#113-01(8B) HIS HONOR THE MAYOR requesting an appropriation in the amount of \$883,951 from Free Cash for the purpose of purchasing and installing a new telephonesystem in all municipal and school buildings.

#14-02 HIS HONOR THE MAYOR requesting an appropriation in the amount of \$140,000 from the Parking Meter Receipts fund for the purpose of supplementing the streetlight budget.
