There are many valuable activities that students, teachers, and parents at our school could initiate in this environment including the kindergarten study of leaves in the fall, science presentations in third grade connected to their study of trees and tadpoles. Fifth graders could share their original poetry in an inviting natural setting or complete independent reading with their teachers. 
