A. Description

Land, vegetation, existing structures, natural or developed physical boundaries

Hunnewell Park is a relatively unknown parcel of land located in Newton on the Brighton city line boarded on the east side by the New Balance Factory building, on the north by the Mass Pike, and Amtrak Train Lines and on the South and west by 5 abutting Newton residences. The grassy 199,217 square foot property is separated from the Newton properties by 30 foot wide border of trees and vegetation. Near the entrance to the park, there was an old chain-link backstop from a baseball field that had not been used for more than five years. In July Newton's Parks and Recreation Department permitted the Little League to make "improvements" to the park by clearing away brush, building the infield and adding benches. My understanding is that Little League will use the park infrequently and will post times and dates of scheduled games and practices so that dogs will not be in the park when baseball is in play. There is also a small fenced-in tot lot at the far west corner of the field. There is an existing chain link fence that completely surrounds the park and the dog walking community has replaced gates to the park where necessary.

The entire park is enclosed by chain link fence. There are 2 gates on the Brighton entrance to the park, one at the end of Grasmere Street by the tot lot and a locked double gate on Simpson Street allowing access for the Newton Parks and Recreation Department's grounds keeping equipment.

The city of Newton has a right-of-way to the park through the New Balance Factory on Newton Street in Brighton. There is ample parking for 25 cars. This should be the only access to the off-leash site. (See Attachment #4)

A. Description of unofficial use of this location for off-leash dogs

Since the main entrance to the park is from Newton Street in Brighton through the right-of-way in the New Balance Parking lot, it seems few Newton residents use Hunnewell Park. On any given day from 9 am until 4pm, local dog walkers from exercise as many as 25 dogs at a time in harmony and all do a fine job of cleaning up after their charges. I am told that several of these professionals have used the park for 10 years or more. I have interviewed more than 30 people over a four month periods on week days and weekends and have met only an occasional Newton resident. Many Brighton residents live in apartments off Newton Street and are thrilled to have this area to walk their dogs and enjoy the grassy field. Noise from dogs barking is not a factor as the sounds from cars on the Mass Pike and Amtrak trains drown out any noise made by dogs in the daytime. At night I am told that teens go into the park to party and drink beer. The dog walkers often pick up bottles and other trash on their first walk of the day. Recently, New Balance thinned the trees that toughed the fence all around their parking lot. The dog walkers were planning to get together to clean up all the newly exposed trash along the fence. At the far west end of Hunnewell where near the tot lot, I have seen a few children playing however they are often accompanied by a family pet. On one occasion, I saw a few people playing Frisbee with their children and their dogs.

B. <u>Dog walkers</u>

There are five or six professional dog walkers who use the park. A few of these people live in Newton, but others do not. Many of the dogs being walked are owned by Newton Residents. Each dog walker manages about 4 dogs at a time. Their hours of operation are from 10am-3pm. As Newton residents discover the park, we are finding that our dogs enjoy the socialization they experience when the dog walkers are in the area with their client's pets.

I understand that Newton Little League has a permit to use the park for scheduled games. The park should be closed to off-leash dogs during games.

B. Potential on-site conflict

How would on-site conflicts between dogs and between owners be handled?

For the past 10 years dog owners and dog walkers have managed any conflicts that have arisen.

 Park users have maintained the site for many years. Volunteers regularly come together to maintain the park now.

Additional trash barrels are needed at the park now. When volunteers pick up trash left at night, the barrels often overflow. Dispensers for dog bags should be available. I would also suggest a double gate at the Newton Street entrance so dogs don't escape into the parking lot when new park users arrive. The area should be posted to alert those entering the park that it is an off-leash area, reminding them to keep the gates closed and to pick up after their dogs and keep the park clean.

There are, in fact, only 5 properties in Newton that directly abut the park.

9. Potential conflicts with non-owners

A. Existing Problems

I am not aware of any problems. I know there is a great deal of fear that new park users will create traffic on the streets that dead end at the park (Grasmere, Simpson & Elmhurst.) Access to the park should be limited to the Newton Street Entrance. (See 9 (C) and Attachment #6)

B. Potential problems

Do you foresee any potential conflicts between off-leash dog use and other park users?

The park has seen little use for many years. It has been used for ball games in the past and I am told it may be used for that purpose once again. However the park is not wide enough for most ball games. It is in fact a perfect place for an off-leash dog park.

C. Mitigation of problems

Please describe how the proposed restrictions/regulations (above 7A*) might mitigate any historical/ongoing/potential problems.

We have learned a lot from the off-leash experiment at Cold Springs Park. A major complaint at that park has revolved around the parking issue. If we were to limit access to the Park to the Newton Street Entrance, Hunnewell would not have that same problem.

10. Additional information

Please supply any additional information you think might be helpful to the Off-Leash Advisory Committee, the Conservation Commission or the Parks and Recreation Commission.

Although Hunnewell Park is owned by the city of Newton, few Newton residents are able to enjoy this beautiful field because no one seems to know about it. On the other

hand our neighbors in Brighton have the benefit of this wonderful resource at the expense of Newton taxpayers! This plot of land is in an area that has been a buffer zone between the Mass Pike and Amtrak and a small section of Newton Corner. The main access to the park is via a right-of way through the New Balance Factory on Newton Street behind a chain link fence with a sign reading "Private Property" with notice that access to the park is offered by "New Balance Corporation and the City of Newton Parks and Recreation Department." This park has been used as an offleash facility for years unofficially but very successfully. The area has policed itself well; volunteers have kept the park clean and relatively safe. If more folks knew about its existence it is possible that the park would be used by more folks after work reducing the amount of underage drinking and party that clearly goes on in the park after hours. An off leash dog park offers friend and neighbors a wonderful opportunity to congregate with their pets and form another common bond for the residents of the City of Newton.






