Discussion of Proposed Intersection Improvements

Winchester Street at Boylston Street

The Public Works Department requests your Honorable Board docket for consideration a discussion on proposed intersection improvements at Winchester Street and Boylston Street, most notably including the installation of a new traffic signal at this intersection.

The project proposes traffic flow improvements and pedestrian access improvements to help mitigate traffic concerns in the area. The project includes new traffic signals at the Winchester Street/Boylston Street intersection, at the westerly side of the intersection only. This work had previously been envisioned to be completed in concert with the Needham Street reconstruction. However, as this project is within the impacted area of the Chestnut Hill Development Project, we amended our Mass Works grant for that project to include these intersection improvements. This will enable us to get this work done well in advance of Needham Street's reconstruction.

Estimated construction cost is \$294,000, all of which are to be paid for under the Mass Works grant. The project will be constructed in the Spring, with an anticipated completion date of June 30, 2014. Please see the attached plan, as prepared by Fay, Spofford and Thorndike, Inc., our consulting engineers for this project.



Resident Permit Parking § 19-201(B)(1) – proposed amendments concerning contiguous lots

OPTION #1 (removes contiguous lot eligibility entirely)

B. Issuance of resident parking stickers:

(1) Resident parking stickers shall identify the restricted area to which they apply and shall be of a design specified by the chief of police. One such sticker for a restricted area shall be issued by the chief of police or his designee to an owner of a motor vehicle which is registered in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, with a registered gross weight of under two and one half (2½) tons, which is principally garaged in the City of Newton at an address which borders a restricted area, or which is contiguous to a lot that borders said restricted area, as established in accordance with subsection (a) above, which is owned or used by a resident of the City of Newton at said address, and which otherwise qualifies for issuance of a sticker under this section. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the owner of a motor vehicle principally garaged at a lot which is contiguous to the rear lot line of a non-corner lot bordering the restricted area will not be entitled to a sticker.

OPTION #2 (Traffic Council determines case by case)

B. Issuance of resident parking stickers:

(1) Resident parking stickers shall identify the restricted area to which they apply and shall be of a design specified by the chief of police. One such sticker for a restricted area shall be issued by the chief of police or his designee to an owner of a motor vehicle which is registered in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, with a registered gross weight of under two and one half (21/2) tons, which is principally garaged in the City of Newton at an address which borders a restricted area or which is contiguous to a lot that borders said restricted area, as established in accordance with subsection (a) above, which is owned or used by a resident of the City of Newton at said address, and which otherwise qualifies for issuance of a sticker under this section. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the owner of a motor vehicle principally garaged at a lot which is contiguous to a lot that borders said restricted area may be eligible provided the traffic council finds that inclusion of such contiguous lot will not place an undue demand on available parking spaces in the restricted area. In no event will the owner of a motor vehicle principally garaged at a lot which is contiguous to the rear lot line of a non-corner lot bordering the restricted area will not be entitled to a sticker.
