As of right now, 45,146 or 72.78% of the City's 62,036 registered voters' ballots were tallied. Four years ago, 47,228 of the City's then 63,452 registered voters' ballots (74%) were counted on election day.

Also, four years ago, Biden and Harris received 40,906 votes in Newton, and Trump and Pence received 8,357 votes.

Today's unofficial vote tally will include all mail-in ballots through today, early in person voting ballots, Newton Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee (UOCAVA) ballots through today, and all votes cast in person today. Ballots mailed from outside the United States will be accepted through Friday, Nov. 15 if postmarked by election day, today, Nov. 5.

Mail-in ballots that were put in the drop boxes at City Hall between 6:00 p.m. this evening and when polls closed at 8:00 p.m. will be tallied and added to the official results. Mail-in ballots postmarked today and arriving at the City Clerk's Office by Friday, Nov. 8 will be hand counted. Overseas UOCAVA ballots can arrive within 10 days of the election, so those will be hand-counted as well. The vote tallies at newtonma.gov/election will be updated as counted. Even as I send this out, election staff is hand counting the 800-plus overseas ballots that have arrived so far. As a result, the tallies will change in the coming hours.

Tonight's results are preliminary. Newton's Election Commission is scheduled to meet to certify the results on Monday, Nov. 18 at 6:30 p.m. Updated, official results will be posted online after they are certified.

Today's election and September's State Primary take a tremendous amount of work. I extend my deep appreciation to City Clerk Carol Moore, Election Supervisor John Doyle, and our Election and IT staff, police officers, poll workers, and volunteers. This team worked not just today, but over the course of many weeks to make sure the ballot applications and mail-in ballots were correctly processed and tabulated, that early in-person and today's polling locations were opened, run effectively and efficiently, and that our elections are in adherence to the law.

As of 10:30 p.m. when we're hitting "send," we don't yet know the outcome of the Presidential election. We're all anxious to find out, and we'll need to tap into our reserves for patience until all the votes are counted.
