Air Quality Unhealthy in Parts of Newton

Brush fires in Salem and other parts of Massachusetts are causing hazy smoke, including in Newton.

As of 10:07am on Monday, October 28, 2024, the air quality is considered unhealthy in parts of Newton, according to the US Environmental Protection Agency's Air Quality Index Fire and Smoke Map. (Click <u>here</u> to see the map.) People in Newton should take precautions by reducing outdoor time, taking more breaks, and doing less intense activities if outdoors. If you have asthma monitor yourself carefully for symptoms such as coughing, wheezing, or difficulty breathing and have any quick relief asthma medicine readily available.
