The mission of the Newton Housing and Community Development Program is to maintain the City's economic diversity; to improve the physical, social, economic and housing environments for Newton's low-and moderate-income residents; to prevent homelessness and help Newton's homeless population find housing; and to provide access to public and private facilities for people with disabilities.

FY 2018 Key Accomplishments

Funded 14 public service programs at area public and non-profit organizations.

Funded 8 programs at 5 non-profit organizations for shelter services, rapid re-housing and homelessness prevention services.

Funded production of ten (10) affordable housing units and substantially completed production of an additional nine (9) units. Funded housing rehabilitation for four (4) LMI households, substantially completed rehabilitation for one (1) additional LMI households and fully completed housing rehabilitation for eighteen (18) households; improvements included hazard abatement, emergency repairs, and accessibility improvements.

Funded the repair of curb cuts in the Carr School area, including Fair Oaks Ave, Wyoming Rd, Thaxter Rd, California St, Linwood Ave./Broadway, Fessenden St./Fair Oaks Ave., Schofield Ave/ Fair Oaks Ave., Nevada St./Churchill St., Linwood Ave./Nevada St., Nevada St./Wyoming St., Linwood Ave./Watertown St., Linwood Ave./Walnut St., Watertown St./Page Rd./Walker St Rd., Watertown St./Albermarle Rd., North St./Albermarle. and the intersections of Beacon St/Dorset Rd (Mid-Block) and Beacon St./Carlton Rd. (Midblock) in Waban, making them accessible to persons with disabilities.

Substantially completed Neighborhood Pedestrian Safety Improvements and Accessible Curb Cuts on Washington Street and around the Newton Corner Circle. Intersections included Bacon St./Washington St., Peabody St./Washington St., Channing St./Washington St., Thornton St./Washington St., Elmwood St./Park St., Pearl St./School St./Thornton St., and along Centre St.

Funded the purchase and installation of 22 Audible Pedestrian Signal (APS) units for installation at the intersections of Beacon St./Washington St., Newtonville Ave./Harvard St., and Grove St./Central St./ Auburn St. to improve accessibility and safety for all pedestrians.

Substantially complete accessible pathway improvements at Newton Highlands Playground.

Substantially completed several neighborhood improvement projects including the restoration and construction of the pedestrian bridge in Farlow Park (Newton Corner) and the Pellegrini Park Wall Design and Construction Project.

Assisted 5 income-eligible households with the newly created downpayment assistance and closing cost program at the Court Street development and resales at Hawthorne Street and Boylston Street.

Provided HOME Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) to 2 formerly homeless families.

Fund 14 public service programs through area public and non-profit organizations, with a strong focus on economic mobility and outcomes based on the Brookings Institution Benchmarks of Success.

Fund 8 programs at 5 non-profit organizations for homeless shelter services, rapid re-housing and homelessness prevention services.

<u>Architectural Access -</u> Remove architectural barriers to provide access to persons with disabilities.

Facilitate the creation of an ADA Accessible bathroom located on the first floor of Newton City Hall

<u>Neighborhood Improvements</u> - Improve public facilities including parks, through the installation of trees, pedestrian improvements, etc. in target low- and moderate-income neighborhoods.
