**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Attach answers to the following questions. Applications will be returned as incomplete if all requested information is not provided. Include supporting materials as necessary.

1. Goals: What are the goals of the proposed project?

Newton East Little League on behalf of baseball, soccer, girl's softball and other sports leagues throughout Newton are seeking to put irrigation systems in place at certain ball fields which are heavily used throughout the year. The fields targeted are: (a) Memorial-Spaulding Upper at 250 Brookline Street; (b) Memorial-Spaulding Lower at 250 Brookline Street; (c) Bowen Elementary Field (a/k/a Thompsonville) on Cypress Street; and (d) Solomon Schechter at Stein Circle in Oak Hill. These fields also serve as the only significant open space for community gatherings for surrounding neighborhoods. The installation of irrigation systems is a long-term solution to a problem plaguing certain Newton fields that currently have no source of water other than rainwater due to a moratorium against hooking city owned fields to the public water supply.

**2.** *Community Need:* Why is this project needed? Does it address needs identified in existing City plans?

The Project is desperately needed to give the fields an opportunity to grow grass, create safe and more usable playing surfaces, as well as improve the quality of the only significant neighborhood open space. Rather than having the City pay for use of public water, the installation of irrigation systems would enable the fields to be watered through ground water and rainwater, which would be a significant cost savings over time to fields which are connected to public water.

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3. *Community Support:* What is the nature and level of support for this project? Include letters of support.

Newton East Little League is presently comprised of approximately 450 families with approximately 500 children actively playing in the league. The subject fields are also regularly used by Newton Youth Soccer and Newton Girls Soccer (representing approximately 3,500 Newton youth soccer players), Newton Girls Softball, elementary school children and many other organized and less formal sports groups. In addition, the subject fields serve as important open space for numerous neighborhoods where families come together for such activities as picnicking, strolling with dogs and kite flying.

Newton Youth Soccer has submitted a letter of support for this project and a pledge to contribute to the ongoing maintenance of the irrigation systems on these fields. A copy of same is attached hereto and marked as "Exhibit A". Similarly, the Memorial-Spaulding PTO has also submitted a letter of support for this project and a willingness to help contribute to the cost of maintaining the irrigation system for the Memorial-Spaulding fields. A copy said letter is attached hereto and marked as "Exhibit B". Also attached hereto and marked as "Exhibit C" is a letter of support from the Memorial-Spaulding Physical Education Department demonstrating the deplorable condition of these fields. Finally, attached hereto and marked collectively as "Exhibit D" are numerous signatures of support from many citizens from this community.

4. *Timeline:* What is the schedule for project implementation, including a timeline for all critical elements?

Spring 2003 Dig Test Pits to confirm ground water availability at each field.

Summer 2003 – Drill Wells at each field where water is available, install pumps and underground sprinkler system.

These fields receive the least use during the summer months and therefore it would be an ideal time to install the wells and complete the work in time for the children returning to school and the fall sport leagues.

5. *Credentials:* How will the experience of the applicant contribute to the success of this project?

Professionals are performing the Project with experience in installing irrigation systems and their related components.

(a) Skilling and Sons, Inc., the well drilling and pump installation company, has been in business for 31 years and has installed countless pump systems throughout Massachusetts. In Newton, Skilling and Sons, Inc. has drilled and installed wells and pumps at Weeks Field, Warren Field, Oak Hill Fields, Cabot Field, Lincoln Field and Cold Springs Fields. Attached hereto and marked as "Exhibit E" is a copy of a company brochure from Skilling and Sons, Inc.

(b) Lawhorn Irrigation, Inc., the irrigation installation company, has been installing systems for 25 years and has installed countless systems throughout Massachusetts.

They have installed irrigation systems for the Town of Brookline, MIT and Holy Cross University. In Newton, Lawhorn Irrigation, Inc. has installed such systems at Newton South High School, Newton North High School, Weeks Field, Warren Field and Cabot Field.

(c) Thomas Mulvaney, is a licensed electrician, has been providing similar electrical services for more than five years in various communities throughout Massachusetts.

6. Success Factors: How will the success of this project be measured? Be as specific as possible.

The irrigation systems promote water conservation, without utilizing any water from the public system and it will be a tremendous savings over time in comparison to hooking up playing fields to the public water supply, which is presently prohibited. In addition, properly irrigated fields will result in safe, user friendly and beautiful recreational space, which our entire community will enjoy.

**8.** *Other Funding:* What additional funding sources are available, committed or under consideration? Include commitment letters, if available, and describe any other attempts to secure funding for this project.

No other sources of funding or water are available for this project, however, numerous organizations, which utilize the fields, have committed to contributing to the maintenance of the irrigation systems.

9. Maintenance: If ongoing maintenance is required for your project, how will it be funded?

The Parks and Recreation Department currently provides basic maintenance to the subject fields, such as cutting, seeding and clean up, as part of the yearly Parks and Recreation Department budget. Any added annual cost to maintain the irrigated and improved fields will not be substantial. Newton East Little League, Newton Youth Soccer and the Memorial-Spaulding PTO (with respect to the Memorial-Spaulding fields) have already expressed a willingness to contribute to the annual maintenance for the irrigation systems at these fields. [Please see Exhibits A and B, referred to in ¶3, above.] It is also anticipated that other sports organizations utilizing the fields will also contribute toward any added annual costs.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Provide the following additional information, as applicable.

10. Documentation that you have control over the site, such as Purchase and Sale Agreement, option or deed.

Newton East Little League has for many years been granted permits by the City of Newton to use these fields for its Farm and T-Ball League baseball games. Typically, these fields host approximately 350 games and practices per year. Attached hereto and marked as "Exhibit J" is a copy of a recent Permit to Newton East Little League. As stated above, over the years Newton Youth Soccer, Newton Girls Soccer and Newton Girls Softball have also been granted permits to play on the subject fields and they also conduct countless games and practices each year on the fields.

11. Evidence that the project does not violate any zoning ordinance or any other laws or regulations.

This project will only enhance an existing use. No zoning changes are required and the project will not require any extraordinary approvals. The contractors will obtain the ordinary permits for their work prior to its commencement.

12. Evidence that the proposed site is free of hazardous materials or that there is a plan for remediation in place.

These fields do not contain any hazardous materials as they have been used as ball fields for many years. Upon information and belief, these fields have never been used for any commercial purpose.

13. Evidence that appropriate professional standards will be followed if construction, restoration or rehabilitation is proposed.

The contractors who have submitted bids are experienced at installing irrigation systems. Please see the credentials of the contractors set forth in ¶5 herein.

14. Information indicating how this project can be used to achieve additional community benefits.

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This Project will greatly improve fields for both recreation and important open space while promoting utilization of water conservation measures. The Project will result in safer, userfriendlier fields, which will be enjoyed by many more people throughout the City. The process of completing this application has already educated many Newton East Little League Board members on the importance of water conservation. Newton East Little League intends to utilize this project to promote the need for water conservation in the hopes of inspiring other projects in the City.





#### Rules and Regulations Governing the use of a Parks and Recreation Facility or Area

\*Constitutionally restricted discrimination will not be tolerated at public functions.

\*No elected official or candidate for public office shall be denied access to any event which is described on the permit application as a public event.

\*The City will regard a function as public where exclusive or regular use of public property has been granted unless the licensee clearly conducts its activity as private.

\*Indicia of a private event or function include but are not limited to, use of personal rather than general invitations, use of some sort of gate system or its equivalent, non-affiliation with public entities or public events.

\*A reasonable administration charge for private use of public facilities and any parks and recreational personnel will be set by the Parks and Recreation Commissioner.

\*Police protection, where deemed necessary by the Parks and Recreation Commissioner, shall be furnished by licensees at their own expense at rates to be established by the Police Chief.

\*Licensees are hereby notified that the function of City Police Officers where present in their capacity and on duty as City Police Officers, at such events, shall be to serve the public peace and safety rather than the private purposes of the group conducting a private event or activity.

\*Security or gate monitoring arrangements at private functions, where desired by the licensee, shall be made and provided by private individuals.

\*Licensees shall reimburse the City for any damage which may be done to the parks and recreation area or facilities.

The holder of this permit must conform strictly to the location, time specified and to the Rules and Regulations governing the use of playgrounds in the City of Newton.

This permit must be delivered to the Recreation Leader-In-Charge or to the Police Officer assigned. If the area is not supervised, destroy this permit when you leave the area.

This permit may be revoked by the Parks and Recreation Commissioner at any time.

The possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited on all playgrounds in the City of Newton unless otherwise noted. \*No fees may be charged for any program without the approval of the Parks and Recreation Commissioner.

If there is a duplication of permits, the permit bearing the earliest date is to be honored unless the later permit reads that it takes precedence.

Live music and use of amplifiers is prohibited except by permission of the Parks and Recreation Commissioner.

### Article VI Parks and Public Grounds.

#### Sec. 21-3 Operation of Vehicles

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No person unless by permission of the Parks and Recreation Commissioner, or on playgrounds of the Parks and Recreation Commission, shall operate a motor vehicle in or upon parks or other public grounds except upon the driveways thereof. Sec 21-4 Selling Goods and Wares: Amusements, Tents, Booths, Etc.

No person except by permission of the parks and Recreation Commissioner, or on playgrounds of the Parks and Recreation Commission, shall expose for sale or sell any good, wares or merchandise in or upon any park or other public grounds, nor erect or maintain a booth, stand, tent or apparatus of any kind for the purpose of amusement or show in any park or public grounds. Sec. 21-5 Nuisances Generally

No person shall commit a nuisance on parks or on other public grounds

Sec. 21-6 Playing Games, Etc.

No person, except by the permission of the Parks and Recreation Commissioner, or on playing grounds of the Parks and Recreation Commission, shall engage in a game of ball, football, baseball, or other athletic sports in or upon any park or public grounds, except upon such portions thereof as may be set apart for such purposes.

Sec. 21-7 Throwing Missiles

No person shall throw a stone, snowball or other missile in or upon any park or public playground.

Sec. 21-8 Damaging Property

No person shall pull up, break, cut or deface any of the seats, fences or railings upon or around any park or public grounds, not deface any monument or statue in any park or on public grounds.

Sec. 21-9 Climbing, Posting Bills on Trees

No person shall climb a tree on any park or upon other public grounds, nor post a bill nor place a sign upon or around any tree in any park or upon other public grounds of the City.

Sec. 21-10 Digging, Carrying Dirt, Etc.

No person, except by permission of the Parks and Recreation Commissioner, or on playgrounds of the Parks and Recreation Commis sion, and for some public use, shall dig or carry away any sward, grave, sand, turf or earth from, nor place or deposit or cause to be placed or deposited any stones, gravel or other substance upon any park, playground or other public grounds.

Sec. 21-11 Damaging Flowers

No person shall walk, stand, sit or lie down in or upon, or pull a flower or plant out of a flower bed, in any park or upon public grounds.

Sec. 21-12 Walking On Grass

No person shall stand, walk, or lie upon the grass in any park or upon public grounds where such walking, stand, or lying has been prohibited, and notice of such prohibition is given to the public by legible notices placed in or upon such park or public grounds.
