#269-06 COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS requesting in accordance with Massachusetts General Law Ch. 40, Sec. 15, abandonment of a City drain easement in the middle of the property at 21 BERKELEY STREET and acceptance of a 25' wide at the front and rear yard and 17.5' wide along the side yard drain easement to be located on the west side of the property.

#269-06(2) <u>KENNETH AND LESLIE PUCKER</u>, 21 Berkeley Street, West Newton, petitioning to construct a main drain from a proposed manhole through a proposed easement on the west side of the property at 21 BERKELEY STREET to the Myrtle Brook Drain Easement.
