

- x 85th % Speed 34 mph
- x No bike facilities

- x Backup approaching St James
- x Parking North Side @ St James

Lateral Shift

Traffic calming technique to slow traffic and increase safety

- 1ncreases safety & comfort for walking and biking
- ↓ vehicle speeds
- \downarrow likelihood of crash
- \downarrow likelihood of injury







Speed Limits Explained






- Citywide <u>Statutory</u> Speed Limit, 25mph, unless otherwise posted
- Washington St <u>Regulatory</u> speed limit, 35 mph
- MassDOT oversees all regulatory speed limits. To change regulatory speed limit, City must complete and submit a speed/volume study to MassDOT. Proposed speed limit must be consistent with actual 85% speed which MassDOT defines as a safe speed. Current 85% speed is 34 mph, and a request for a lower speed limit would be rejected under current conditions.
