156-18 Draft for Discussion 1/18/2019

Revise the provisions of Sec. 26-8D and Sec. 17-23 as follows:

Sec. 26-8D. Removal of snow and ice from sidewalks

In order to allow for safe pedestrian and wheelchair passage, every owner or occupant of a building or lot of land abutting upon a paved sidewalk or any person having charge of such property shall use reasonable efforts to remove snow and ice from the sidewalk and handicap access ramps, and shall use reasonable efforts to treat said sidewalk and ramps to allow for a safe passageway of approximately thirty-six (36) inches in width, provided that where such sidewalk is less than thirty-six (36) inches in width the passageway shall encompass its entire width and handicap access ramps. Snow and ice shall be removed, and sidewalks and ramps shall be treated, within thirty-twenty-four (3024) hours after such snow has ceased to fall or such ice has formed. This section shall apply to snow and ice which falls from buildings, other structures, trees or bushes, as well as to that which falls from clouds. This section shall not apply to owners or occupants of a building or lot covered by Section 26-8. The mayor or his designee is authorized to coordinate volunteer snow clearing assistance or to grant an exemption, renewable annually, for citizens who upon written petition demonstrate hardship due to a combination of health and financial duress. Enforcement shall be limited to issuance of notices of non-compliance for violations of any provision of this section. (Z-83, 3-21-11)

Add Sec. 26-8D to the provisions of Sec. 17-23 (f)

Sec. 17-23. Enforcing persons and revised ordinances subject to civil fine.

(f) DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS: The commissioner of public works and/or his or her designee shall be authorized to issue written notice of the following violations:

Thank you for considering appropriating additional funds for snow removal. I wanted to provide an update on our snow expenses to date:

- We have had one storm this year that produced 7 inches of snow accumulation and required us to call plowing contractors
- We have had seven salting events that have required city staff to work overtime hours in order to maintain safe roadways
- We have spent an increased amount of funding on Vehicle Maintenance in order to remove a large backlog of repairs to snow equipment and vehicles.

Chapter 10.000

Sec. 29-77. Control manholes, etc.

The owner of any property serviced by a building sewer carrying industrial wastes shall within a reasonable time, but in no event to exceed six (6) months, install a suitable control manhole or other structure together with such necessary meters and other appurtenances in the building sewer to facilitate observation, sampling, and measurement of the wastes. Such manhole or other structure shall be accessibly and safely located. Construction shall not begin on such manhole or other structure until the plans for the same are approved by the commissioner, who shall grant such approval if the plans appear adequate, under accepted engineering practices, to accomplish the purposes and requirements of this section. The manhole or other structure shall be installed by the owner at his expense and shall be maintained by him so as to be safe and accessible at all times. (Ord. No. R-153, 6-17-81)

Sec. 29-78. Information to be given to commissioner upon request.

The commissioner may require any person discharging industrial wastes to provide information needed to determine compliance with this ordinance. These requirements may include but are not limited to:

- (1) Sewage discharge peak rate and volume over a specified time period.
- (2) Chemical analyses of sewage conducted by an approved wastewater testing laboratory.
- (3) Information on raw materials, processes and products affecting sewage volume and quality.
- (4) Quantity and disposition of specific liquid, sludge, oil, solvent or other materials important to sewer use control.
- (5) A plot plan of sewers of the user's property showing sewer and pretreatment facility location.
- (6) Details of sewage pretreatment facilities.

(7) Details of systems to prevent and control the losses of materials through spills to the municipal sewer. (Ord. No. R-153, 6-17-81)

Sec. 29-79. Standards for waste analysis.

All measurements, tests, and analyses of the characteristics of waters and wastes to which reference is made in this chapter shall be conducted in accordance with the latest edition of "Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater," published by the American Public Health Association, and shall be conducted at the control manhole or other structure provided, or upon suitable samples taken at said structure. In the event that no special manhole or other structure has been required, the control manhole shall be a sampling point, determined by the commissioner or, should none be established, shall be the nearest downstream manhole in the public sewer to the point at which the building sewer is connected. Sampling shall be carried out by customarily accepted methods to determine the effect of constituents upon the sewage works and to determine the existence of hazards to life, limb and property and to determine the existence of damage or impairment to the operation of the sewerage works. (Ord. No. R-153, 6-17-81)

Sec. 29-80. Sewer use charge.

(a) Estates whose building sewers discharge directly or indirectly into public sewers of the city, shall pay a charge for the use of sewage works in proportion to water consumption except that a charge for the use sewage works shall not be made for water consumption registered on or attributable to outdoor meters installed at residential properties in accordance with section 29-24 of this chapter. Notwithstanding the foregoing, seasonal water takers not eligible for an outdoor mater under said section 29-24, shall pay a charge for the use of sewage works in proportion to water consumption.

(1) Sewer rates

A charge for the use of sewer, which charge shall be made in proportion to water consumption, based on the water meter reading, or estimated water meter reading, excluding outdoor meters for the same
