Mr. Koses and Mr. Prizant provided a PowerPoint presentation, attached to this report.

TC65-19 DANIELLE BOERNER, 241 Greenwood Street, requesting a stop sign at

Country Club Road and Greenwood Street to enhance safety. (Ward 8) [10/02/19

@ 4:18 PM]

ACTION: APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 535. TPR 535 creates a 4-

way stop-controlled intersection at Country Club Road and Greenwood

Street.

This item may be appealed through the close of business February 12, 2020.

NOTE: Danielle Boerner, petitioner did not attend tonight's discussion.

Council members were provided vehicular, pedestrian and bicycle volumes, Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) and the current stop sign regulation.

Mr. Prizant stated that data shows Greenwood Street has higher volumes than Country Club Road. The MUTCD provides guidance with warrants on when to install stop signs. Criteria A, B, C, D, E, F and H were not met. Criteria G was met due to difficult site lines. He then stated that Greenwood Street is a collector road and Country Club Road is a local Road. There has been one reported crash in the past three years. Mr. Prizant then stated that he could support this request, as often drivers are confused.

Mr. Koses opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. Residents present expressed their concerns and questions.

Concerns:

- There have been many near crashes and there have been more crashes then reported in the data.
- Perhaps data was not taken at the appropriate time.
- Drivers have the tendency to be confused at this intersection, a stop sign would enhance safety at this dangerous intersection.
- Pedestrian safety is necessary, site lines are difficult due to the hill on Greenwood Street.

Questions

• Is vehicular, pedestrian and bicycle volume data available during elementary school times? Mr. Prizant answered no, data was collected during peak travel times.

Those present stated that they support a 4-way stop sign at this intersection.

Without further discussion, Councilor Downs made a motion to approve a 4-way stop-controlled intersection at Country Club Road and Greenwood Street. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on February 12, 2020.

TC68-19 <u>CAPTAIN ANASTASIA, NEWTON POLICE DEPARTMENT</u>, requesting No

Turn on Red at the intersection of Winchester Street, southbound and Nahanton Street, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m., and

3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. (Ward 8) [11/06/19 @ 8:23 AM]

ACTION: APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 536. TPR 536 creates a No

Turn on Red restriction at the intersection of Winchester Street, southbound and Nahanton Street, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 7:00

a.m. to 9:00 a.m., and 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

This item may be appealed through the close of business February 12, 2020.

NOTE: Council members were provided with a location map, site photos and the current regulation.

Mr. Koses stated that the traffic signal and the No Turn on Red exist at this intersection but are not included in the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR).

Mr. Koses opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. A resident expressed concern and stated that the No Turn on Red should be implemented all times, all days making the intersection safer and easier for enforcement.

Captain Anastasia stated that the No Turn on Red was installed as an emergency measure to enhance safety during rush hours. There have been zero complaints received since the sign was installed. He then stated that he would support the time restrictions as docketed. Council members agreed.

Without further discussion, Captain Anastasia made the above motion. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on February 12, 2020.

TC82-19 DAVID KOSES, TRANPORTATION COORDINATOR, on behalf of Jesse Corey, requesting to remove the following stop sign from the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR): Brandeis Road at Roosevelt Road, northbound and southbound. Note that there is no stop sign at this location in the field. This item makes no change in the field and fixes a mistake in the TPR. (Ward 8) [12/10/19 @ 4:16 PM]

ACTION: APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 537. TPR 537 removes the

following stop sign from the TPR: Brandeis Road at Roosevelt Road,

 $north bound\ and\ south bound.$

This item may be appealed through the close of business February 12, 2020.

NOTE: Council members were provided with a location map, site photos, current regulations and a recommendation.

Mr. Prizant stated that there is no stop sign on Brandeis Road at Roosevelt Road. There is one stop sign on Roosevelt Road at Brandeis Road. This "T" intersection implies stopping on Brandeis Road. This item makes no change in the field and fixes an error in the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR).

Mr. Prizant recommends removal of the stop signs listed in the TPR for Brandeis Road at Roosevelt Road, northbound and southbound.

Mr. Koses opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. Residents present expressed their concerns and suggestions.

Concerns:

- When drivers' turn onto Roosevelt Road from Brandeis Road; they have the tendency to drive in the opposite lane of traffic.
- Visibility is difficult at Roosevelt and Brandeis Roads.
- The intersection is dangerous due to high traffic and pedestrian volumes.
- Drivers have the tendency to speed on Roosevelt Road.
- The stop sign has helped exiting driveways, traffic and speed volumes.

Suggestions:

- Police enforcement is necessary.
- Paint a centerline on Roosevelt Road. Captain Anastasia and Mr. Prizant agreed that painted centerlines may help.

Those present stated that they support the stop sign at this intersection, it is necessary to enhance safety.

Mr. Koses provided Council members options for consideration, including approving, denying or voting no action necessary on this item. He then stated that if this item is approved, the stop sign at Brandeis Road at Roosevelt Road, northbound and southbound will be deleted from the TPR. Mr. Koses then stated that if this item is denied or voted no action necessary the stop signs will be installed.

Captain Anastasia expressed concern and stated that stop signs should not be installed unless they meet the MUTCD warrants. Mr. Prizant stated that stop signs are not traffic calming measures.

Without further discussion, Councilor Downs made a motion to approve this request, the stop sign will be deleted from the TPR on Brandeis Road at Roosevelt Road, northbound and southbound and will not be installed at this intersection. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on February 12, 2020.

TC87-19 <u>ISAAC PRIZANT, TRAFFIC ENGINEER</u>, requesting to discuss and potentially

to remove some or all the stop signs in the City's Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR), and in the field, at the intersection of Roosevelt Road at Theodore Road.

(Ward 8) [12/20/19 @ 2:22 PM]

ACTION: APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 538. TPR 538 removes the

stop signs on Roosevelt Road, in both directions, and retaining the stop signs ${\bf r}$

on Theodore Road, in both directions.

This item may be appealed through the close of business February 12, 2020.

NOTE: Council members were provided with a location map, site photos, vehicular, pedestrian and bicycle volumes, Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), current regulation and a recommendation.

Mr. Prizant stated that the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR) currently includes stop signs on Roosevelt Road at Theodore Road, eastbound and westbound and Theodore Road at Roosevelt Road, northbound and southbound. The City needed to install stop signs once staff was notified that they are on the books. When the stop signs were installed, elected officials and City staff received negative feedback. Due to the negative feedback, Mr. Prizant conducted a warrant study using the MUTCD guidelines.

Data was collected during peak high school travel times. Data shows a much higher traffic volume on Roosevelt Road. Approximately half of the vehicles observed actually stopped at the posted stop sign on Roosevelt Rode. The MUTCD provides guidance with warrants on when to install stop signs. Criteria A, B, C, D, E, F and H were not met. Criteria G was met due to difficult site lines - poor sight lines exiting Theodore Road northbound approach looking east (right). This approach is exiting a private way servicing one single family home driveway.

Mr. Prizant then stated that there have been zero reported crashes in the past three years and recommends removing the stop signs on Roosevelt Road, both directions and retaining the stop signs on Theodore Road, both directions.

Mr. Koses stated that two emails were received, on file, including support from Councilor Lipof. He then opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. Residents present expressed their concerns, questions and suggestions.

Concerns:

- The stop sign has helped exiting driveways, traffic and speed volumes.
- A large tree obstructs the stop sign at this intersection.

Questions:

• What type of negative feedback was received? Mr. Prizant answered that the negative

feedback included drivers disobeying the stop sign. The stop sign is not warranted at Theodore Road and should be removed.

Suggestions:

- Remove the stop sign at the private driveway, it is not necessary.
- Relocate the private driveway.
- Table this item in order to take further observations since the stop sign was recently installed.

Mr. Prizant said that he would add Roosevelt Road to the list of traffic calming items. Data will be collected for Roosevelt Road. He then stated that a stop sign is not a traffic calming device. He briefly explained the process and stated that the Department Public Works conducts an annual evaluation of streets in the City by collecting data, process, evaluate and prioritize.

Mr. Koses stated that stop signs should only be installed where they are warranted. Otherwise, drivers have the tendency to ignore them.

Without further discussion, Mr. Prizant made a motion to approve this request, the stop signs will be removed on Roosevelt Road, in both directions, and retaining the stop signs on Theodore Road, in both directions. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on February 12, 2020.

TC80-19 <u>DAVID KOSES, TRAFFIC COUNCIL CHAIR</u>, requesting removal of the following accessible parking space, as it is no longer needed: Chapel Street: east side; 270 feet north of Green St; northerly 20 feet. (Ward 1) [12/02/19 @ 8:30 AM]

ACTION: APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 539. TPR 539 removes the accessible parking space located on Chapel Street: east side; 270 feet north of Green St; northerly 20 feet.

This item may be appealed through the close of business February 12, 2020.

NOTE: Council members were provided with a location map, site photos, current parking regulation and a recommendation.

Mr. Koses stated that this item was docketed requesting removal of an accessible parking space on Chapel Street as it is no longer needed. The request came from Councilor Leary. Captain Anastasia asked whether the Commission on Disability (COD) reviews requests for removing accessible parking spaces. Mr. Koses answered no, COD only reviews new requests received.

Without discussion, Mr. Koses made the motion to approve this request. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on February 12, 2020.

DAVID KOSES, TRAFFIC COUNCIL CHAIR, requesting to change the official parking regulations for the portion of William Street located in Newton Corner. The official parking regulations includes a parking prohibition 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., entire length, for Williams Street in Ward 1. However, this official parking regulation does not match the currently posted signage, and appears to be the parking regulations for Williams Street in Newton Upper Falls, not William Street in Newton Corner. (Note that William Street in Newton Corner becomes Williams Street in Watertown.) (Ward 1) [11/29/19 @ 3:01 PM]

ACTION:

APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 541. TPR 541 prohibits parking on William Street (Newton Corner) on both sides, all days. This item may be appealed through the close of business February 12, 2020

NOTE: Council members were provided with a location map, site photos, current parking regulations and a recommendation.

Mr. Koses recommends changing the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR) to match the existing "no parking" signage, already posted on William Street in Newton Corner.

Without discussion, Councilor Downs made the motion to approve this request. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on February 12, 2020.

TC88-19 COUNCILOR DOWNS AND DAVID KOSES, TRAFFIC COUNCIL CHAIR,

requesting to increase the number of business permits available on Lincoln Street between Bowdoin Street and Woodward Street. (Wards 5 & 6) [12/27/19 @

10:16 AM]

ACTION: APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 540. TPR 540 increases the

number of business permits available on Lincoln Street between Bowdoin

Street and Woodward Street to 12.

This item may be appealed through the close of business February 12, 2020.

NOTE: Council members were provided with Newton Highlands Parking District map, parking counts on Lincoln Street between Bowdoin and Woodward Streets and a recommendation.

Mr. Koses stated that this request is to increase the number of business (non-resident) permits available on Lincoln Street between Bowdoin and Woodward Streets. He then stated that he recommends an increase from six permits to twelve permits.

Mr. Koses conducted twenty different parking counts between December 26, 2019 through January 22, 2020 on the north and south sides of Lincoln Street between Bowdoin and Woodward Streets. Observations indicated that between one and nine vehicles are parking on these two blocks of Lincoln Street. There are approximately forty-seven parking spaces on these two blocks. Mr. Koses then stated that the Newton Highlands Parking District map includes twenty-six permits overall. If this item is approved, thirty-two permits would be available.

Captain Anastasia stated as of today, the six business permits on this block have not sold out. When permits are sold out, no additional permits will be issued. Each business is currently capped at two permits. Mr. Koses and Captain Anastasia stated that they envision the parking district to continue growing. A Council member suggested advising the Newton Highlands Area Council of the increase of permits available, if approved.

It was asked if this parking district would be reviewed annually. Mr. Koses answered no, the district will be reviewed any time an item is docketed for consideration.

Without further discussion, Mr. Koses made the motion to approve this request. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on February 12, 2020.

TC78-19 <u>DAVID KOSES, TRAFFIC COUNCIL CHAIR</u>, requesting to review and possibly change the official parking regulations for Williams Street in Upper Falls. The current official parking regulations for Williams Street in Upper Falls

prohibits parking on both sides, 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., except Saturday, Sunday and Holidays. This official parking restriction is currently only posted on the west side of the street and will need to be posted on both sides unless the official

parking regulations are changed. (Ward 5) [11/29/19 @ 3:01 PM]

ACTION: APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 545. TPR 545 sets the

parking restriction on Williams Street (Newton Upper Falls) to the following:

Prohibited, west side, 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., entire length.

This item may be appealed through the close of business February 12, 2020.

NOTE: Council members were provided with a location map, site photos, road characteristics and a recommendation.

Mr. Koses stated that Williams Street is 23 feet wide with a parking restriction both sides, 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., entire length. Signage is posted on the odd (west) side and will need to be posted on both sides unless the official parking regulations are changed. The utility poles are located on the west side, no fire hydrants were observed.

Mr. Koses recommends making the official TPR match the existing signage. There will be no change to the signage.

Without discussion, Mr. Koses made the motion to approve this request. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on February 12, 2020.

requesting to add parking meters along Chestnut Street in Upper Falls, in the spaces next to the existing metered parking area, where the Park and Pedal signs

APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 542. TPR 542 adds long-**ACTION:**

term parking meters along Chestnut Street in Upper Falls, in the spaces next to the existing metered parking area, where the Park and Pedal signs are

located.

This item may be appealed through the close of business February 12, 2020.

NOTE: Council members were provided with a location map, site photos, parking options and a recommendation.

Mr. Koses stated that this item requests adding parking meters along Chestnut Street in Newton Upper Falls, in the spaces next to the existing metered parking area, where the Park and Pedal signs are located. Unmetered parking is available across the street from the metered parking spaces.

Mr. Koses is recommending adding additional long-term metered parking spaces on Chestnut Street and is recommending correcting the missing accessible parking space in the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR).

Without discussion, Mr. Koses made the motion to approve this request. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on February 12, 2020.

TC69-19 DAVID KOSES, TRAFFIC COUNCIL CHAIR, requesting to review, correct,

and reorganize the official parking regulations in the Traffic and Parking

Regulations (TPR) for Beacon Street into a format that will be easier to use. This item will correct errors in the TPR and will not make any changes to the intended and posted parking regulations, signage or meters along the Beacon Street

APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 543. **ACTION:**

NOTE: Council members were provided with a location map and background information.

Mr. Koses stated that the three pages of the official parking regulations in the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR) is difficult to use. With this reorganization, there will be no changes to the existing signage in the field.

The draft TPR presents a new format of dividing the Beacon Street corridor into the following six sections:

- Beacon Street between the Boston City Line and Hammond Street
- Beacon Street between Hammond Street and Grant Avenue
- Beacon Street between Grant Avenue and Crescent Avenue

- Beacon Street between Crescent Avenue and Walnut Street
- Beacon Street between Walnut Street and Chestnut Street
- Beacon Street between Chestnut Street and Washington Street

Without discussion, Mr. Koses made the motion to approve this request. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on February 12, 2020.

<u>DAVID KOSES, TRAFFIC COUNCIL CHAIR</u>, requesting a slight modification of the No Parking zones in the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR) around the following existing bus stops in order to clarify the bus stop zones: Washington Street eastbound at Crafts Street, Fredette Road at Saw Mill Brook Parkway, and Saw Mill Brook Parkway at Keller Path. (Wards 1, 2 & 8) [01/15/20 @ 2:15 PM]

ACTION:

APPROVED AS AMENDED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 544. TPR 544 modifies the No Parking zones around the following bus stops in order to create a bus stop zone: Washington Street eastbound at Crafts Street and Saw Mill Brook Parkway at Keller Path. The bus stop pair at Fredette Road at Saw Mill Brook Parkway is expected to be eliminated by the MBTA. This item may be appealed through the close of business February 12, 2020.

NOTE: Council members were provided with location maps, current parking regulations and a recommendation.

Mr. Koses stated that this request is from the MBTA requesting a slight modification of the No Parking zones in the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR) around the following existing bus stops in order to clarify the bus stop zones: Washington Street eastbound at Crafts Street, Fredette Road at Saw Mill Brook Parkway, and Saw Mill Brook Parkway at Keller Path.

Captain Anastasia and Mr. Prizant asked if the zones would be painted or if the pavement would be marked. Mr. Koses answered he did not have this information available, but signs would be installed in a way that would create bus stop zones from two signs, rather than a single point. Captain Anastasia then stated that painted zones would make it clear for drivers, parking control officers and the appeals parking ticket process.

Without discussion, Mr. Koses made the motion to approve as amended this request, Fredette Road at Saw Mill Brook Parkway will not be incorporated into the TPR as the bus stop pair is likely to be eliminated by the MBTA. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on February 12, 2020.
