PUBLIC FACILITIES COMMITTEE REPORT

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 5, 2001

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#265-01 <u>ALD. YATES</u> requesting a report from the Commissioner of Public Works on the capacity of city storm drains and sanitary sewer to accommodate heavy rainfalls without letting sewage or storm drainage damage private homes in the

Quinebequin Road area.

ACTION: NO ACTION NECESSARY 6-0

NOTE:

This item was held on September 5, 2001 for further information. Commissioner Rooney and Jay Fink were present for the discussion of this item. Mr. Fink provided the Committee with a report on the Quinebequin Road area, which is attached. Mr. Fink reviewed the measures taken to solve the sewerage discharge problem. A two-foot metal plate was removed from the Watertown Street sewer line. The sanitary sewer/underdrain at Watertown and Eddy Street failed. The repair is ready to go out for bid this month and the repair should last four to six weeks. The Longfellow Road sewer line has been televised and remedial construction should begin this spring. These repairs should improve the surcharging problem at the Quinobequin Road area and Lyons Field.

There was some discussion regarding possible future measurements that may be taken, if funding is available. There is a sewer line at Elliot Street, which crosses the Charles River twice and feeds into the Quinobequin Road area. It is thought that extra flow during storm events originates from this line. If funding is available, work will begin on this line in the spring.

Mr. Fink, also, researched a holding tank, where sewerage could be stored during storm events. Unfortunately, the cost of such a tank is exorbitant and unlikely to be funded. There was also discussion about an amendment to the ordinances to prohibit clean water discharges from pumps into the sewer line. A program needs to be established to fund or provide funding to residents to divert the flow of their sump pumps to the City's drainage system.

Ald. Yates moved no action necessary on his item but would like to see the residents of the Quinebequin Road area notified of the progress made on this problem. Ald. Schnipper also suggested notifying the Horace Mann School and the F.A. Day Middle School when construction begins at Eddy Street so parents are aware of detours when dropping and picking up students. Mr. Rooney and Mr. Fink agreed to notify the residents and schools. The item was voted unanimously.

#264-01 <u>ALD. YATES</u> requesting a report from the Commissioner of Public Works on the

condition of the storm and sewer drainage system in the Glen Avenue area.

ACTION: NO ACTION NECESSARY 6-0

NOTE: This item was held on September 5, 2001 for further information. Commissioner Rooney and Jay Fink were present for the discussion of this item. Mr. Fink provided the Committee with a report on the Glen Avenue sewer and drainage systems, which is attached. The sewer lines in Glen Avenue were cleaned and lined and watertight inserts have been placed in manholes, which stops extra water from entering the sewer lines. A manhole on Glen Avenue has been raised

to grade to prevent further flooding. The drain lines and culvert have been televised and look to be in great shape.

Glen Avenue is a low point and some flooding is expected there in major storm events. The Public Works Department will keep Glen Avenue under surveillance during storms.

The lagoons located at City Hall need to be cleaned. There is a plan in place to dredge these lagoons, which should alleviate some of the flooding. Ald. Yates moved no action necessary, which was voted unanimously.
