WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 5, 2007

REFERRED TO PUB FAC. AND PUB SAFETY & TRANS. COMMITTEES

#35-04 <u>ALD. SAMUELSON</u> requesting an ordinance amendment to Section 26-8 of the City of Newton Revised Ordinances, 2001 to require all property owners or residents to remove snow from sidewalks abutting their property.

ACTION: REFERRED TO 2008-2009 BOARD

NOTE: The Committee met jointly with the Public Safety and Transportation Committee to discuss this item. Commissioner Turocy and Catherine Farrell were present for the discussion, as well. The Public Facilities Committee has previously discussed this item on January 21, 2004 and February 18, 2004 and the reports are attached. Ald. Schnipper gave a brief history of a previous ordinance that was rescinded requiring property owners or residents to clear sidewalks of snow. The ordinance was rescinded due to concerns regarding the ability of some residents to shovel their sidewalks and the ability of the City to enforce the ordinance. There was a list of volunteers or people willing to shovel for a fee available from the Public Works Department; however, the list was very limited. In addition, there was some concern regarding the City's financial liability if a snow-clearing ordinance is enforced and a person slips on a shoveled sidewalk and injures himself or herself.

Ald. Samuelson feels strongly that it is time to bring back the shoveling ordinance. It is irresponsible for the City not to encourage residents to shovel the sidewalks in front of their residences. She has spoken with senior citizens who state that they feel trapped during the winter because they cannot use the sidewalks to get around. It is important that people be able to move freely on the sidewalks, such as postal carriers, who need access to deliver mail to residences. She pointed out that the enforcement is similar to enforcement of parking and speeding ordinances and would be done. There are many cities and towns that have a snow-clearing ordinance, which they enforce. She suggested that enforcement could be complaint driven. She stated that the ordinance is not about penalizing residents but creating a better community. Ald. Danberg voiced her support of the item and asked that her name be added to the docket item.

Catherine Farrell gave brief review of the draft ordinance. She stated that a person who fell on a cleared sidewalk could not sue the City for negligence. A person would need to show that the City was somehow negligent by requiring residents to shovel. The draft ordinance provided by Ms. Farrell (attached) allows the Commissioner of Public Works to exempt a person from shoveling due to hardship.

Ald. Yates stated that the liability issue is frivolous however; he does not believe that there is any correlation between having your driveway plowed and shoveling your sidewalk. It is easy to have your driveway plowed but if the truck with a plow were to clear the sidewalk, it would do significant damage. He questioned how the city would address finding volunteers or paid shovelers for the elderly and physically unable. Ald. Burg is in favor of the ordinance but does not feel it should be approved until there is a viable program for people who cannot shovel. Ald. Schnipper stated that she believes that there should be a public hearing on the item before any change to the ordinances is made. Ald. Fischman is supportive of the concept but felt that the city should start with an educational process. Plow truck divers often create large ice piles that block sidewalks and are immovable. The drivers will need to be re-educated. The city cannot start cold but it seems that the people who the Board believes would have the most trouble with shoveling are the most in favor of a shoveling requirement. Ald. Albright was also in favor of Ald. Fischman's suggestion of an educational phase before enforcement.

Ald. Schnipper pointed out that there would be a different response if the snow were light and fluffy than if it is wet and heavy. She would like to know how clear the sidewalk needs to be to avoid enforcement. Ald. Lappin is happy to encourage snow clearing but is hesitant about an ordinance requiring it. She would be more comfortable if there was a definition of how clear a sidewalk needs to be to avoid any repercussions. Ald. Mansfield stated that it is extremely important to have the sidewalks as clear as possible. He has noticed that the same people do not shovel all winter. Some people will change their behavior if there is an ordinance in place; however, some people will require a fine to change their behavior.

Ald. Gentile has no problem encouraging residents to shovel but he draws the line at punishing people for not shoveling. The sidewalks are public property therefore it seems unfair to require residents to shovel. The city blocks many sidewalks when it plows and does not shovel them after blocking them. The Committees then had a brief discussion about the city possibly shoveling the sidewalks but it was quickly determined that it would be much too expensive.

Ald. Yates suggested two resolutions regarding snow shoveling, which are below. If enough people can be found to volunteer or shovel for a fee, it will be a tangible step. Ald. Danberg suggested that volunteers be matched with residents. Ald. Harney suggested referring the item to hold a public hearing in January; therefore, Ald. Harney made a motion in Public Safety and Transportation to refer the item to the next Board, which carried unanimously. Ald. Yates moved approval of the two resolutions, which carried unanimously and Ald. Mansfield moved referral of the main item, which also carried unanimously. #35-04(2) PUBLIC FACILITIES COMMITTEE requesting that the Newton Serves Program annually recruit residents from all villages who are willing to shovel sidewalks within their neighborhood whether on a volunteer basis or for a fee for persons unable to shovel their own sidewalks.
