Executive Summary:

On June 4th, the Board of Survey approved a two- lot residential subdivision off the end of Princess Road with a condition that the water main extension within the private way portion of Princess Road be extended to Waltham Street. This extension would create a looped system and a benefit for the neighborhood by providing improved pressure and water quality. The water main extension will be approximately 265-feet in the easterly direction.

In addition, the sanitary sewer main needs to be extended 15-feet easterly to provide service connections for the two proposed homes.

The applicants are funding 100% of the construction cost and have submitted a 40' wide permanent Utility Easement Plan granting the City perpetual rights to maintain, repair, and relay the utilities. This easement document and plan shall be review by the Law Department and then shall be recorded at the Middlesex Registry of Deeds prior to the

acceptance of the sanitary sewer & water mains. Documentation of the Recording Instrument shall be submitted to the City Engineer.

Conditions & Special Provisions:

- 1. All trenches within the public portion of Princess Road shall be milled 1-1/2" deep and overlaid with Type I-1 HMA curb line to curb line and 25' beyond the limits of the trench in both directions. The limits will be determined in the field by the City Engineer.
- 2. The backfilling of the sewer & water mains within the public portion of Princess Road & Waltham Street shall be with Control Density Fill (CDF) Type I-E Excavatable type.
- 3. If any service connections are disturbed by the contractor of record during construction, they shall be updated and replaced to the City's current Construction Standards
- 4. All downstream catch basins shall be retrofitted with an approved type of siltation control devices, details of this shall be submitted to the City Engineer. The contractor of record shall maintain these catch basins throughout the construction process, and ensure that street and property flooding does not occur during construction.
- 5. Upon final installation & testing of the sewer system and water main; an As Built drawing [plan & profile] indicating rim, invert elevations, and slopes shall be submitted in digital and hard copy format to the City Engineer.
- 6. The proposed water & sewer main(s), manholes, and service connections shall be pressure tested in accordance to the City's Construction Standards. A representative of the Engineering Division shall witness the testing, 48-hours prior notification shall be given prior to the inspection.
- 7. The test results shall be submitted in type written report format to the City Engineer.
- 8. The applicant's contractor shall apply for and a Street Permit with the DPW prior to any construction.
- 9. The contractor of record shall obtain a Utility Connection, Street Opening, and Sidewalk Crossing Permits with the DPW prior to construction.

- 10. The contractor of record shall obtain appropriate Permits with the Inspectional Services Department for all electrical, telecommunications construction.
- 11. The contractor of record shall contact the Newton Police Department and arrange for Police Detail to help residents navigate around the construction activity when working within any public street.



In conjunction with the Chestnut Hill Development Project, the City has been awarded a Mass Works Infrastructure Program grant, for \$1,850,000. This is a reimbursable type grant similar to Chapter 90.

Our engineering designer, Vanasse and Associates (VAI), has completed the final design of the improvements and is now preparing bid documents. We will then public bid the work and execute a contract with a contractor.

The infrastructure improvements consist of traffic signal upgrades and roadway safety improvements at certain areas near the Chestnut Hill Development project, including Boylston Street at Parker and Clark Streets, Boylston Street at Elliot and Woodward Streets, Florence Street and Centre Street at Beacon and Cypress Streets.

Improvements at Centre Street at Beacon Street and Cypress Street (see attached drawing) include:

Install 10 ft wide raised crosswalk with transition ramps at the right turn lane from Centre

Street northbound to Beacon Street

Geometric improvements to both intersections

Install additional crosswalks and HP ramps

Milling and paving

Upgrade pavement markings and signs

The proposed raised crosswalk and geometric changes in Newton Centre require Board of Aldermen approval prior to construction. Please docket this matter with the City Clerk for Public Facilities Committee consideration.

ACTION: APPROVE (4-0) Blue Zone on Cypress Street; Approve a sign to be posted near the school "driveway" that would indicate the following: Do Not Enter 7:45-9:00AM, 12:15-3:15PM, School Days - Authorized Vehicles Only. This item may be appealed through June 15.

<u>ACTION:</u> NO ACTION NECESSARY (4-0) Traffic Council supports installing a raised device on Cypress Street just south of Bow Road. Traffic Council recommends that a Ward 6 Alderman docket this item for discussion at the Public Facilities Committee and approval by the Board.

NOTE: TC21-11, TC20-11 and TC22-11 were discussed together.

Mr. Koses stated these items were a follow-up of item TC42-10 that Traffic Council approved on February 17, 2011.

Mr. Schuckel said that since Traffic Council's approval, the following requests have been made: Address pedestrian who cross at Bow Road, add a raised device to Cypress Street to reduce speeds and restrict access to the driveway during drop-off times. He proposed the following additions. Restrict turns into the driveway during morning drop-off times, add a Blue Zone along the eastern curb of Cypress Street, change proposed flush crosswalk to a raised crosswalk and add a speed hump. He said that the Blue Zone would be available for part-time school employee parking. Raised devices will not increase emergency vehicle response time to the school. A crosswalk near Bow Road is not feasible due to minimum stopping sight distance at a curve. A single car parked on Cypress Street would potentially obstruct the view of pedestrians in the crosswalk. Mr. Schuckel asked if the access to the "driveway" was intended for teacher and/or buses. Mr. Koses said he understood the access to be for both. Diane Guzzi, Principal, Bowen School agreed.

Mr. Koses opened the discussion for public comment. Ald. Blazar agreed with proposals presented. He asked Principal Guzzi if she thought Cypress Street was a safe location to dropoff students. She answered yes, because teacher parking limits the number of vehicles entering the driveway making it safer for pedestrians. Ald. Danberg concurred. Adam Peller, 28 Daniels Street, agreed. He asked how handicap parking spaces would be implemented. Ms. Guzzi answered there would be two handicap parking spaces. Sean Roche, 32 Daniels Street, agreed. He suggested implementing a handicap parking space on the south side of the driveway. He asked if a chicane would benefit Cypress Street to deter speeding. A resident asked what the speed hump would look like. Mr. Schuckel briefly described the benefits of a speed hump and the City Ordinance requirements. Mr. Koses said that the raised crosswalk would be paid entirely through MassDOT's Safe Routes to School Infrastructure Program.

Principal Guzzi suggested that a "Do Not Enter 7:45-9:00AM and 12:15-3:15PM, School Days -Authorized Vehicles Only" sign be installed at the driveway entrance. Sgt. Norcross informed Ms. Guzzi it would be difficult to enforce these restrictions.

AMENDED REQUEST: Cabot Elementary School and Newton Free Library

Dear Mayor Warren:

The Public Buildings Department requests the amended sum of \$500,000 from bonded indebtedness for Phase 1 of a \$1,500,000 FY13 multi-phase project for Energy Efficiency Upgrades at various buildings. This Phase I appropriation will address upgrades at Cabot Elementary School and Newton Free Library.

Project Description: In collaboration with NSTAR and its Preferred Vendor Program, the Buildings Department will complete energy efficiency upgrades across multiple municipal buildings. Each Project will have a blended eight (8) to ten (10) year payback where the energy savings will pay for the project over the term of the bond. Each project will stand on its own and will be cost neutral over the term of the bond. There will be four exceptions to the 8-10 year payback; at Cabot, Ward, Pierce, and Zervas Elementary Schools the blended payback will be achieved significantly quicker.

Project Justification: Each project completed through this program will address three very important deficiencies prevalent across Newton buildings: (1) energy efficiency, (2) occupant comfort, and (3) a backlog of deferred maintenance. The scope of work at each building will include a comprehensives energy audit that will clearly identify work to be completed. The most common types of energy conservation measures (ECMs) that will be considered are:

- 1. Lighting and Lighting Controls Install high efficiency lamps and controls to reduce consumption.
- 2. Water Conservation Upgrade water fixtures with low flow devices.
- 3. Steam Trap Replacement Improve steam heating system efficiency and function.
- 4. Thermostatic Radiator Valves & Programmable Thermostats Allow localized space temp. control.
- 5. Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning Evaluate systems and upgrade as appropriate.
- 6. Energy Management System Allow for more accurate and efficient control of buildings' systems.
- 7. Improved Operations and Maintenance protocols to improve efficiency and extend equipment life.
- 8. Review additional alternative energy opportunities.

Project Budget:

Total Project Cost	\$ 1,500,000

Amended Request:

The current request for Phase 1 Energy Upgrades at Cabot ES and Newton Free Library is for \$500,000.



The Public Buildings Department requests the sum of \$300,000 from bonded indebtedness for Phase I of a \$1,500,000 multi-phase project for the purpose of funding design and construction of Energy Efficiency Upgrades at Cabot Elementary School. Future FY13 phases will address similar energy efficiency upgrades at Underwood ES, Franklin ES, City Hall, Main Library, and the Education Center, as outline below:

Project Description: Using NSTAR's Preferred Vendor Program, the Building Department will complete energy efficiency upgrades across multiple buildings. Each project will have a goal of a blended eight (8) year payback where the energy savings will pay for the project over the term of the bond. An exception to this is Cabot School which is planned for major renovations as early as 2016 so only energy efficiency measures with a payback of five (5) years or less will be chosen.

Project Justification: Each project completed through this program will address two very important deficiencies prevalent in many Newton buildings: (1) increased energy efficiency and (2) improved environmental comfort that then positively impacts behavioral modification. In addition, the added benefit is these same retrofits will reduce the backlog of deferred maintenance for these energy systems. The scope of work at each building will include a comprehensive energy audit that will clearly identify work to be completed. The types of energy conservation measures that will be considered are:

- 1. Lighting and lighting controls install highly efficient lamps and controls to reduce run-time.
- 2. Water conservation include replacement of water fixtures with low flow devices.
- 3. Steam Trap Replacement allow for a more efficient steam heating system function.
- 4. Thermostatic radiator control valves and programmable thermostats allow for local space temperature control.
- 5. Weatherization and Insulation includes pipes, attics, windows, doors, etc.
- 6. Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning system evaluation and upgrade as needed.
- 7. Energy Management System allows for more accurate/efficient control of buildings' systems.
- 8. Improved O & M protocols to improve efficiency and extend equipment life.
- 9. Review additional alternative energy opportunities.

Summary:

City of Newton is a Green Community and has committed to reducing its energy consumption by 20% over a five year period. In addition, the City has deferred preventative maintenance of its buildings over many years, creating a backlog of maintenance requirements. Over the years this has led to a portfolio of buildings that requires significant and immediate investment. The juxtaposition of the energy reduction commitment and the backlog of maintenance create an opportunity to use the utility based **Preferred Vendor Program** to begin to address both. Buildings such as Cabot, which underperforms 96% of school buildings in the US as measured by its Energy Use Intensity (EUI - kBtu/sq. ft.), are key buildings to address immediately. The City can reduce its energy consumption and update its buildings' infrastructure by proceeding with utility based Preferred Vendor Program to implement Energy Conservation Measures (ECMs) across various municipal buildings.

Implementation Plan:

All projects will aim to meet a blended simple payback of 10 years or less with a goal for most projects not to exceed 8 years. It is imperative that a blended approach be used and that the projects not take advantage of the quick payback items only. Using a longer blended payback to complete these projects will allow the City to concurrently address deferred maintenance items that may, by themselves, have a significantly longer payback.

The Public Buildings Department recommends moving forward with preferred vendor projects by systematically and continuously addressing the largest buildings in the City. The following buildings were selected because they are above 30,000 sq. ft. and are the biggest energy consumers in the city. Together, these 22 buildings comprise approximately 60% of ALL energy consumption in the City. They are prioritized by the highest annual cost per square foot cost or EUI:

The NSTAR program also offers an opportunity to complete advanced commissioning work on buildings in addition to the ones listed above.

The Preferred Vendor projects will proceed at a rate of 1-2 buildings per quarter and will generally be cost neutral. The savings will cover most if not the entire debt service. In instances where the savings are somewhat smaller than the annual debt service creating a negative cash flow in the first years of repayment, we recommend bridging the gap with funds from the existing Energy Stabilization Fund (ESF). Once the net cash flow is positive, we recommend that all net savings remaining after the debt service is paid be returned to the Energy Stabilization Fund. In addition all utility incentives should be deposited in the ESF to be reinvested into future energy conservation projects.

In the case of the Cabot School, the blended payback would be approximately 5 years. This shorter payback approach would be required since the school is scheduled for a major renovation in approximately 6 years.

Specific Project Example - Cabot:

In February of 2012, the Public Buildings Department completed an audit of the Cabot School. The report was completed by an NSTAR Preferred Vendor, RISE Engineering, who recommended the following actions:

- Steam Trap Survey (No Cost)
- Steam Trap Repairs
- Boiler Water Treatment
- Energy Management System (reduced scope)
- Attic Air Sealing & Insulation
- New Efficient Lighting & Occupancy Sensors

These measures will immediately improve the conditions at the school by providing quality lighting and lighting controls, significantly better space temperature control, significant level of insulation, and controlled fresh make-up air to occupied spaces. These improvements will result in a significant reduction in energy consumption and will make this project cash flow positive over the term of the bond payments. With approximately a net 5 year payback, these enhancements will provide improved conditions for students and teachers with no additional burden to the operational budget.

The tables on the following page describe the Cabot project in detail. Cabot is scheduled to be renovated in the coming years, therefore we asked the Vendor to reduce the scope. The table below is an estimate of what the final cost will be.

Explanation of Energy Conservation Measures (ECMs) recommended for the Cabot School:

Steam Trap Survey – This service is provided to the City at no cost. It allows the City and the vendor to have a clear understanding of the existing condition of the buildings steam heating distribution system

Steam Trap Repairs – Steam traps are mechanical devices that allow for the efficient function of the steam distribution system. Broken traps contribute to poor control of local temperature and higher consumption of energy. Replacing these will significantly improve occupant comfort level and reduce energy consumption at the building.

Boiler Water Treatment – Steam systems operate at high temperatures where untreated water that contains various minerals and whose pH (acidity) is not neutral can damage equipment at a high rate and significantly reduce equipment life. Treating water will extend the life of the equipment and contribute to lower energy consumption

Energy Management System (EMS) – This is a centralized, computer based system that allows control of various building sub-systems including mechanical and lighting. At the Cabot school this will be a minimal system that will provide minimal control and monitoring capabilities.

Attic Air Sealing and Insulation – Currently, the attic space (~15,000 square feet) is completely devoid of any insulation. Temperatures in this <u>unoccupied</u> space are 65 degrees in the middle of winter. Insulating the attic floor will significantly reduce energy consumption during the winter months.

New Efficient Lighting and Occupancy Sensors – Existing lighting fixtures are outdated and often not functioning. Installing modern fixtures and occupancy sensors will provide better lighting levels for the students and reduce energy consumption. The new fixtures will be more efficient and the occupancy sensors will assure that the lights are off when the rooms are unoccupied.

Future Projects:

Each future project would evaluate a building for energy saving opportunities. These would include energy conservation measures such as:

- Lighting and Lighting Controls
- High efficiency Electric Motors
- Energy Management Systems and controls (including DDC conversions and pneumatic repairs)
- Domestic Water and Sewer Conservation
- Process Water Conservation (water treatment)
- Steam Heating Repairs
- Variable Frequency Drives for fans & pumps
- Building envelope Improvements (insulation)
- Vending machine and plug load controllers
- Windows and doors: replacements and/or weather-stripping, Low-E film

- HVAC improvements/upgrades: boilers, cooling towers, chillers, ventilation systems, humidification or dehumidification systems, heat recovery
- Retro-Commissioning
- Roof improvements
- Real Time Metering
- Miscellaneous Specialty Equipment

Craft Street Garage Roof and Building Envelope Repairs

The Craft Street Garage was renovated 25 years ago, and there are two areas of concern today. The roof is now beyond useful life, and leaks in many locations. Many patches have been made over the years, but the condition of the PVC is such that patches are becoming very challenging, and less effective.

There is also a masonry issue at the Welding Shop. A large crack can be seen where the shop meets the main building. It appears that this is caused by settling of this portion of the building, as evident by a 3 inch drop of Welding Shop structure. The exact cause and condition are unknown and require a structural evaluation.

There are a couple of areas of concern related to this issue. It needs to be determined if the entire Welding Shop has settled, and more importantly, if it is done settling. If the settling is done, then the masonry repairs may be minor. If there is still movement, then appropriate steps need to be taken to correct this issue. The PVC roof above the Welding Shop is visibly being pulled away, so it must be replaced, but only after the structural issues are corrected.

In the end, this project will correct the structural and masonry issues at the Welding Shop, and will design the roof replacement. The remaining funds will be bundled with the proposed FY14 request to complete the roof replacement. This project is spread out over two years due to the fact that the masonry and structural repairs to the Welding Shop must be made prior to replacing the roof.
