ITEMS SCHEDULED FOR DISCUSSION

- #270-07 <u>PATRICK PALMER</u>, 37 Arapahoe Road, West Newton, appointed by His Honor the Mayor as a member of the NEWTON COMMONWEALTH GOLF FOUNDATION for a term to expire on May 18, 2009 (60 days 9-8-06).
- #438-05 <u>ALD. YATES</u> requesting that the maintenance, care, and management of the city's historic burial grounds be transferred from the Parks and Recreation Department to the Newton History Museum.

- #275-06 <u>HIS HONOR THE MAYOR</u> requesting an appropriation in the amount of \$30,000 from the Capital Stabilization Fund for the purpose of replacing the existing electrical cabinet and control panels at the Halloran Sports Complex at Albemarle Field.
- #191-03 <u>ALD. SANGIOLO</u> requesting a discussion with the Information Technology and Clerk of the Board Departments re increasing efforts to source reduce the amount of paper to be duplicated and to disseminate more information via the Internet.

- #267-06(3) <u>ALD. PARKER, BURG, LINSKY, FISCHMAN, HESS-MAHAN, VANCE, HARNEY, JOHNSON, & DANBERG</u> proposing Home Rule Legislation authorizing the City of Newton to apply the ordinance proposed in item #267-06(2) to assets held by the City's retirement system.
- # 35-06 <u>ALD. JOHNSON AND HESS-MAHAN</u> requesting discussion with the School Department and School Committee members regarding the results of the studies addressing compensation for management and executive personnel and organizational structure of central administrative salaries.



#242-03 <u>ALD. JOHNSON, SAMUELSON AND SANGIOLO</u> requesting a discussion to determine times and places where dogs may be off leash on public grounds excluding schoolyards.

JOHNSON AND HESS-MAHAN</u> requesting an amendment to the City Charter to require the Mayor annually to prepare and submit to the Board of Aldermen a long-term financial forecast of anticipated revenue, expenditures and the general financial condition of the City, including, but not limited to identification of any factors which will affect the financial condition of the City; projected revenue and expenditure trends; potential sources of new or expanded revenues; anticipated municipal needs likely to require major expenditures; and a strategic plan for meeting anticipated municipal needs, to include, but not be limited to, any long or short-term actions that may be taken to enhance the financial condition of the City.
- #171-04 <u>ALD. HESS-MAHAN</u> requesting home rule legislation authorizing local voting rights for permanent resident aliens residing in Newton. Item recommitted by Full Board on February 7, 2005
- #437-05 <u>ALLAN CICCONE</u>, 22 West Street, Newton, requesting the Board of Aldermen file a home rule petition amending the Charter re filling vacancies on the Board of Aldermen and School Committee so if an alderman or school committee member resigns or dies while in office, the runner up to that person in the last election would fill that vacancy. If there is no runner up for this person the Mayor, with the approval of the Board of Aldermen, would appoint a citizen in that district to fill that vacancy.
