#02-16 Katherine and Lawrence Wangh, 20 Duffield Road, Newton Massachusetts, pursuant to M.G.L. c. 40A, § 8, and 15, of the City of Newton Zoning Ordinance Appeal of the Commissioner of Inspectional Services issuance of building permit #16010594 for the construction of a new single family home at 24 Duffield Road. The subject property is consists of an 8,492 foot lot in a Single Residence (SR-3) district.
