Violation of the Historic District Ordinance at 218 Walnut Street

Request for Certificate of Appropriateness to Remediate Violation at 218 Walnut Street

The owners started the removal and replacement of a section of the slate roof on the back of the church; this project was not reviewed or approved by the commission.

Dennis Chien and Kaedan Williams presented the application to remediate the violation. They proposed replacement slate that matched the existing slate from that roof area.
