Dear Commissioner Rooney:

This is to request that a sewer main extension be constructed to serve our property.

Our house is one of four contiguous homes that use private sanitary systems for the disposal of sewage. All the systems are Cesspool type and all four abut the Charles River. We know that the new Title V regulation requires us to comply with the law if we were to sell our home. The new law affects us in two ways, functional performance of the system and proximity of the system to the Charles River Wetlands. The person that has been servicing our cesspool, Mr Bud This sing, A.A. Cesspool Co., has told us that our system is failing and will not pass a Title V inspection. We have been considering a connection to the Newton sewer for some time now.

On August 4, 1997 we submitted an application for a sewer connection and received an installation cost estimate dated 10/02/97. However, the document specified NO TIE-IN FOR 5 YEARS DUE TO NEW PAVING (UNLESS THE SYSTEM FAILS).

On October 14, 2003 we again submitted an application for a sewer connection. On October 24, 2003 we received a letter from Mr Lou Taverna, Utilities Director which stated that they are unable to undertake the connection because, " there is no existing public sewer main in the area into which a connection can be made". We were also advised that all sewer main extensions are requested through the Office of the City Engineer. We contacted Mr John Dahglian, outstanding public servant, and he explained the process and instructed us to submit our request to your office.

PETITION FOR GRANT OF LOCATION

To the Petitioner:

City of Newton Ordinance Section 23-52 requires that each petition for grant of location be submitted to the Public Works Department for a preliminary review before the applicant files the petition with the Board of Aldermen. The comments of the Public Works Commissioner will be part of the record submitted to the Board of Aldermen. 


ALTERNATE DESIGN ADDITIONAL MECHANICS BAY










MECHANICS BAY ADDITION


