TRAFFIC COUNCIL CHAIR, providing the Annual Report on the work of the Traffic Council for 2016 pursuant to Section 19-30(g) of the City of Newton Revised Ordinances 2012. [12/19/16 @ 4:53 PM]

Action: **Public Safety & Transportation No Action Necessary 7-0, Councilor Fuller not voting**

Note: David Koses, Transportation Coordinator joined the Committee for discussion on this item.

Mr. Koses reviewed with Committee members the work of Traffic Council in 2016, attached to this report. Mr. Koses said during 2016, Traffic Council held eleven evening meetings and heard 67 items. Traffic Council approved (or approved as amended) 65% of all items heard, took no action on 16%, and denied two items. One appeal was submitted to the City Council.

Mr. Koses addressed the backlog of items during 2016. As of tonight, the backlog is approximately 26-30 items. The average backlog has been 26 items. The minimum backlog was 21 items in January 2016 and the maximum backlog was 30 items in October 2016.

In 2016, Traffic Council approved the expansion of incorporating additional streets into the Waban Village Parking District Plan.

In 2016, Traffic Council began a new process of holding approved items pending a draft Traffic and Parking Regulation (TPR) for Council members' approval. This process is working well and has been advantageous because it allows the TPR to be updated after each meeting.

In December 2016, Traffic Council approved the creation of a list of on-street accessible parking spaces be incorporated into the Traffic and Parking Regulations. The Traffic Council may immediately remove any such space if no longer utilized or necessary.

Chair Ciccone opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. A resident asked for distribution of Traffic Council items docketed by residents, councilors and staff. Mr. Koses did not have this information available.

Clerk's Note: As requested, on February 10, 2017, Mr. Koses emailed members of the Public Safety & Transportation Committee the following breakdown of the 67 items before Traffic Council in 2016 docketed by residents, councilors and staff.

Without further discussion, Councilor Cote moved no action necessary. Committee members agreed 7-0, Councilor Fuller not voting.

#366-16 Requesting a review and update on Traffic Council responsibilities

COUNCILORS NORTON, SCHWARTZ AND AUCHINCLOSS, requesting a review and update on Traffic Council responsibilities by shifting certain areas to the executive branch, including the installation of stop signs and safety upgrades. [10/17/16 @ 9:15 AM]

Action: Public Safety & Transportation Held 8-0

Note: Councilor Auchincloss, David Koses, Transportation Coordinator and Nicole Freedman, Director of Transportation joined the Committee for discussion on this item.

Mr. Koses provided Committee members with a list of headers in the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR), attached to this report. The TPR document is approximately 197 pages. Each TPR needs the approval of Traffic Council.

Ms. Freedman stated that the TPR's are very specific allowing the Police Department to enforce the regulations. The TPR is one very accurate document that is updated regularly. Previously when the regulations were incorporated into the City Ordinances historical information was lost. For example, each week the city receives many traffic item requests such as a stop sign. The TPR includes all approved Traffic Council items. If a stop sign request is listed in the TPR, it is easy to replace if it has been removed. If a stop sign is not listed in the TPR, a new request may be made.

Councilor Lipof stated that Traffic Council was created approximately seventeen years ago to prevent the Public Safety & Transportation Committee from being overwhelmed with items docketed relating to traffic concerns. He asked if Traffic Council or other departments would feel comfortable with handling smaller traffic items that are docketed for Traffic Councils consideration? He then stated that he would leave that discretion to Traffic Council.

Councilors Auchincloss and Norton said that this item was docketed to determine whether Traffic Council or the department could make more decisions unilaterally and perhaps avoid the process of all items going before Traffic Council.

Mr. Koses said that stop signs must meet certain criteria listed in the Manual Uniform Traffic Calming Devices (MUTCD). Traffic calming measures are not listed in the TPR. Ms. Freedman stated that Traffic Council must comply with the MUTCD warrants including stop signs, traffic calming measures and school zones. Traffic Council will not vote on items not meeting specific MUTCD warrants.

Councilors suggested that if a stop sign or traffic calming measures do not meet the warrants listed in the MUTCD then perhaps the items should be discussed with the police department or determined administratively without forwarding items to Traffic Council for discussion.

Sgt. Babcock stated that stop signs are a department concern. He stated that if necessary, he uses the Police Department's emergency powers when awaiting an item or stop sign request to be discussed at Traffic Council by installing temporary signs.

Chair Ciccone opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. A resident stated that she has been reviewing Traffic Council reports for 10 years. She said that she categorized Traffic Council items by using spreadsheets. She feels the process of Traffic Council discourages residents from docketing items. A concern is that it should not take years to discuss public safety items in Traffic Council.

Councilors Lipof and Auchincloss then suggested to Mr. Koses and Ms. Freedman that they review the list of TPR headers to determine if there are sections that can be completed administratively with special attention addressing parking. Chair Ciccone suggested that they meet with Sgt. Babcock to address any safety concerns.

Without further discussion, Councilor Lipof moved to hold this item pending the review of TPR headers to determine if there are sections that can be completed administratively with special attention addressing parking issues and to meet with Sgt. Babcock to address any safety concerns. Committee members agreed 8-0.

At approximately 9:30 p.m., the Committee adjourned.

MEMORANDUM

On December 3, 2007, the Board of Aldermen approved as amended, docket item #421-05, which authorized changes to the structure of the Traffic Council. At that time, the Committee requested an annual update of Traffic Council Actions. The attached information is provided to the Committee as requested. No action is necessary.

During 2016, Traffic Council held eleven evening meetings. As shown in Appendix A, during 2016 Traffic Council heard 67 items and took final action on 57 of them. A list of all items heard during 2016 is shown in Appendix B, including the ten items which are still being held (shown in italics). Traffic Council approved (or approved as amended) 65% of all items heard, took no action on 16%, and denied two items. During 2016, the following item was the only item that was submitted for appeal to the City Council.

- DAVID KOSES, TRANSPORTATION COORDINATOR, requesting a change to the parking regulations on Chestnut Street between Washington Street and Davis Street

The City Council voted to uphold the Traffic Council vote, which created a 15-minute parking zone, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. in front of 25 Chestnut Street. Note that item TC28-16, which was docketed following the Parking Clerk's relocation out of 25 Chestnut Street, came before Traffic Council on 11.16.16. This vote modified the parking regulations in front of 25 Chestnut Street once again, by creating three 15 minute parking spaces and two two-hour parking spaces.
