Yard Waste Collection Delays

We are experiencing an unexpected delay in yard waste collection this week. Please set yard waste out on your collection day and leave it at the curb. It will be collected as soon as possible. I apologize for the inconvenience.

New: No Cartons in Your Green Bin

The recycling industry is changing, and because of that, milk, juice, cream and soup cartons now need to go in the blue bins.

Cartons were removed from the state recycling acceptance list. Recycling sorting centers don't want these cartons because:

- Cartons are difficult to recycle because they are multi-layered.
- Cartons can contaminate other recycling streams, such as paper and plastic.

The good news in Newton is that our recycling is getting cleaner because of careful sorting. Our recycling contamination level plummeted from 18 percent with a cost to the City of more than \$100,000 in fines down to 9 percent. This means that the penalty fee was eliminated as of Feb. 1 saving Newton an average of \$6,550 a month.

What are some other things that shouldn't go in the recycling bins? Plastic bags, black plastic food trays, food, Styrofoam, medicine bottles, wood, clothing, tissues and napkins.

Use Newton's Recycle Right tool (get the free app on your smart phone) to search for the best way to manage specific items.


