Executive Summary:

Hunnewell Circle is a public way with all underground utilities except electric & telephone, which are provided via backyard easement. The applicant is requesting a grant to place underground conduit, a manhole, and lateral connection to all the homes within the right of way.

Conditions & Special Provisions for the Street Opening Permit:

- 1. Finalized utility connection plan reflecting the above changes that meets the minimal design standards of the City of Newton must be submitted for approval by the contractor of record with appropriate Bonds & Insurance. The Engineering Division makes no representations and assumes no responsibility for the design(s) in terms of suitability for the particular site conditions or of the functionability or performance of any items constructed in accordance with the design(s). The City of Newton assumes no liabilities for design assumption, error or omissions by the Engineer of Record.
- 2. All trenches shall be backfilled with Control Density Fill (CDF) Excavatable Type I-E. Upon completion of all construction the road way should be milled 1-1/2" and paved curb line to curb line with Type I-1 bituminous concrete.
- 3. All downstream catch basins shall be retrofitted with an approved type of siltation control devices, details of this shall be submitted to the City Engineer. The contractor of record shall maintain these catch basins throughout the construction process, and ensure that street and property flooding does not occur during construction.
- 4. The contractor of record shall contact the Newton Police Department and arrange for Police Detail to help residents navigate around the construction equipment and since the street has underground nature gas main, the Police Officer can contact emergency response personnel.
- 5. Upon final installation an As Built drawing [plan & profile] indicating rim, invert elevations, and slopes shall be submitted in digital and hard copy (Mylar) format to the City Engineer.
- 6. The contractor of record shall obtain a Trench, Street Opening, Sidewalk Crossing, and Utility Connection Permits with the DPW prior to construction.
- 7. The contractor of record shall obtain appropriate Permits with the Inspectional Services Department for all electrical, telecommunications construction.

The Department of Public Works has received a petition from Chestnut Hill Realty per Condition #35 of Special Permit #102-06 (12), to implement specific geometric and safety improvements at the referenced intersection. The petitioner's traffic consultant, MDM Transportation Consultants, Inc., has completed the 75% design which is detailed on engineered plans titled, "Traffic & Safety Improvements for Lagrange Street/Vine Street/Corey Street, MDM Transportation Consultants, Inc., September 3, 2015".

In September of 2014, Mr. William G. Paille, P.E., Director of Transportation, DPW, first met with representatives from MDM Transportation Consultants to review the conceptual design for specific geometric and traffic management improvements at the referenced intersection located within the City of Newton. Subsequent to this initial meeting, Transportation Division staff performed a preliminary review of the Traffic Impact Assessment prepared by MDM, dated July 23, 2014 and concluded that in general, the impact of this development (i.e. projected traffic volumes) to traffic flow along Lagrange Street was negligible and as a result, no changes to traffic operations would be required. However, staff also concluded that future traffic along Lagrange will remain unimpeded at the intersection with Vine/Corey, thus making it difficult for drivers to enter/exit this intersection safely.

The conceptual design was subsequently advanced to a preliminary design and presented to the public during a neighborhood meeting last September. Mr. Paille recently met with MDM Transportation Consultants to review the final design and determined the proposed improvements will facilitate the flow of traffic that is safe and efficient for all approaches.

Please docket this project with the City Clerk for Board of Aldermen consideration.

- c. The Petitioner shall receive a credit for the initial deposit and shall pay the balance, if any, within 30 days of the date the City accepts calculation of the amount of the second payment. The Petitioner shall not be entitled to receive any refund of the first payment in the event that the calculation of the amount of the second payment shows that the Petitioner has overpaid its I&I contribution.
- d. The second payment will be due after the Project reaches 95% occupancy or within 2 years following the Project's final Certificate of Occupancy, whichever comes first. Once the Project is at 95% occupancy, the Petitioner shall notify the City Engineer and promptly undertake measurement of the Actual Water Flow. If the Project does not achieve 95% occupancy before two years from the final Certificate of Occupancy, the Petitioner shall notify the City Engineer and undertake measurement of the Actual Water Flow and the second payment will be prorated to reflect 95% occupancy. The Petitioner agrees to embody these commitments in a contractual agreement with the City to be entered into at the time of the first payment, which agreement shall allow the Petitioner to pay its L&I payment at a ratio governed by the City policy then in effect at the time either of the payments is due, but in no event in an amount greater than provided for at an 8:1 ratio as set forth in this Condition.
- 31. The Petitioner shall have filed a request and been granted approval for the sanitary sewer connection in LaGrange Street by the Board of Aldermen, prior to commencing any work on the connection. The final plans and details for the sanitary sewer connection shall be filed for review and approval by the City Engineer and Director of Utilities, and the first payment by the Petitioner contributing to the City's Inflow & Infiltration Reduction Program shall be made prior to issuance of a Utility Connection Permit. The installation of the sanitary sewer main shall have been completed and inspected and flow test shall be acceptable to the City Engineer and Director of Utilities prior to the issuance of any Certificates of Occupancy.



plans, the Petitioner will install the permitted pedestrian and intersection improvements. If change(s) in permitted improvements plus the cost of the design plans result in the cost of the improvements exceeding \$340,000.00, the Petitioner's voluntary contribution towards the costs of these improvements shall be limited to donating \$340,000.00 less any design costs incurred during the permitting process to the City in accordance with G.L. c. 44, sec. 53. Such donation shall only be utilized by the City for improvements to the locations shown on the above-referenced plans as approved by the City through the permitting process.

It is the intent of the Petitioner and the City to seek timely approval of the intersection and pedestrian improvements, with the expectation that the permitting process can be commenced prior to issuance of a building permit and the installation of the improvements commenced prior to issuance of a final certificate of occupancy, provided, however, that the Petitioner's building permit and/or final certificate of occupancy shall not be withheld in the event that the permitting process or installation is delayed. If the cost of the permitted improvements is determined to exceed \$340,000.00, the Petitioner shall donate the \$340,000.00 less any design cost to the City within 30 days of the date the City Engineer agrees that installation of the permitted improvements will exceed \$340,000.00.

- 36. No SITE WORK shall be permitted pursuant to this SPECIAL PERMIT/SITE PLAN APPROVAL until:
 - a. The Petitioner shall have submitted a plan for pre- and post-construction evaluation of the groundwater conditions for review and approval by the City Engineer in accordance with Condition #10 and shall have commenced with the pre-construction evaluation in accordance with such approved plan.
 - b. The Petitioner shall have submitted details on all proposed retaining walls including materials, stamped by a structural engineer, as required, for review and approval by the City Engineer, Commissioner of Inspectional Services, and Director of Planning and Development, in accordance with Condition #15.
 - c. The Petitioner shall have established a Neighborhood Liaison Committee, and the first meeting shall have been held in accordance with Condition #16.

NOTE: Ald. Lennon, Ald. Leary, Lt. Boudreau and Sgt. Babcock joined the Committee for discussion on this item.

Sgt. Babcock provided Committee members with a spreadsheet tracking the number of tickets issued from November 15, 2014 to February 3, 2015 in Ward One, by precincts, attached to this report. During this time, he noted that there have been 3700 tickets issued Citywide, including 965 in Ward One. On the spreadsheet, the 'see above' notation indicates the location the officer issued the ticket. The computer analysis uses the same language (location) the officer provided. Sgt. Babcock then said that the permit parking program does not override the overnight parking ban Citywide.

Chair Ciccone stated that this item was originally docketed because there are some residences within the City that do not have parking on-site creating a hardship for residents who need a place to park their vehicles. Since the Board of Aldermen approved raising the overnight parking fine from \$5.00 to \$25.00 effective on November 1, 2014, he has received very few complaints from residents and very few expressions of need for parking and suggested voting no action necessary on this item.

Ald. Lennon agreed with Chair Ciccone. He asked Sgt. Babcock to explain the breakdown of the spreadsheet. He asked if the number of tickets issued were issued to the same driver perhaps due to a hardship or lack of parking. Sgt. Babcock answered that he could not differentiate, as he did not have data if tickets were issued to the same driver. When tickets are issued only the street name is on the ticket, they do not have a specific address. He would have to request the vendor to break down the tickets issued by the license plate number. Ald. Lennon then suggested the exploration of using City owned municipal parking lots, realizing this does not include school properties.

Ald. Leary noted that Waban Park and Walnut Park have a very high number of tickets issued, it is concerning because these residents have off-street parking. She would like to have a discussion with the Commissioner of Parks & Recreation Department requesting that residents with hardships be accommodated with parking; perhaps including school properties.

Committee members asked if municipal parking lots are at full capacity? Sgt. Babcock answered that the department issues permits to the number of available spaces. He said that the Chapel Street parking lot is full. Adams Street, Newton Centre, Richardson Street and Pelham Street parking lots have available parking.

Ald. Johnson suggested docketing a discussion item with the Commissioner of Parks & Recreation, Commissioner of Department of Public Works and the School Department to determine and discuss parking options including use of school properties based on the current municipal parking lot programs including the issuance of permits.

Ald. Lennon said that he is working with Information Technology Department on maps delineating City owned properties within 500 feet from residences and the closest location available for them to park.

Lt. Boudreau said the department experienced problems in the past when residents were allowed to park behind the Horace Mann School because they would not remove their vehicle when informed.

Without further discussion, Ald. Johnson made the motion to vote no action necessary with the understanding an item will be docketed as suggested. Committee members agreed 7-0, Ald. Fuller not voting.
