Executive Summary:

As part of the Special Permit approval, the applicant is now requesting a Grant of Location for a sanitary sewer forced main that will provide a sanitary service connection for the Self-Storage Facility. Since the project site is at a lower elevation than the existing sanitary sewer at the intersection of Rumford Avenue & Lexington Street, this service connection must be pumped up to the City sewer main.

The forced main is 1-1/2" PE pipe and extends from the site approximately 468-feet towards the east to an existing manhole, this pipe will only serve the 143 Rumford Avenue site.

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The engineer of record needs to submit a profile of the forced main to ensure adequate cover over the pipe and to prevent freezing of the pipe (this can be accomplished via a Utility Connection Permit). Based on the shallow depth the force main, portions may have to be encased with concrete. The proposed force main will be privately owned and maintained.

Conditions & Special Provisions:

- 1. Finalized utility connection plan reflecting the above changes that meets the minimal design standards of the City of Newton must be submitted for approval by the contractor of record with appropriate Bonds & Insurance. The Engineering Division makes no representations and assumes no responsibility for the design(s) in terms of suitability for the particular site conditions or of the functionability or performance of any items constructed in accordance with the design(s). The City of Newton assumes no liabilities for design assumption, error or omissions by the Engineer of Record.
- 2. If a sump pump is connected to this overflow connection and the buildings are heated via an oil heat system, a MDC oil separator will be required prior to the final overflow connection.
- 3. The limits of the roadway shall be milled 1-1/2" deep and overlaid with Type I-1 HMA curb line to curb line and 25' beyond the limits of the trench in both directions. The limits will be determined in the field by the City Engineer.
- 4. The backfilling of the sewer main and services connection shall be with Control Density Fill (CDF) Type I-E Excavatable type, for the entire alignment.
- 5. The force main shall be secured the walls of the manhole every 12" on center with stainless steel Hilti anchors. The end of the force main shall discharge with a direction bend at the top of the crown of the invert of the trough.
- 6. The on-site septic system shall be abandoned in accordance to Tile V and the Newton Health Department requirements. Inspections for the abandonment shall be coordinated with the Health Department.
- 7. If any service connections are disturbed by the contractor of record during construction, they shall be updated and replaced to the City's current Construction Standards.
- 8. All downstream catch basins shall be retrofitted with an approved type of siltation control devices, details of this shall be submitted to the City Engineer. The contractor of record shall maintain these catch basins throughout the construction process, and ensure that street and property flooding does not occur during construction.

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- 9. The contractor of record shall contact the Newton Police Department and arrange for Police Detail to help residents navigate around the construction equipment and since the street has underground nature gas main, the Police Officer can contact emergency response personnel.
- 10. The proposed main, manholes, and service connections shall be pressure tested in accordance to the City's Construction Standards. A representative of the Engineering Division shall witness the testing, 48-hours prior notification shall be given to the inspection.
- 11. All new sewer manholes shall be vacuum tested in accordance to the City's Construction Standards & Specifications. The sewer service will NOT be accepted until one of the two methods stated above is completed. All testing MUST be witnessed by a representative of the Engineering Division. A Certificate of Occupancy will not be recommended until this test is completed and a written report is received by the City Engineer.
- 12. The applicant's contractor shall apply for a Utility Connection and Street Permit with the DPW prior to any construction.
- 13. The contractor of record shall obtain a Trench, Street Opening, Sidewalk Crossing, and Utility Connection Permits with the DPW prior to construction.
- 14. The contractor of record shall obtain appropriate Permits with the Inspectional Services Department for all electrical, telecommunications construction.
- 15. Upon final installation & inspections of the various underground construction; an As Built drawing [plan & profile] indicating manhole, hand-hole, and all conduit installation shall be submitted in digital and hard copy (Mylar) format to the City Engineer.
- 16. No work in public streets shall occur between November 15th and April 15th unless the DPW Commissioner allows the work to commence.

#397-17 Draft for Discussion 12/1/2017

Revise the provisions of Sec. 26-8D as follows:

Sec. 26-8D. Trial program for rRemoval of snow and ice from sidewalks.

In order to allow for safe pedestrian and wheelchair passage, every owner or occupant of a building or lot of land abutting upon a paved sidewalk or any person having charge of such property shall use reasonable efforts to remove snow and ice from the sidewalk and handicap access ramps, and shall use reasonable efforts to treat said sidewalk and ramps to allow for a safe passageway of approximately thirty-six (36) inches in width, provided that where such sidewalk is less than thirty-six (36) inches in width the passageway shall encompass its entire width and handicap access ramps. Snow and ice shall be removed, and sidewalks and ramps shall be treated, within thirty (30) hours after such snow has ceased to fall or such ice has formed. This section shall apply to snow and ice which falls from buildings, other structures, trees or bushes, as well as to that which falls from clouds. This section shall not apply to owners or occupants of a building or lot covered by Section 26-8. The mayor or his designee is authorized to coordinate volunteer snow clearing assistance or to grant an exemption, renewable annually, for citizens who upon written petition demonstrate hardship due to a combination of health and financial duress. The provisions of this section shall take effect on November 1, 2011 and shall expire on November 1, 2013 unless terminated earlier or renewed or modified by the board of aldermen. During this trial period, eEnforcement shall be limited to issuance of notices of noncompliance for violations of any provision of this section. (Z-83, 3-21-11)

Nadia,

If a property doesn't have a "building sewer" which is the service line connecting the property to the public sewer, then that property doesn't pay sewer charges.

However, there are properties that don't have a "building sewer" such as the Lakewood Tennis Club, and use water outside on a seasonal basis. Such properties are not eligible for an outdoor meter because they are not residential.

As presently written, Sec. 29-80 could be read as exempting non-residential properties without a "building sewer" that are ineligible for an outdoor meter, from paying sewer charges. Such an exemption is inconsistent with the city's established billing practices.

The proposed language makes it clear that a property that doesn't have a "building sewer" and is not eligible for an outdoor meter, must pay sewer charges for outdoor water usage.

The proposed language was drafted to make the language of Sec. 29-80 consistent with the city's established billing practices.
