M E M O R A N D U M

On December 3, 2007, the Board of Aldermen approved as amended, docket item #421-05, which authorized changes to the structure of the Traffic Council. At that time, the Committee requested an annual update of Traffic Council Actions. The attached information is provided to the Committee as requested. No action is necessary.

During 2015, Traffic Council held nine evening meetings. As shown in Appendix A, during 2015 Traffic Council heard 61 items and took final action on 56 of them. A list of all items heard during 2015 is shown in Appendix B, including the five items which are still being held (shown in italics). Traffic Council approved (or approved as amended) 75% of all items heard, took no action on 13%, and denied two items. During 2015, the following item was the only item that was submitted for appeal to the Board of Aldermen.

 TC53-14 JOHN REALE, 37 Smith Avenue, requesting traffic flow improvements due to Smith Avenue having a street width of 16 feet; a) consideration to convert Smith Avenue to a one-way street; b) post no parking, any time sign; c) post slow down children sign; and d) post slow down narrow road sign due to safety concerns.
