Utility Discounts

Massachusetts gas, electric and telephone companies offer reduced rates to low-income customers who receive public assistance benefits (SSI, Food Stamps, MassHealth, etc) and meet income limits. Eligible customers get a 20% to 40% discount on their gas and electric rates and

a discount on basic local telephone service and installation. Utility companies enroll eligible customers automatically or customers can apply directly to their utility company.

Utility Shutoff Protection

Massachusetts laws prevent utility companies (gas & electric) from shutting off service to households in special situations. These include senior households, low-income families with infants, and people with serious illnesses who cannot afford to pay their utility bills. During the winter months, utility companies cannot shut off heating-related utilities for households with a financial hardship. For more information contact your utility company.
