2. Commissioner's Reports on Programs, Forestry and Maintenance

- Commissioner DeRubeis announced he is retiring February 2020, after 32 years with the City.
- Hunnewell Park Off-Leash Area
 - Issues with professional dog walkers outside the designated off-leash area. Neighbors attended OLAWG meeting for a solution. The OLAWG is proposing extending the current area with fencing to make the existing area larger and would allow a pathway for passage through the park for other park users. Chairman Magni stated a public hearing is required for this request.
- Newton Highlands Playground irrigation pump was hit by lightning a new pump has been installed.

3. 244 Dudley Rd-Right of Way request-Sewer Extension - Cancelled

• Law Dept determined the resident has right of way down the paved road with appropriate permits and discussion with Parks, Recreation & Culture (P, R & C) Commissioner. 244 Dudley Rd abuts the P, R & C Administrative offices.
