

M.G.L. Chapter 40 Section 8J

Section 8J. A city which accepts the provisions of this section by vote of its city council, subject to the provisions of its charter, or a town which accepts the provisions of this section at an annual or special town meeting, may establish a commission on disability, hereinafter called the commission, to cause the full integration and participation of people with disabilities in such city or town. Such commission shall (1) research local problems of people with disabilities; (2) advise and assist municipal officials and employees in ensuring compliance with state and federal laws and regulations that affect people with disabilities; (3) coordinate or carry out programs designed to meet the problems of people with disabilities in coordination with programs of the Massachusetts office on disability; (4) review and make recommendations about policies, procedures, services, activities and facilities of departments, boards and agencies of said city or town as they affect people with disabilities; (5) provide information, referrals, guidance and technical assistance to individuals, public agencies, businesses and organizations in all matters pertaining to disability; (6) coordinate activities of other local groups organized for similar purposes.

Said commission shall keep records of its meetings and actions and shall file an annual report which shall be printed in the city or town annual report and shall have at least ten meetings annually.

Said commission shall consist of not less than five nor more than nine members. In cities, the members shall be appointed by the mayor, subject to the provisions of the city charter except that in cities having a Plan D or Plan E form of government said appointments shall be by the city manager, subject to the provisions of the charter, and in towns they shall be appointed by the selectmen, except towns having a town manager form of government, in which towns appointments shall be made by the town manager, subject to the approval of the selectmen and except towns having a town council form of government, the town manager. A majority of said commission members shall consist of people with disabilities, one member shall be a member of the immediate family of a person with a disability and one member of said commission shall be either an elected or appointed official of that city or town. The terms of the first members of said commission shall be for one, two or three years, and so arranged that the term of one-third of the members expires each year, and their successor shall be appointed for terms of three years each. Any member of said commission may, after a public hearing, if so requested, be removed for cause by the appointing authority. A vacancy occurring otherwise than by expiration of a term shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as an original appointment. The chairperson and other officers shall be chosen by a majority vote of said commission members.

Said commission may receive gifts of property, both real and personal, in the name of the city or town, subject to the approval of the city council in a city or the board of selectmen in a town, such gifts to be managed and controlled by said commission for the purposes of this section.

NEW City of Newton Snow Removal Ordinance in Effect this Winter

- All residents must shovel their sidewalks within 30 hours of a snow storm. Ice must also be cleared from sidewalks, or treated with sand or salt.
- You may seek assistance from the City if you are physically unable to shovel your property and have financial difficulty in paying for snow clearing.

- It's a good idea to make arrangements now if you intend to hire someone to clear your walks.





The City's Responsibility


The City works hard to keep all streets safe during snow storms. Sanders are sent out immediately when it starts to snow and plows are sent out when there is more than 2" of snow on the street. All roads are kept passable during a storm. The City will complete plowing all streets within 8 hours of the end of the storm. Major sidewalk routes and sidewalks abutting City property will be cleared within 24 hours.

Your Responsibility

- If you are away or physically unable clear your sidewalk, please make arrangements to have it cleared by someone else.
- Do not park on the street during a snow emergency so that plows can quickly and thoroughly clear the snow. Cars left on the street may be ticketed and towed.
- It is against the law to shovel snow from your property including your driveway, onto the sidewalks or into the street.
- To avoid re-shoveling, don't clear sidewalks until the road has been cleared and the storm is over.
- Clear nearby catch basins and fire hydrants when possible.

Clearing snow and ice from all paved sidewalks is now the law

- Make path at least 4 feet wide or the width of the sidewalk if it is less than 3 feet
- Do not pile snow from driveway or other area onto the sidewalk or into the street
- Clear corners, curb cuts and handicap access ramps for safe pedestrian travel
- Keep sidewalks clear throughout the winter

Be an Ice Breaker

Keep a supply of ice melt to treat your sidewalks. It is more effective and less expensive to clean up than sand and salt.

Reach Out

- Work with your neighbors to make yours a safe block.
- Help neighbors who are elderly or unable to shovel. Volunteer to help other residents in need. Call 617-796-1500.
- Make certain storm drains, fire hydrants, handicap access ramps, and curbs cuts are kept clear.
- Help the City by letting them know about problems.
- Clear unpaved sidewalks as best as possible.

Snow Shoveling Tips

Whenever possible, it is best to pile snow to the right of the driveway (as you face the street) to reduce potential of having it re-deposited at the driveway opening when the plow passes.



When plowing or shoveling out driveways, wherever possible snow should be kept on the owner's property. It should not be plowed/shoveled onto the street, or across the street onto a neighbor's sidewalk.



To avoid having to do the job twice, shovel the sidewalk after the storm has passed and the street has been cleared.




Keep a supply of ice melter to treat your sidewalks. It is more effective and less expensive to clean up than salt or sand.



NOTICE OF NON-COMPLIANCE

Dear Newton Residential Property Owner or Occupant:

I am writing to inform you that an inspection made by a City employee has confirmed that you have failed to comply with Newton's new snow removal ordinance.

On March 21, 2011 the City adopted a new ordinance requiring removal of snow and ice from sidewalks. Residents are now required to make reasonable efforts to clear and treat the sidewalks in front of their homes within 30 hours after a snowstorm.

Newton is committed to being a walkable city during all seasons. Snow and ice make walking difficult for everyone. For the elderly, children, people with disabilities, mail carriers and many others, wintertime travel can be more than just difficult; it can be dangerous and sometimes impossible. Shoveling is the neighborly thing to do and keeps Newton safe and accessible for everyone.

Please do your part to support safe pedestrian passage in Newton. Please remove the snow and treat the ice on the sidewalk in front of your property. Please clear a path at least 36 inches wide and remove snow and ice from handicap access ramps, as well. If your sidewalk is less than 36 inches wide, please clear a passage encompassing its actual width.

If you are unable, due to a combination of health and financial hardships, to comply with the snow removal ordinance, you may apply for an exemption. Please contact the Customer Service office at City Hall for information: 617-796-1000.

Enclosed is a listing of individuals who are available to shovel snow for a fee. You may wish to contact and hire someone from this list to shovel your sidewalk.

Thank you, in advance, for your attention to this matter and for doing your part to support safe pedestrian travel in Newton.
