conditioned on the Bidder providing the item originally specified or an equal item accepted by the City and identified in the contract. In no event shall the Bidder be entitled to offer, or the City is obliged to consider, the substitution of an item as equal after execution of a contract. In the event the Bidder substitutes or attempts to substitute an "equal" item after that date, it shall be in breach thereof and be liable for actual and consequential damages resulting from its failure to perform as agreed. The City shall have the sole right to determine whether or not said item is equal.
- 9.2 The required determination and justification have been duly prepared, and a copy may be requested in accordance with the Massachusetts Public Records Law, M.G.L. c. 66, §10.

SUMMARY OF WORK AND SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS OF THE CONTRACT

FOR PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION

I. SUMMARY OF WORK

A. Supply and Delivery:

1.

The work under this contract consists of supplying, delivering and discharging approximately six thousand (6,000) cubic yards of 4,000 psi 3/4" aggregate transit-mixed cement concrete.

These deliveries shall be made to various construction sites within twenty-four (24) hours of ordering to at locations stipulated by the cities and towns participating in this IFB.

- 2. Any work described in the Project Manual unless specifically indicated is not to be done.
- B. The Total Cost shall be the complete cost, including overhead, profit, insurance, transportation, and all other costs connected with, or incidental to the work described.

II. TIME FOR COMPLETION AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

- A. Upon notification the Contractor shall deliver material specified in the Project Manual as directed by the City. Deliveries shall proceed in a continuous uninterrupted fashion with adequately staffed crews, in a satisfactory manner, which will ensure that they are completed in a timely manner to the satisfaction of the City.
- B. The time for performance of the <u>Contract</u> shall extend from July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025. The Bid Participants shall each have the option, at its sole discretion, to extend the agreement for one (1) additional one (1) year term. It is further understood that in the event the term of this contract extends beyond <u>June 30</u> in any calendar year, the Bid Participants reserve the right to terminate a contract if funding for its continuance is not appropriated in the succeeding fiscal year commencing July 1.

Time is of the essence for the performance of the contract. If the Contractor fails to achieve substantial or final completion of the Work within the time required by the contract, and unless an extension of time is granted, the Contractor shall pay to the City as liquidated damages, the applicable amount specified in **Section 2.18** of the **General Conditions** for each day of delay. If different completion dates are specified in the Contract for separate parts or stages of the work, the amount of liquidated damages shall be assessed on those parts or stages which are delayed. To the extent that the Contractor's delay or nonperformance is excused under another section in this Contract, liquidated damages shall not be due the City. The Contractor remains liable for damages caused other than by delay.

III. <u>INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS</u>

- A. The Contractor shall carry and maintain until acceptance of the work such Workmen's Compensation, Automobile Liability, Public Liability, Contingent Public Liability, Property Damage and Contingent Property Damage Insurance, each including blasting coverage, as shall protect him and any sub-contractor performing work covered by this contract from all claims and liability for damages for personal injury, including accidental death, and for property damage which may arise from operations under this contract, whether such operations be by himself or by any sub-contractor or by any one directly or indirectly employed by either of them.
- B. Bid Participants shall be named as an additional insureds on such policies.

- C. The amounts of such insurance shall be as follows:
 - 1. Workmen's Compensation Insurance as required by Massachusetts General Law.
 - 2. Automobile Liability Insurance on all vehicles owned or hired for a.) Bodily Injury in an amount not less than \$500,000.00 for each occurrence, and not less than \$1,000,000.00 aggregate; b.) Property Damage in an amount not less than \$250,000.00 each occurrence, and not less than \$500,000.00 aggregate.
 - 3. Public Liability Insurance and Contingent Public Liability Insurance in an amount not less than \$500,000.00 for injuries, including accidental death to any one person, and subject to the same limit for each person, in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 on account of one accident.
 - 4. Property Damage Insurance and Contingent Property Damage Insurance in an amount not less than \$250,000.00 on account of one accident, and in an amount of not less than \$500,000.00 on account of all accidents.
 - 5. General Liability Insurance shall include Contractual Liability Insurance.
- C. Before any work is started, the successful bidder shall be required to file with the City's Chief Procurement Officer certificates of insurance coverage as detailed above, with policy numbers and dates of expiration.
- D. The Contractor shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the City and its departments, officers, employees, servants, and agents from and against all actions, causes of actions, claims, demands, damages, costs, loss of services, expenses and compensation, including attorney's fees and interest arising out of or resulting directly or indirectly from the services rendered pursuant to this Contract, provided that any such action, cause of action, claim, demand, damage, cost, loss of service, expense, compensation (1) in any way grows out of bodily injury, sickness, disease or death, or to injury to or destruction of tangible property, which (2) is caused in whole or in part by any act or omission of the Contractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, regardless of whether or not it is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder.

Description

- (a) Under these items the Contractor shall be responsible for supplying, delivering and discharging, in a timely fashion, various types of cement concrete, of various volumes, to Bid Participant project sites which will be located at multiple locations throughout the five (5) participating jurisdictions. The supplier is further advised that in certain cases, due to the nature of the work, the supply vehicle will be required to relocate, and/or to make multiple stops, in the course of discharging an entire load of cement concrete.
- (b) Due to the nature of this work the Contractor is advised that **fifteen (15) minutes per cubic yard shall be considered the standard typical discharge time**. In the event the Contractor feels this standard has been unreasonably exceeded then the waiting and/or discharge time period must be verified by both the DPW working foreman and the Contractor's driver at the time of each occurence, and so noted on the delivery slip by both parties, and subsequently, should the vendor find it necessary to file a claim for additional compensation then the delivery slip shall act as the documentation medium. However under no circumstances shall the City pay more than reasonable industry rates pursuant to any such claim for extra compensation, and any such claim must be made within three (3) days of its occurrence (Saturday, Sundays and holidays excepted).

Description (Continued)

(c) The City will issue payments on a monthly basis, however the Contractor is to Fax all outstanding costs to each Bid Participant on a weekly basis so that the initial encumbrance of funds for this program is not exceeded.

Materials

- (d) All base cement shall be of a **light grey color**.
- (e) All concrete shall be transit mix and shall conform to the current specifications of A.S.T.M. C-94.
- (f) Cement concrete shall be air entrained conforming to the classification of concrete mixes of Division III Subsection M4.02.00 and the current specifications of Section M4 of the Massachusetts Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges of 1988 Cement concrete shall have a 28-day compressive strength of 4,000 PSI using 3/4-inch aggregate, and with an entrained air content of $7.0 \pm 1.0\%$.
- (g) <u>Fiber Reinforcement</u>: Under <u>Item 11 One-inch (1") ProMesh® Reinforcement Fibers</u> (or an approved equal) shall be added to the cement concrete at a rate of one and a half (1.5) pounds per cubic yard of cement concrete or otherwise in accordance with the manufacturers prevailing recommendations and instructions. A copy of the manufacturer's recommendations and instructions shall be forwarded to each Bid Participant upon request and at no extra charge.
- (h) <u>Heat Treatment:</u> Under Item 12 the base elements for 'cold weather concrete' shall be prepared by utilizing heated water and/or heated aggregate (prior to cement being added) via an approved industry method so that the combined temperature of the aggregate and water mixture is not less than seventy degrees Fahrenheit (70° F) nor more than one hundred forty degrees Fahrenheit (140° F). Subsequently the temperature of the concrete shall not be less than sixty degrees Fahrenheit (60° F) nor more than ninety degrees Fahrenheit (90° F) at the time of delivery and placement. The heating shall be done in a manner to preclude the occurrence of overheated areas which might result in damage to the materials. Any materials, and/or discharged cement concrete, containing frost, lumps and/or hardened material shall be rejected and disposed of at the expense of the Vendor. 'Cold weather concrete' shall be delivered <u>only upon request of a Bid Participant</u> and then generally only for the period of October 15 through to April 15. Cold weather concrete shall conform to the current specifications of Section M4 of the Massachusetts Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges of 1988.
- (i) Coloring Agent: Under Item 13 'Navajo Red' Scofield Chromix Normal Set Coloring Agent (or an approved equal) shall be added to a light gray cement concrete at a rate of five (5) sacks per cubic yard of cement concrete or otherwise in accordance with the manufactures prevailing recommendations and instructions. Bid Participants may specify alternative coloring agents. A copy of the color samples, and the manufacturers' recommendations and instructions shall be forwarded to a Bid Participant upon request and at no extra charge. Further, once selected, the amount of coloring agent shall be strictly controlled and shall be clearly noted by the plant manager on every delivery slip, so that all subsequent loads are guaranteed to be of a uniform color. To that end all base cement materials are to be supplied with equal consistency such that, after the end of a six-month curing period, all cement concrete shall have attained a reasonably uniform appearance in the field, and each Bid Participant's decision shall be final. Any remedial work necessitated due to unreasonable color variations shall be done at the Contractor's expense.

 Further, due to the nature of this work a Bid Participant may desire to alter the proportions and/or the coloring agent. In that event any difference in price shall be paid for under Item 15 @ CITY AGENT'S DISCRETIONARY FUND FOR MIX ADJUSTMENT(S)

Materials (Continued)

(j) Upon delivery of each load, each Bid Participant shall be furnished with a plant issued invoice which clearly states the design mix, the quantities of any admixture(s), the tare volume, and the date of batching. Any concrete mix, which when tested on the job site is found to contain quantities of entrained air less than six (6), or more than eight (8) per cent, and/or which yields a slump of less than three (3) inches, or greater than five (5) inches, shall be rejected and the decision of each Bid Participant shall be final. However, each reserves the right to change the above mix to meet the required strength test.

(k) Immediately upon delivery of any transit-Mix Concrete product, the Contractor shall furnish the appropriate Engineer with a computer-generated invoice that has been issued directly by the cement concrete batching plant. The invoice shall clearly show the tare volume, type of cement concrete and the date of delivery for each load of transit-mixed cement concrete which is ultimately delivered and discharged. The plant issued tare/volume slips are to bear the name of the vendor and shall be surrendered to the Bid Participant's DPW Agent-In-Charge immediately upon the delivery of the material. Bid Participants will have no obligation to pay for any errant slips which are forwarded after the wet-pour has ceased.

Basis of Payment:

- (l) Under **Items 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10** the Contractor shall be paid the contract unit price per cubic yard for the cement concrete supplied, delivered and subsequently discharged at the construction site. **These various sized loads are to be filled, transported, and subsequently invoiced, just as they were ordered by a Bid Participant. The combining 'short loads' to fill an order of a larger volume will not be allowed.** The unit price shall include full compensation for all labor, materials, tools, fuel, transportation *, equipment and all incidentals necessary to provide the cement concrete under these items and as specified herein.
- (m) Under Item 11 the Contractor shall be paid an additional fee at the contract unit price per cubic yard for supplying and adding fiber reinforcement to the cement concrete <u>but only when specifically ordered to do so by a Bid Participant</u>. Under this item (Item 11) the additional charge shall be computed based on the actual number of cubic yards contained in the base load as described under Items 1 thru 10, but with said additional fees being shown as a separate entity on the invoice for clarification purposes. The unit price shall include full compensation for all labor, materials, tools, fuel, transportation, equipment and all incidentals necessary to provide the cement concrete additive as specified herein.
- (n) Under Item 12 the Contractor shall be paid an additional fee at the contract unit price per cubic yard for providing heat treatment(s) to the cement concrete <u>but only when specifically ordered to do so by a Bid Participant</u>. Under this item (Item 12) the additional charge shall be computed based on the actual number of cubic yards contained in the base load as described under Items 1 thru 10, but with said additional fees being shown as a separate entity on the invoice for clarification purposes. The unit price shall include full compensation for all labor, materials, tools, fuel, transportation, equipment and all incidentals necessary to provide the cement concrete pre-treatment process' as specified herein.
- (o) Under Item 13 the Contractor shall be paid an additional fee at the contract unit price per cubic yard for supplying and adding coloring agent to the cement concrete <u>but only when specifically ordered to do so by a Bid Participant</u>. Under this item (Item 13) the additional charge shall be computed based on the actual number of cubic yards contained in the base load as described under Items 1 thru 10, but with said additional fees being shown as a separate entity on the invoice for clarification purposes. Further, even though <u>the cement concrete WILL NOT be supplied</u> under this program still the supply, delivery and discharge bid prices of

Basis of Payment (Continued)

Items 1 through 10 shall be used here to fix the base price of the order <u>BEFORE</u> the additional 'colorizing' fee is added. The unit price shall include full compensation for all labor, materials, tools, fuel, transportation, equipment and all incidentals necessary to provide the colorized cement concrete under these items and as specified herein.

<u>Further, due to the nature of this work the City may desire to alter the proportions and/or the coloring agent. In that event any difference in price shall be paid for under Item 15 @ CITY AGENT'S DISCRETIONARY FUND FOR MIX ADJUSTMENT(S).</u>

- (p) Under **Item 14** the Contractor shall be paid an additional flat-rate fee at the contract unit price **for each delivery** made **on a Saturday**. This is a flat-rate unit price which shall be for full compensation of all additional charges incurred by the Contractor for providing the personnel and equipment, as well as for all administrative costs that are associated with Saturday deliveries.
- (q) Deliveries shall arrive on-site Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. 3:30 p.m.

SECTION 2

ITEM 15 - DISCRETIONARY FUND FOR MIX ADJUSTMENT(S)

Description

- (a) In the event additional fees are associated with any adjustments made to the cement concrete mix at the batching plant, such as admixtures, and/or coloring agent(s), then such additional fees shall be paid for under this item (Item 15). However, no additional fees shall be paid for adjustments that HAVE NOT been specifically ordered and/or pre-approved by a Bid Participant. This section is only to afford a Bid Participant the means by which the cement concrete mix and/or admixtures can be easily modified at the plant as field conditions may necessitate.
- (b) The total sum to be allowed for all work under this item shall be three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00).
- (c) All work under this item shall be paid for upon an agreed upon lump sum per adjustment prior to order.

Basis of Payment

(d) Payment for work completed under **Item 15** shall be as specified above, in full or in part, as approved by the City Agent in advance for the goods and/or services rendered.

END OF SECTION

CITY OF NEWTON GENERAL CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION

1.0 **DEFINITIONS**

1.1 THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

The term "Contract Documents" sometimes also referred to as the "Contract", means the contract entered into between the City of Newton (hereinafter "City") and the Contractor. It includes the Invitation for Bid, General Bid Form, Contract Form, these General Conditions of the Contract, Supplements and Amendments to the General Conditions (if any), Contract Specifications, Drawings, all addenda issued prior to execution of the contract, the Bid Bond, the Labor and Material Payment Bond, or other assurances of completion, the applicable wage rate determinations, and other documents listed in the Agreement and modifications issued after execution of the contract.

1.2 THE WORK

The term "Work", sometimes also referred to as the "Project", means the construction and services required by the Contract Documents, whether completed or partially completed, and includes all other labor, materials, equipment, and services provided or to be provided by the Contractor to fulfill the Contractor's obligation.

1.3 OWNER

The term "Owner" shall refer to all or one of the Bid Participants, as the context may prescribe.

1.4 CONTRACT OFFICER

The term "Contract Officer" means the person appointed by the Owner to administer the terms of the Contract between the Owner and the Contractor, who is also empowered to take certain actions under this Agreement.

1.5 CONTRACTOR

- 1.5.1 The Contractor, sometimes referred to as the General Contractor, is the person or entity identified as such throughout the Contract Documents as if singular in number. The term Contractor means the Contractor or its authorized representative.
- 1.5.2 The Contractor shall supervise and direct the Work, using the Contractor's best skill and attention. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for and have control over construction means, methods, techniques, sequences and procedures, and for coordinating all portions of the Work under the Contract.

1.6 SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION

The term "Substantial Completion" means the value of the work remaining to be performed by the Contractor is, in the estimate of the awarding authority, less than one percent (1%) of the original contract price.

2.0 CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

2.1 PRE-CONSTRUCTION CONFERENCE

- 2.1.1 Prior to commencement of the Work, the Contractor shall meet in conference with representatives of the Owner regarding the Owner's requirements under the Contract for administration of the quality assurance program, safety program, labor provisions, the schedule of work, and other Contract procedures.
- 2.1.2 The Contractor shall begin work upon receipt of a written Notice to Proceed from the Contract Officer or designee. The Contractor shall not begin work prior to receiving such notice.

2.2 CONTRACT PERIOD

The Contractor shall complete all work required under this contract within the timeframe specified elsewhere in this document, or within the time schedule established in the notice to proceed issued by the Contracting Officer.

2.3 REJECTION OF DEFECTIVE MATERIALS AND WORK

The Owner's inspection of the Work shall not relieve the Contractor of any of its responsibilities to fulfill the Contract obligations, and defective work shall be corrected without cost to the Owner. Unsuitable work may be rejected by the Owner, notwithstanding that such work and materials have been previously overlooked or misjudged by the Owner and accepted for payment. If the Work or any part thereof shall be found defective at any time before the final acceptance of the whole Work, the Contractor shall forthwith correct such defect in a manner satisfactory to the Owner, and if any material brought upon the site for use in the Work, or selected for the same, shall be rejected by the Owner as unsuitable or not in conformity with the Contract requirements, the Contractor shall forthwith remove such materials from the vicinity of the Work.

2.4 CHANGES

2.4.1 All changes in the work including any increase, decrease, or other equitable adjustment in the Contract price or in the time for performing the Contract, shall be authorized in writing by the Owner and/or Contract Officer prior to commencement.

2.5 CONTRACT PRICE

The Contract Price is stated in the Contract Form, and including authorized adjustments, is the total amount payable by the Owner to the Contractor for performance of the Work under the Contract Documents.

2.6 APPLICATIONS FOR PAYMENT

- 2.6.1 Once each month, on a date established by the Owner at the beginning of the Work, the Contractor shall deliver to the Owner an itemized Application for Payment, supported by such data substantiating the Contractor's right to payment as the Owner may require, and reflecting a minimum of 5% retainage until the final acceptance and payment by the Owner.
- 2.6.2 The Owner shall make payment to the Contractor within 30 days of receipt of said application, less any applicable retainage.
- 2.6.3 The Owner may make changes in any application for payment submitted by the Contractor for:
 - i. Retention based on the value of its claims against the Contractor,
 - ii. Retention of 5% of the approved amount of the Application for Payment.

2.7 FINAL PAYMENT

The acceptance by the Contractor of the last payment due under this Contract or the execution of the Final Certificate of Completion, shall operate as a release to the Owner from all claims and liability related to this Contract.

2.8 GUARANTY AND WARRANTY

2.8.1 WARRANTY

The Contractor warrants to the Owner that materials and equipment furnished under the Contract will be of good quality and new unless otherwise required or permitted by the Contract Documents, that the Work will be free from defects not inherent in the quality required or permitted, and that the Work will conform with the requirements of the Contract Documents. Work not conforming to these requirements, including substitutions not properly approved and authorized, may be considered defective. If required by the Owner, the Contractor shall furnish satisfactory evidence as to the kind and quality of materials and equipment.

2.8.2 GENERAL GUARANTY

If at any time during the period of one (1) year from the date of Substantial Completion of the Work to be performed under this Contract, any part of the Work shall, in the reasonable determination of the Owner, require replacing or repairing due to the fact that it is broken, defective, or otherwise does not conform to the Contract Documents, the Owner will notify the Contractor to make the required repairs or replacement. If the Contractor shall neglect to commence such repairs or replacement to the satisfaction of the Owner within ten (10) days from the date of giving or mailing such notice, then the Owner may employ other persons to make the same. The Contractor agrees, upon demand, to pay to the Owner all amounts which the Owner expends for such repairs or replacements. During this one year guarantee period any corrective work shall be performed in accordance with the applicable terms of this Contract. For items of work completed after use and occupancy has been taken, the one year guarantee shall commence at the time the Owner accepts such items. This one year guarantee shall not limit any express guaranty or warranty provided elsewhere in the Contract.

2.9 INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

2.9.1 The Contractor shall provide insurance coverage as listed below. This insurance shall be provided at the Contractor's expense and shall be in full force and effect during the full term of this Contract.

2.9.2 OWNER AS CO-INSURED

The Owner shall be named as additional insureds on the Contractor's Liability Policies.

2.9.3 CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE, POLICIES

- i. The Contractor shall not commence the work until proof of compliance with this Section 2.9 has been furnished to the Owner by submitting one copy of a properly endorsed insurance certificate issued by a company authorized to write insurance in the Commonwealth. This certificate shall indicate that the contractual liability coverage is in force.
- ii. The Contractor shall file the original and one certified copy of all policies with the Owner within fifteen (15) days after contract award. If the Owner is damaged by the Contractor's failure to maintain such insurance and to so notify the Owner, then the Contractor shall be responsible for all reasonable costs attributable thereto.

2.9.4 CANCELLATION

Cancellation of any insurance required by this contract, whether by the insurer or the insured, shall not be valid unless written notice thereof is given by the party proposing cancellation to the other party and Owner at least thirty days prior to the effective date thereof, which shall be expressed in said notice.

2.10 INDEMNIFICATION

The Contractor shall take all responsibility for the Work and take all precautions for preventing injuries to persons and property in or about the Work; shall bear all losses resulting to or on account of the amount or character of the Work. The Contractor shall pay or cause payment to be made for all labor performed or furnished and for all materials used or employed in carrying out this Contract. The Contractor shall assume the defense of, and indemnify and save harmless the Owner, and the Owner's officers and agents from all claims relating to labor performed or furnished and materials used or employed for the Work; to inventions, patents and patent rights used in and in doing the Work unless such patent infringement is due to a product or process specified by the Owner; to injuries to any person or corporation received or sustained by or from the Contractor and any employees, and subcontractors and employees, in doing the work, or in consequence of any improper materials, implements or labor used or employed therein; and to any act, omission or neglect of the Contractor and any employees therein.

2.11 BONDS

The Contractor shall provide the Owner with a performance and with a payment or labor and materials bond in the form provided by the Owner, executed by a surety company licensed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Division of Insurance. Such bond shall be in an amount equal to at least one half of the Contract price unless otherwise stated in the Contract Documents. All bonds shall be accompanied by a current power of attorney.

2.12 TERMINATION

2.12.1 TERMINATION FOR CAUSE

- i. The Owner may terminate this contract for cause if it determines that any of the following circumstances have occurred:
 - a. The Contractor is adjudged bankrupt or has made a general assignment for the benefit of its creditors.
 - b. A receiver has been appointed of the Contractor's property.
 - c. All or a part of the Work has been abandoned.
 - d. The Contractor has sublet or assigned all or any portion of the Work, the Contract, or claims thereunder, without the prior written consent of the Owner, except as provided in the Contract.
 - e. The Owner has determined that the rate of progress required on the project is not being met.
 - f. The Contractor has substantially violated any provisions of this Contract.
- ii. The Owner may complete the Work, or any part thereof, and charge its expense of so completing the Work or part thereof, to the Contractor.
- iii. The Owner may take possession of and use any materials, machinery, implements and tools found upon the site of said Work. The Owner shall not be liable for any depreciation, loss or damage to said materials, machinery, implements or tools during said use and the Contractor shall be solely responsible for their removal from a Project Site after the Owner has no further use for them.

2.12.2 TERMINATION - NO FAULT

- i. In the event that this Contract is terminated by the Owner, prior to the completion of construction and termination is not based on a reason listed in Paragraph 2.12.1, the Contractor shall be compensated for its costs incurred on the Project, including reasonable costs of de-mobilization, covering the period of time between the last approved application for payment and the date of termination.
- ii. Payment by the Owner pursuant to Section 2.7 shall be considered to fully compensate the Contractor for all claims and expenses and those of any consultants, subcontractors, and suppliers, directly or indirectly attributable to the termination, including any claims for lost profits.

2.13 PERMITS, FEES, AND NOTICES

- 2.13.1 The Contractor shall secure and the Owner shall pay for the building permit, if required. The Contractor shall coordinate all efforts required to obtain this permit. All other permits and governmental fees, licenses, and inspections necessary for proper execution and completion of the Work shall be secured and paid for by the Contractor.
- 2.13.2 The Contractor shall comply with and give notices required by laws, ordinances rules, regulations, and lawful orders of public authorities bearing on performance of the Work.
- 2.13.3 If the Contractor performs Work that it knows or reasonably should know is contrary to laws, statutes, ordinances, building codes, and rules and regulations without such notice to the Owner, the Contractor shall assume full responsibility for such Work and shall bear the attributable costs.

2.14 SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

2.14.1 The Contractor shall comply with all Federal, State, and local safety laws and regulations applicable to the Work performed under this Contract.

2.15 [Reserved]

2.16 AVAILABILITY AND USE OF UTILITY SERVICES

2.16.1 The City shall make all reasonably required amounts of utilities available to the Contractor from existing outlets and supplies, as specified in the Contract. Unless otherwise provided in the Contract, the amount of each utility service consumed shall be charged to or paid for by the Contractor at prevailing rates charged to the City or, where the utility is produced by the City, at reasonable rates determined by the Contracting Officer. The Contractor shall carefully conserve any utilities furnished without charge.

2.17 DISPUTES

- 2.17.1 "Claim," as used in this section, means a written demand or written assertion by one of the contracting parties seeking, as a matter of right, the payment of money in a sum certain, the adjustment or interpretation of contract terms, or other relief arising under or relating to the contract. A claim arising under the Contract, unlike a claim relating to the Contract, is a claim that can be resolved under a Contract clause that provides for the relief sought by the claimant. A voucher, invoice, or other routine request for payment that is not in dispute when submitted is not a claim. The submission may be converted to a claim by complying with the requirements of this section, if it is disputed either as to liability or amount or is not acted upon in a reasonable time.
- 2.17.2 All disputes arising under or relating to this Contract, including any claims for damages for the alleged breach thereof which are not disposed of by agreement, shall be resolved under this section.
- 2.17.3 All claims by the Contractor shall be made in writing and submitted to the Contract Officer for a written decision. A claim by the City against the Contractor shall be subject to a written decision by the Contract Officer.
- 2.17.4 The Contract Officer shall, within thirty (30) days after receipt of the request, decide the claim or notify the Contractor of the date by which the decision will be made.
- 2.17.5 The Contract Officer's decision shall be final unless the Contractor (1) appeals in writing to a higher level in the City, (2) refers the appeal to an independent mediator or arbitrator, or (3) files suit in a court of competent jurisdiction. Such appeal must be made within thirty (30) days after receipt of the Contract Officer's decision.
- 2.17.6 The Contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of this Contract and/or any authorized change thereof, pending final resolution of any request for relief, claim, appeal, or action arising under or relating to the Contract and/or any authorized change thereof, and comply with any decision of the Contract Officer.

2.18 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

- 2.18.1 If the Contractor fails to complete the Work within the time specified in the contract, or any extension thereof, the Contractor shall pay to the City as liquidated damages, the sum of \$250.00 for each day of delay. Completion dates are specified in the Contract for separate phases of the work, and the amount of liquidated damages shall be assessed on each and every phase which is delayed. To the extent that the Contractor's delay or nonperformance is excused under another section in this Contract, liquidated damages shall not be due the City. The Contractor remains liable for damages caused other than by delay.
- 2.18.2 If the City terminates the Contractor's right to proceed pursuant to section 2.12.1, the resulting damage will consist of liquidated damages until such reasonable time as may be required for final completion of the Work together with any increased costs to the City in completing the Work.
- 2.18.3 If the City does not terminate the Contractor's right to proceed, the resulting damage will consist of liquidated damages until the Work is completed or accepted.

3.0 SALES TAX EXEMPTION AND OTHER TAXES

3.0.1 To the extent that materials and supplies are used or incorporated in the performance of this Contract, the Contractor is considered an exempt purchaser under the Massachusetts Sales Act, Chapter 14 of the Acts of 1966.

3.0.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for paying all other taxes and tariffs of any sort, related to the Work.

3.1 PROHIBITION AGAINST LIENS

The Contractor is prohibited from placing a lien on the City's property. This prohibition shall apply to all subcontractors at any tier and all materials suppliers.

3.2 ORDER OF PRECEDENCE

In the event of a conflict between these General Conditions and the Specifications, the General Conditions shall prevail. In the event of a conflict between the Contract and any applicable state or local law or regulation, the state or local law or regulation shall prevail; provided that such state or local law or regulation does not conflict with, or is less restrictive than applicable federal law, regulation, or Executive Order. In the event of such a conflict, applicable federal law, regulation, and Executive Order shall prevail.

3.3 EXAMINATION AND RETENTION OF CONTRACTOR'S RECORDS

The City of Newton shall, until three (3) years after final payment under this Contract, have access to and the right to examine any of the Contractor's directly pertinent books, documents, papers, or other records involving transactions related to this Contract for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts, and/or transcriptions.

THIS AGREEMENT made this __day of __ in the year Two Thousand and Twenty-Four by and between the CITY OF NEWTON, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, hereinafter referred to as the CITY, acting through its Chief Procurement Officer, but without personal liability to him, and hereinafter referred to as the CONTRACTOR.

The parties hereto for the considerations hereinafter set forth agree as follows:

I. PRODUCT DESCRIPTION. The Contractor agrees to furnish and to deliver to the City at such times, at such place or places, in such manner, and in such quantities as the City may direct, and at the unit prices quoted in the Contractor's bid for the following item or items:

COOPERATIVE BID SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF READY-MIX CONCRETE

- **II. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.** The Contract Documents consist of the following documents which are either attached to this Agreement or are incorporated herein by reference:
 - a. This CITY-CONTRACTOR Agreement;
 - b. The City's Invitation For Bid #24-77 issued by the Purchasing Department;
 - c. The Project Manual for Cooperative Bid Supply & Delivery of Ready-Mix Concrete including the Instructions to Bidders;
 - General Conditions; Special Conditions; MWBE/AA Requirements, Wage Rate Requirements and Wage Rate Schedule(s) including any updated prevailing wage rate schedules if applicable; The Supplementary Special Conditions; General Requirements and Project Specifications; and Drawings, if included or referenced therein;
 - d. Specifications, and if included or referenced therein, any Standard Terms and Conditions, Special Conditions, Wage Rate Requirements, Wage Rate Schedule(s);
 - e. Addenda Number(s) _____;
 - f. The Bid Response of the CONTRACTOR submitted for this Project and accompanying documents and certifications;
 - g. Certificate(s) of Insurance and surety bond(s), if any, submitted by the CONTRACTOR in connection with this Project;
 - h. Duly authorized and executed Amendments, Change Orders or Work Orders issued by the CITY after execution of this CITY-CONTRACTOR Agreement.

This CITY-CONTRACTOR Agreement, together with the other documents enumerated in this Article, constitute the entire Agreement between the CITY and the CONTRACTOR. The CONTRACTOR represents that its bid was made without condition, qualification or reservation of any kind, except upon the written acknowledgement and consent of the CITY.

- **III. PRIORITY OF DOCUMENTS.** In the event of inconsistency between the terms of this CITY -CONTRACTOR Agreement and the Project Manual, the terms of this Agreement shall prevail.
- **IV. APPLICABLE STATUTES.** All applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations are incorporated herein by reference and the Vendor agrees to comply with same.

- V. CONTRACT TERM. The term of the awarded contract shall be the contract amount for the contract term (July 1, 2024-June 30, 2025). The City, at its sole discretion, shall have the option to extend the contract for one (1) additional one (1) year term with no change in the contract price and terms and conditions. The exercise of this option to renew shall be subject to appropriation and /or continuation of funding. The City reserves the right to terminate this contract prior to the expiration date in the event total expenditures reach the above stated contract total. If for any part thereof during the term of this Agreement, funds for the discharge of the City's obligations under this Agreement are not appropriated and authorized, or funds so appropriated and authorized are reduced or withdrawn, then this Agreement shall terminate.
- VI. QUANTITIES. The quantities specified in the Project Manual are approximate and are based on previous consumption. It is specifically understood the City does not agree to purchase any specific quantity, and purchases will be made to cover actual requirements only. The City may increase or decrease the quantity of any item specified without change in price per unit of quantity as stated in the Contractor's Bid Response.
- **VII. MATERIALS.** The Contractor agrees, unless otherwise specified, that all equipment, materials and supplies furnished under this contract are to be first quality, new and unused.
- VIII. AUTHORIZATION OF AND PAYMENT FOR WORK PERFORMED. The execution of this contract does not constitute a notice to proceed or authorization to perform work or make deliveries. No work shall be commenced or deliveries made unless authorized by a written Purchase Order issued by the City specifying the equipment, materials or supplies to be delivered. The Contractor will be paid following completed delivery and acceptance of the equipment, materials or supplies ordered in accordance with the Contract. The City will use best efforts to pay within thirty (30) days of receipt of an invoice for the delivered equipment, materials or supplies or acceptance of same whichever date is later.
- IX. CLAIMS FOR MATERIALS OR LABOR. In the event any claims have been filed with the City for material or labor delivered or performed pursuant to this contract, the City shall be under no obligation to make any payment until such claims are adjusted to the satisfaction of the City. Any and all liens for supplies may be paid off by the City within twenty (20) days after the filing for record as provided by law of a notice of such liens, except where the claim on which the lien is filed is being litigated by the Contractor, and in such case the City may pay the amount of any final judgment or decree on any such claim. All money paid by the City in settlement of liens and claims as aforesaid, with the costs and expenses incurred by the City in connection therewith shall be charged to the Contractor, bearing interest at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum, and be deducted from the next payment falling due the Contractor under the terms of this contract.
- X. UNIT PRICES. It is agreed that the unit prices listed are maximum prices and that the City shall be entitled to take advantage of any decreasing market conditions, decreases to be governed by the manufacturers' price listing as might be generally adopted in the trade, or by the same percentage that the Contractor may reduce prices to others who purchase in similar quantities and under similar conditions.
- XI. RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE WORK/INDEMNIFICATION. In the performance of any work, including the delivery of equipment, materials or supplies, pursuant to this Contract, the Contractor shall take all responsibility for the work, and shall take all precautions for preventing injuries to persons and property in or about the work and shall defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from all loss, cost, damage or expense arising from injuries to persons or property in or about the work. The Contractor shall be responsible for any damage which may be caused by the failure or insufficiency of any temporary works. He shall effectively protect his work and shall be liable for all damage and loss by delay or otherwise caused by his neglect or failure so to do.
- **XII. WARRANTY.** Except as may be otherwise provided in the Project Manual, the Contractor shall replace, repair or make good, without cost to the City, any defects or faults arising within one (1) year after date of acceptance of equipment, materials or supplies furnished hereunder (acceptance not to be unreasonably delayed) resulting from imperfect or defective work done or materials furnished by the Contractor.
- **XIII. PATENT INDEMNIFICATION.** The Contractor agrees to assume the defense of and shall indemnify and save harmless the City and all persons acting for or on behalf of it from all suits and claims against them, or any of them, arising from or occasioned by the use of any material, equipment or apparatus, or any part thereof which infringes or is alleged to infringe on any patent rights.

In case such material, equipment or apparatus, or any part thereof, in any such suit is held to constitute infringement, the Contractor, within a reasonable time, shall at its own expense, and as the City may elect, replace such material, equipment or apparatus with non-infringing material, equipment or apparatus, or remove the material, equipment, or apparatus and refund the sums paid therefor.

- XIV. INSPECTION. For the purposes of inspection of the equipment, materials and supplies covered by this contract, the Contractor shall give the City free access to his works and furnish every facility for properly inspecting such equipment, materials and supplies, and shall furnish full information, whenever requested, relating thereto. Approval by any inspector of the City shall not relieve the Contractor from his obligation to comply in all respects with the contract.
- **XV. ASSIGNMENT/SUB-CONTRACTING.** The Contractor agrees that he will not sell, assign or transfer this Contract or any part thereof or interest therein without the prior written consent of the City.
- **XVI. INSTALLATION.** If any of the equipment, materials and supplies covered by this contract is to be installed by either the Contractor or the City, the Contractor shall, upon request of the City, furnish a competent employee to supervise the installation without expense to the City, unless otherwise provided herein. Such supervisor, or other employees furnished by the Contractor, shall be the agents of the Contractor and not of the City, and the Contractor hereby agrees to indemnify the City and hold it harmless from and against any and all loss, costs, damage, and expense sustained as the result of negligence or other conduct on the part of such supervisor or employee.
- **XVII. TERMINATION.** The City of Newton may, by written notice of default to the Contractor, terminate the whole or any part of this Contract or any Shipping or Work Order issued pursuant thereto in any one of the following circumstances:
 - a. If the Contractor fails to make delivery of the equipment, goods or supplies or to perform the services within the time specified herein or any extension thereof;
 - b. If the Contractor fails to perform any of the other provisions of this contract or, if in the opinion of the City, Contractor so fails to make progress as to endanger performance of this contract in accordance with its terms, and in either of these two circumstances does not correct such failure within thirty (30) days (or such longer period as the City may authorize in writing) after receipt of notice from the City specifying such failure.
- **XVIII. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS.** The Vendor shall provide insurance coverage as listed below. This insurance shall be provided at the Vendor's expense and shall be in full force and effect during the full term of this Contract.

If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Contract shall be finally adjudicated by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the remainder of this Contract shall be unaffected by such adjudication and all of the remaining provisions of this Contract shall remain in full force and effect as though such section, paragraph, clause or provision, or any part thereof so adjudicated to be invalid, had not been included herein, unless such remaining provisions, standing alone, are incomplete and incapable of being executed in accordance with the intent of the parties to this Contract.
- **XXI. AMENDMENTS TO THIS CONTRACT.** This Contract may not be amended except in writing executed in the same manner as this CITY-CONTRACTOR Agreement.

WAGE RATE REQUIREMENTS

1. GENERAL

- A. This section summarizes the requirements for the payment of wages to laborers and mechanics employed under the Contract.
- **B**. Other duties and requirements of law which may not be specified in this section apply and are inherently a part of the Contract.

2. WAGE RATES

- A. The rate per hour to be paid to mechanics, apprentices, teamsters, chauffeurs, and laborers employed on the Work shall not be less than the rate of wages in the attached "Minimum Wage Rates" as determined by the Commissioner of Labor and Industries. This schedule shall continue to be the minimum rate of wages for said employees during the life of this Contract.
- **B.** Keep posted on the site a legible copy of said schedule. Keep on file the wage rates and classifications of labor employed on this Work in order that they may be available for inspection by the Owner, Administrator, or the Architect.
- **C.** Apprentices employed pursuant to this determination of wage rates must be registered and approved by the State Apprenticeship Council wherever rates for journeymen or apprentices are not listed.
- **D.** Pay reserve police officers employed on the Work the prevailing rate of wages paid to regular police officers as required by M.G.L. c149, Sec. 34B, as amended. Such police officers shall be covered by Workmen's Compensation Insurance and Employers Liability Insurance by the Contractor.
- E. The Contractor and all subcontractors shall, on a weekly basis throughout the term of the contract, provide to the City of Newton certified payroll affidavits in pdf format verifying compliance with M.G.L. c.149, Sec. 27, 27A and 27B. The Contractor is obligated to provide such records to the City directly on a weekly basis. The City may assess a penalty of \$100 for each day beyond the required submission date that such records are received, which amount shall be deducted from any amounts to the Contractor from the City. In the event of chronic late submissions, the City shall report the same to the Office of the Attorney General.
- **F.** The Contractor and all subcontractors shall provide a Statement of Compliance within 15 days of the completion of its portion of the work. This statement shall be submitted to the Owner on the form found elsewhere in this section.
- **G.** The Contractor shall maintain accurate and complete records, including payroll records, during the Contract term and for three years thereafter.

For multi-year CM AT RISK projects, the awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. The annual update requirement is not applicable to 27F "rental of equipment" contracts. The updated wage schedule must be provided to all contractors, including general and sub-contractors, working on the construction project.
- This wage schedule applies only to the specific project referenced at the top of this page and uniquely identified by the "Wage Request Number" on all pages of this schedule.
- An Awarding Authority must request an updated wage schedule if it has not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the
 date of issuance of the wage schedule. For CM AT RISK projects (bid pursuant to G.L. c.149A), the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the
 GMP Amendment, or (b) the bid for the first construction scope of work must be within 90-days of the wage schedule issuance date.
- The wages chedules hall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project as required by M.G.L. c. 149, § 27. The wages schedule shall be made a part of the contract awarded for the project. The wages schedule must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site for the life of the project in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 § 27. The wages listed on the wage schedule must be paid to employees performing construction work on the project whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or a sub-contractor.
- Apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Mass achusetts Division of Apprentice Standards (DAS).
 Apprentices must keep their apprentice identification card on their persons during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wages chedule. Any apprentice not registered with DAS regardless of whether they are registered with another federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the journeyworker's rate.
- Every contractor or subcontractor working on the construction project must submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of
 Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years. Each weekly payroll report must
 contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports
 to DLS. For a sample payroll reporting form go to http://www.mass.gov/dob/pw.
- Contractors with questions about the wage rates or classifications included on the wages chedule have an affirmative obligation to inquire with DLS at (617) 626-6953.
- Contractors must obtain the wages chedules from awarding authorities. Failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay the prevailing
 wage rates listed on the wages chedule to all employees who perform construction work on the project is a violation of the law and
 subjects the contractor or subcontractor to civil and criminal penalties.
- Employees not receiving the prevailing wage rate set forth on the wage schedule may file a complaint with the Fair Labor Division of the

DRIVERS WHO HAUL BITUMINOUS CONCRETE (ASPHALT)

The Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court recently affirmed that drivers who haul bituminous concrete to public construction projects are not covered by the Prevailing Wage Law while off-site, including time spent over-the-road and picking-up materials. These drivers are covered by the Prevailing Wage Law only while on-site at the public construction project.

In <u>Teamsters Joint Council No. 10 v. Department of Labor, et al.</u>, 447 Mass. 100 (2006), the SJC upheld a 2001 administrative decision limiting the applicability of prevailing wage rates to the time bituminous drivers spend at the public construction site. This most recent decision of the SJC followed a 1989 ruling that had upheld an earlier Department of Labor (and Industries') policy that had deemed this category of drivers to be "teamsters" under the Law and, therefore, entitled to prevailing wage rates. See <u>Construction Industries of Massachusetts v. Commissioner of Labor and Industries</u>, 406 Mass. 162 (1989). However, the earlier court case had left open the question of whether this entitled these bituminous drivers to prevailing wage rates for their over-the-road time as well as their on-site time. This most recent decision has now answered that question.

All of the requirements of the Prevailing Wage Law, including certified weekly payroll requirements, apply to bituminous drivers for all time spent at the public construction site.

DRIVERS WHO HAUL READY-MIX CONCRETE (CEMENT)

Drivers who haul ready-mix concrete to public construction projects are not covered by the Prevailing Wage Law while off-site, including time spent over-the-road and picking-up materials. These drivers are covered by the Prevailing Wage Law while on-site at the public construction project. This applicability determination was established by a 2001 administrative decision of the Department of Labor's Division of Occupational Safety.

All of the requirements of the Prevailing Wage Law, including certified weekly payroll requirements, apply to ready-mix drivers for all time spent at the public construction site.

NOTICE TO AWARDING AUTHORITIES

- ➤ 'The enclosed wage schedule applies only to the specific project listed at the top and will be updated for any public construction project lasting longer than one (1) year.
- You should request an updated wage schedule from the Division of Occupational Safety if you have not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the date of issuance of the enclosed wage schedule.
- > 'The wage schedule shall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project for which it has been issued.
- ➤ 'Once a contractor has been selected by the awarding authority, the wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract for that project.

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

- The enclosed wage schedule, and any updated schedule, must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site during the life of the project.
- ➤ The wages listed on the enclosed wage schedule must be paid to employees on public works projects regardless of whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or any sub-contractor.
- ➤ The enclosed wage schedule applies to all phases of the project including the final clean-up. Contractors whose only role is to perform final clean-up must pay their employees according to this wage schedule.
- All apprentices must be registered with the Massachusetts Division of Apprentice Training in order to be paid at the reduced apprentice rates. If a worker is not registered with the Division of Apprentice Training, they must be paid the "total rate" listed on the wage schedule regardless of experience or skill level. WEEKLY PAYROLL RECORDS REPORT & STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

In accordance with Massachusetts General Law c149, §27B, a true and accurate record must be kept of all persons employed on the public works project for which the enclosed rates have been provided. A Payroll Form has been printed on the reverse of this page and includes all the information required to be kept by law. Every contractor or subcontractor is required to keep these records and preserve them for a period of three years from the date of completion of the contract.

In addition, every contractor and subcontractor is required to submit a copy of their weekly payroll records to the awarding authority. This is required to be done on a weekly basis. Once collected, the awarding authority is also required to preserve those records for three years.

In addition, each such contractor, subcontractor or public body shall furnish to the Department of Labor & Workforce Development/Division of Occupational Safety within fifteen days after completion of its portion of the work a statement, executed by the contractor, subcontractor or public body who supervises the payment of wages, in the following form:
