Fund affordable housing, historic resources, open space and outdoor recreation projects through a 1% local surcharge on Newton real estate taxes, plus state matching funds provided under the Community Preservation Act (MGL Ch. 44B).

CPC recommendations currently pending with the City Council: Haywood House/ Jackson Road Senior Housing


Proposed revisions to funding guidelines: including principles for evaluating "CPA appropriateness" as well as CPA eligibility; public hearing scheduled 3 April 2018

The *Community Preservation Plan* includes 5- and 10-year comparisons between the program's funding forecast and anticipated requests, based on both pre-proposals received and future City projects listed as CPA-eligible in the *Capital Improvement Plan*. #### Fiscal Year 2019 Desired Outcomes

Consider in the regular Fy19 fall funding round any new requests that meet 25 May 2018 pre-proposal and 28 September 2018 full proposal deadlines, providing at least 1 month's public notice for public hearings on full proposals.
