

Household Hazardous Waste Drop-offs for Newton residents resume Wednesday, May 14th from 7:30am-12:30pm. Drop-offs for 2014 will be every Wednesday until June 25th and then again from September 3rd—October 15th at the Resource Recovery Center at Rumford Ave. There will also be drop-offs on four separate Saturdays: May 10, June 21, September 20, and October 18. The facility will be closed in July and August, except for July 16th and August 13th.
