The CPC has often met at the Senior Center in the past, for one of 2 reasons: no usable room at all was available at City Hall (often the case on Wednesday nights), or no room large enough was available at City Hall. The 2nd reason applies to May 31.

In late April, after we moved the May CPC mtg to May 31, the Planning Dept. asked us to invite the Planning & Development Board. At that time, it looked like we might have almost all P&D Board members, as well as almost all CPC mbrs, several staff members for the two boards/committees, and at least 4 presenters for the Auburn Street proposal.

To me, that sounded like Room 204 would not really have adequate room for the public, so we requested the larger room at the Senior Center.

Volunteer readers from the League of Women Voters of Newton (LWVN) have reviewed the application for the Auburn Street affordable housing proposal. We strongly recommend that the Community Preservation Committee support this proposal for the following reasons:

- The application is complete, thorough, well written and clear.
- It has the support of the State* and Newton Historical Commissions, Massachusetts EOHHS Department of Developmental Services, and the Village Bank.
- The project will fulfill a need in Newton for diverse housing made available to citizens whose needs are not traditionally met in our community.

Our readers did express concern about the expected rise in property taxes, as the current building now pays around \$10,000, but will add new units.
