These ballots, and provisional ballots, will be counted by hand and added to the official tally which will be certified by the Election Commission on Friday, Sept. 9 at 6:30 p.m. (Click [here](#) for information on provisional ballots.)

Tonight's results show that 26% or 16,100 of the City's 60,985 registered voters cast ballots in today's primary election.
