

This memorandum provides the Public Safety and Transportation Committee with information as related to docket item #49-10 NEWTON BICYCLE/PEDESTRIAN TASK FORCE seeking a discussion on a proposal to make changes to the City of Newton's bicycle-related ordinances in order to better align them with State Law and to make it possible for Newton's Safe Routes to School program to develop bike routes suitable for children.

Section 85-11b of the Massachusetts General Laws states that bicycles may be ridden on sidewalks outside business districts when necessary in the interest of safety, unless otherwise directed by local ordinance. A person operating a bicycle on the sidewalk shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and give an audible signal before overtaking and passing any pedestrian.

Section 26-26(a) of the Newton Ordinance states that "the use of velocipedes by children under eight (8) year of age is permitted on the sidewalks of the city". (The term "velocipede" is today, mainly used as a collective term for the different forerunners of the monowheel, the bicycle, the dicycle, the tricycle and the quadracycle developed between 1817 and 1880.) This means that persons over the age of eight years are not currently permitted to ride bicycles on sidewalks in Newton. To make it legal for persons over age eight to bicycle on sidewalks, the Board of Alderman may choose one of the following two options: (a) Increase the age limit specified in Section 26-26(a); or (b) Delete Section 26-26(a). By deleting Section 26-26(a), the state law would take effect, allowing bicycles to be ridden on sidewalks outside business districts.

The minutes prepared for the March 3, 2010 Public Safety and Transportation Committee meeting indicated that members of the Newton Bicycle-Pedestrian Task Force expressed were concerned that the City ordinance limits bicycles from coasting on streets and from parking on sidewalks. While Section 19-3 of the Newton Ordinance indicates that no person shall coast in any street way, the Law Department clarified that this section of the ordinance refers to sleds, not to bicycles, and that bicycles are clearly permitted to coast on City streets. The Law Department also clarified that bicycles are, in fact, permitted to park on sidewalks. Section 19-9 establishes a fine for vehicles parked on sidewalks, but this refers to motorized vehicles and not to bicycles. In addition, State law would override any local restriction that may prevent bicycles from parking on sidewalks.
