TC7-19 JANE BREARLEY, 11 Cliff Road, requesting Cliff Road be changed to a one-

way street.

(Ward 5) [02/26/19 @ 10:25 AM]

HELD 3-0, Auchincloss not voting, on 06/13/19. Held for a trial of the

following: One-way in the eastbound direction; No parking on the north side.

**ACTION:** APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 503. TPR 503 adds a "No

Parking" regulation on the north side and a "Do Not Enter" restriction from

Linden Street.

This item may be appealed through the close of business October 9, 2019.

**NOTE:** Jane Brearley, petitioner did not attend tonight's discussion.

Council members were provided with a location map, site photos, characteristics of Cliff Road and actions taken at the June 13, 2019 Traffic Council meeting.

Mr. Koses explained that the trial included making Cliff Road a one-way in the eastbound direction and no parking on the north side and a "Do Not Enter" sign was posted on Cliff Road, looking west from Linden Street. Cliff Road was not made a one-way street. Prior to the trial, there were no current parking restrictions on either side. Cliff Road is 17 feet wide, a narrow and short road. The utility poles are located on the north side, fire hydrants are located on the south side.

Mr. Koses stated that two emails and two phone calls were received on this item. One email was in support and one email was in opposition to making the trial permanent. He then opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. There was no public comment.

Without discussion, Councilor Ciccone made a motion to approve this item maintaining the no parking regulation on the north side and a "Do Not Enter" restriction from Linden Street. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business October 9, 2019.

TC46-19 DAVID KOSES, TRAFFIC COUNCIL CHAIR, on behalf of Robin Abber,

requesting to add the blocks of Woodward Street between Lincoln Street and Route 9 into the Newton Highlands Parking District, including 991-1005

Boylston Street. (Wards 5 & 6) [07/18/19 @ 2:00 PM]

**ACTION:** APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 504. TPR 504 adds the

section of Woodward Street between Lincoln Street and Boylston Street, including 991-1005 Boylston Street, into the Newton Highlands Parking

District.

This item may be appealed through the close of business October 9, 2019.

**NOTE:** Robin Abber attended tonight's discussion.

Council members were provided with background information, characteristics of a proposed parking plan, current Newton Highlands Parking District map, proposed district expansion map and a recommendation.

Mr. Koses explained in detail the five parking districts that have been implemented across Newton since 2013. In Newton Highlands, many streets had parking restrictions, which limited residents' use of their own street. Employees had limited parking options in the Village. Only five long-term parking meters are available in the Village. Converting more meters to long-term parking was not supported since commuters would be likely to take the spaces due to the proximity of the Green Line station. A managed and shared on-street parking is a good thing. The parking plan allows residents to override the posted restriction and slows traffic. He then stated that a proper balance is necessary when determining the number of permits for residents and non-residents.

The Newton Highlands Parking District Plan included posting new signage, allowing parking permits to override the posted restriction. Permits are available to residents and a limited number to non-residents. Resident permit stickers cost \$25.00 per year for each vehicle and two free transferable visitor placards per household. Non-resident permits would be made available to non-residents of the street, with a cap per street or block. There are approximately 25 permits available for employers. The fee for non-resident permits was determined by City Council to be \$200.00 per year. Businesses can request two parking permits per address until they are sold out. When permits are sold out, no additional permits are issued. Permits are managed by the Newton Traffic Bureau. Current parking permits expire on December 31, 2019. Captain Anastasia explained that parking permits are issued on a lottery basis and he did not have data available on the number of remaining permits.

Mr. Koses recommends including the section of Woodward Street between Lincoln Street and Boylston Street, including 991-1005 Boylston Street, into the Newton Highlands Parking District, thereby allowing employers working within this area to purchase parking permits.

Mr. Koses opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. Residents expressed their concerns, questions and suggestions.

#### Concerns:

A business owner expressed concern about parking issues and stated that there is not enough parking for employees and customers. Customers cannot conduct their business if parking is not available. Often, employees must shuffle their vehicles. Businesses should not have to have hardships when there is plenty of on-street parking. Employers cannot hire additional staff when parking is not available. Parking is necessary for the businesses to thrive. Parking permits are necessary.

#### Questions:

A business owner asked how many parking permits would be available for employers. Mr. Koses explained that the Traffic Bureau manages the permit process. As additional streets are added into the parking plan, the number of non-resident permits would increase, and would be sprinkled around the neighborhood, so that streets would share the burden. If necessary, residents and/or business owners can request (through Traffic Council) an increase in the number of parking permits available. Captain Anastasia did not have data available on the number of remaining parking permits.

#### Suggestions:

It was suggested to add additional non-resident parking permits on Erie Avenue, Lincoln Street and Bowdoin Street.

In conclusion, business owners and residents present stated that they could support adding Woodward Street between Lincoln Street and Boylston Street, including 991-1005 Boylston Street, into the Newton Highlands Parking District.

Without further discussion, Mr. Prizant made a motion to approve this request. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on October 9, 2019.

TC44-19 <u>DAVID KOSES, TRANSPORTATION COORDINATOR</u>, requesting to add a

stop sign into the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR) on Forest Street, eastbound and westbound, at Chester Street, to match the existing signage. This item will not change the existing signage on the street and fixes an omission in the

TPR.

**ACTION:** APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 505. TPR 505 adds stop

signs at Forest & Chester into the TPR.

This item may be appealed through the close of business October 9, 2019.

**NOTE:** Council members were provided with a location map and site photos.

Mr. Koses stated that this request is to add a stop sign into the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR) on Forest Street, eastbound and westbound, at Chester Street, to match the existing signage. This item will not change the existing signage on the street and fixes an omission in the TPR.

Without discussion, Councilor Ciccone made a motion to approve this request. Council members agreed 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on October 9, 2019.

TC26-19 <u>JEFF LUBIN</u>, 217 California Street, requesting the reinstatement of the following

parking prohibitions on California Street **a**) North side, from a point 100 feet west of Los Angeles Street westerly 115 feet. **b**) South side, from Alison Street to a point 125 feet westerly to accommodate parking for business customers. (Ward

1) (05/07/19 @ 1:11 PM]

**ACTION:** TC26-19(a): NO ACTION NECESSARY 5-0.

ACTION: TC26-19(b): APPROVED 5-0. Approved the language of TPR 506. TPR 506

was presented as "Option 1", and revises the TPR on California Street in the vicinity of McDonalds, so that the TPR matches the currently posted signage. TPR 506 retains a "no parking" restriction on the south side, from Allison

Street to a point 125 feet westerly.

This item may be appealed through the close of business October 9, 2019.

**NOTE:** Jeff Lubin, petitioner did not attend tonight's discussion.

Council members were provided with a location map, official current parking regulations on California Street between Faxon Street and the Watertown line, site photos and recommended options for consideration.

Mr. Koses stated that the no parking signs, on the north side of California Street, were incorrectly posted. Staff has modified the signage on California Street to ensure compliance with the official parking regulations. There are no parking restrictions between the McDonald's exit driveway and Rustic Street. It is necessary to approve this item to correct the duplicate parking restrictions in the TPR for California Street, south side, west of Allison Street.

Mr. Koses asked Council members if they would prefer to prohibit parking on California Street, on the south side to a point within 125' of Allison Street, or to a point within 40'. He then provided Council members in detail two options for consideration.

**OPTION 1**) Vote to remove the duplicate regulations in the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR).

- To maintain the no parking restriction on the south side within 125' of Allison Street.
- To maintain the no parking restriction on the north side.
- This denies the request to remove both "no parking" regulations.

**OPTION 2)** Vote to remove the duplicate regulations in the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR).

- To reduce the no parking restriction on the south side to within 40' of Allison Street.
- To maintain the no parking restriction on the north side.
- This denies the request to remove the "no parking" regulation on the north side.

Mr. Koses stated that two emails were received in support, on file. He then opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. A business owner stated that Mr. Lubin, the petitioner, has relocated. He then said that parking is necessary all day for employees and for customers for the businesses to thrive.

Without further discussion, Councilor Ciccone made the following motions: <u>TC26-19(a)</u>: No Action Necessary. <u>TC26-19(b)</u>: Approved "Option 1" and revised the TPR on California Street in the vicinity of McDonalds, so that the TPR matches the currently posted signage. A "no parking" restriction on the south side, from Allison Street to a point 125 feet westerly. Council members agreed to both motions 5-0. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on October 9, 2019.

TC34-19 THEODORE ORENSTEIN, 29 Ricker Road, requesting a two-hour parking

restriction between 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. to deter commuter parking. (Ward 1)

**ACTION:** HELD 5-0. HELD with the intention of moving presenting a new Newton

Corner Parking District at a subsequent Traffic Council meeting, to include

Ricker Road as well as Playstead Road and Ricker Terrace.

**NOTE:** Theodore Orenstein, petitioner attended tonight's discussion.

Council members were provided with a location map, characteristics of Ricker Road, site photos, benefits of allowing parking permits on Ricker Road, process, a recommendation and the characteristics of a proposed parking plan.

Mr. Koses stated that Ricker Road is close to the express bus on Tremont Street and is close to Boston. Ricker Road is 24 feet wide, a typical Newton Street width. There are no current parking restrictions. Parking observations on seven occasions show between zero and six vehicles parking on Ricker Road. It is difficult to determine if residents, nearby residents or commuters are parking on Ricker Road. The utility poles and fire hydrants are located on the west side.

Mr. Koses stated at this time, a parking permit plan is not available to commuters or non-residents. Resident parking permits on Ricker Road cannot be approved at this time due to the following current ordinance.

#### Sec. 19-201. Resident sticker and visitor permit parking program.

No petition for a restricted area will be considered unless alternative parking restrictions, such as time limitations or parking prohibitions, covering the entire proposed restricted area, have been in effect for at least one (1) year immediately prior to such consideration.

Mr. Koses then stated that resident parking stickers on Ricker Road can be approved as part of a broader village parking plan in the following current ordinance.

#### Sec. 19-202. Neighborhood parking district program.

The traffic council may, from time to time, establish neighborhood parking districts in an area comprised of contiguous streets where demand for on-street parking necessitates a comprehensive approach to managing parking. The traffic council shall establish rules and requirements particular to that district for the purpose of creating consistent parking regulations and equitably distributing parking impacts throughout the district.

Mr. Koses recommends creating a new Newton Corner Parking District plan which would allow residents to park longer than the posted limit by purchasing a parking permit and/or using free visitor passes. However, public streets are not owned by residents who live on the street, and parking on public streets across the City should be shared. Good parking policy calls for a limited number of non-resident parking permits to be made available. Up to two non-resident permits may be available for Ricker Road. Resident permits would be available to abutting homes on Ricker Road and Playstead Road. Non-residents may be residents of nearby streets, or commuters accessing the MBTA bus. Newton does not currently have these types of "commuter" or "nearby resident" parking program in place, but a program might be developed in the future.

Mr. Koses stated the Newton Corner Parking District plan would begin with a small area, including Ricker Road and Playstead Road with additional streets to subsequently join. New signage would be posted, allowing parking permits to override posted restrictions. Permits would be available to residents and a limited number of non-residents. Resident permits stickers cost \$25.00 per year for each vehicle and two free transferable visitor placards per household. Non-resident permits would potentially be made available to non-residents of the street, with a cap per street or block. Approximately every 250 feet of road is measured determining the number of non-resident permits to be issued. The program and fee would need to be approved by City Council and subsequently managed by the Newton Traffic Bureau.

Mr. Koses stated that two emails were received in support and in opposition of this request. These emails are on file. He then opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. Residents present expressed their concerns and suggestions.

#### Concerns:

A resident stated that a parking restriction is not necessary and feels that commuters are not parking up the area. A restriction will impose an inconvenience to residents. It is difficult for trash pickup and exiting driveways when vehicles park on Ricker Road. This has been an issue for many years.

#### Suggestions:

A resident suggested a more comprehensive plan to include additional streets. A suggestion was made to approve a definite number of permits for Ricker Road and Playstead Road for non-

residents. A suggestion was made to include Ricker Terrace in the Newton Corner parking District plan.

In conclusion, residents present stated that they could support the creation of a new Newton Corner Parking District plan.

Mr. Prizant suggested including Tremont Street and Washington Street as part of the plan. Parking on these streets would also deter speeders.

Without further discussion, Councilor Ciccone made a motion to hold this item with the intention of creating a new Newton Corner Parking District, to include Ricker Road, Playstead Road and Ricker Terrace. Council members agreed 5-0.

TC42-19 ISAAC PRIZANT, TRAFFIC ENINEER, on behalf of Ilana Streit, 146C Herrick

Road, requesting the addition of a stop sign at the end of Warren Street at the intersection of Langley Road and at the end of Chase Street at the intersection of

Langley Road. (Ward 6) [07/01/19 @ 2:07 PM]

**ACTION:** APPROVED 4-0 (Ciccone not voting). Approved the language of TPR 507.

TPR 507 adds stop signs at Chase Street at Langley Road, eastbound and at

Warren Street at Langley Road, westbound.

This item may be appealed through the close of business October 9, 2019.

**NOTE:** Ilana Streit did not attend tonight's discussion.

Council members were provided with a location map, site photos, vehicular and pedestrian volumes and a recommendation.

Mr. Koses recommends approving a stop sign on Chase Street at Langley Road, eastbound and approving a stop sign on Warren Street at Langley Road, westbound approaches due to the high vehicular volume collected.

Mr. Koses opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. Residents present expressed their concerns.

#### Concerns:

Several residents stated that they would support these stop signs in order to make traveling this area safer. It is difficult to exit driveways onto Langley Road and these stop signs will assist. A resident was opposed and stated that the United States has excess stop signs and cannot support this request. Rotaries help with traffic flow and safety, not stop signs.

Without further discussion, Mr. Prizant made a motion to approve this request. Council members agreed 4-0, Councilor Ciccone not voting. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business October 9, 2019.

John Daghlian, Associate City Engineer joined the Council for discussion on this

Council members were provided with a location map and proposed accessible parking space map.

Mr. Daghlian stated that he docketed this request to request two dedicated accessible parking stalls approximately 290-feet east of the Oak Street & Chestnut Street intersection along the northerly side of Chestnut Street. The two stalls would be placed on either side of a new ADA, AAB and City of Newton compliant curb cut that would allow access to the reconstructed sidewalk and to the two ADA compliant entrances to #1234 Chestnut Street office building. He then stated that the Department Public Works is requesting this to improve accessibility to the public sidewalks and office space. Two accessible parking spaces will accommodate employees, employers and the businesses. There are two accessible parking spaces approximately 200 feet from this location.

Mr. Koses stated that Council members received an email from Ms. Jini Fairley, ADA Coordinator supporting and recommending these two accessible parking spaces. Her email requests that if only one space is approved that it be the parking space in front of the access aisle.

Mr. Koses opened the discussion to members of the public. There was no public comment.

Without discussion, Mr. Prizant made a motion to approve dedicated ADA parking stalls approximately 290-feet east of the Oak Street & Chestnut Street intersection along the northerly side of Chestnut Street. Council members agreed 4-0, Councilor Ciccone not voting. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business October 9, 2019.

TC35-19 ISAAC PRIZANT, TRANSPORTATION ENGINEER, requesting the right turn

Mr. Koses stated that this request of a right turn only lane on Washington Street westbound at Jackson Road is already included in the TPR, but a right turn only lane on Washington Street westbound onto Adams Street should be removed from the Traffic and Parking Regulations (TPR). This item will not make any change to the signage in the field and will fix an error in the TPR.

Without discussion, Mr. Koses made a motion to approve this item. Council members agreed 4-0, Councilor Ciccone not voting. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business October 9, 2019.

TC50-19 ISAAC PRIZANT, TRAFFIC ENGINEER, requesting to approve a stop sign at

the Long Meadow Road northbound approach to Old Farm Road. (Ward 8)

Mr. Koses stated that there are no warrants that apply that a stop sign should be installed at this location. The 'T' intersection implies to stop. Although it is not required to install a stop sign at this location, a stop sign is allowed.

Mr. Koses opened the discussion to members of the public who were present. Residents expressed their concerns.

#### Concerns:

A resident asked why this request was docketed. Mr. Prizant answered that the request was received from a concerned resident who travels Old Farm Road and Long Meadow Road frequently stating the he has had near miss vehicle accidents and noticed that drivers fail to yield at this location. A resident spoke in opposition to this stop sign and stated that it is not necessary.

Mr. Prizant explained that the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) provides standards for the installation of stop signs. A minor approach to a "T" intersection implies stopping. A stop sign may be added at this location.

Without further discussion, Mr. Prizant made a motion to approve this request. Council members agreed 3-1, Captain Anastasia opposed and Councilor Ciccone not voting. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on October 9, 2019.

Without discussion, Mr. Koses made a motion to approve this request. Council members agreed 4-0, Councilor Ciccone not voting. Mr. Koses stated that this item may be appealed through the close of business on October 9, 2019.
