Dear Members of the Community Preservation Committee,

We appreciate the time and effort given to the review of our application, and also the opportunity to present our project, Kayla's Garden, to you. Upon careful reconsideration of our projected budget, we would like to inform you of an amendment to our application.

Our committee has discovered two additional sculptures that capture the feel that we hope to achieve in Kayla's Garden. We are forwarding this information to you and hope that you will consider funding any one of the three possible sculptures, along with our other budget needs as detailed in the application.

'Children of Peace' Bronze, depicts two children releasing doves. It stands 37" tall, with a cost of **\$4,500**.

'Stepping Stones' Bronze, depicts a girl with flowers in her pockets, balancing on stepping stones. It stands 47" tall, with a cost of \$8,300.

These costs include delivery charges.

The additional cost of \$1,000 by a local contractor for installation would be necessary.

We know that the effects of art in public spaces are only positive. The symbolism, beauty and everlasting material of these pieces represent the inspiration for this garden, Kayla Rosenberg.

Please find enclosed pictures and descriptions of both pieces, as well as information about the artist.

Gary Price's intent is to "lift the human spirit through sculpture." Evidence of his success in achieving this inspirational goal is found in scores of individuals, corporations, cities and foundations that have acquired his works. Gary's figurative sculpture is diverse, including animals, birds, and mystical or historical characters. 

Gary attended grade school and high school in Montpelier, Idaho. After graduating he studied at Ricks College in Rexburg, Idaho, then studied in Jerusalem, Israel for six months through Brigham Young University's Study Abroad program. After returning from Jerusalem, Gary transferred to the University of Utah in Salt Lake City where he studied under Alvin Gittins. Gary focused on the human figure which he feels the most comfortable sculpting. In 1982 he earned his B.F.A. in Painting and Drawing.



Gary in Guatemala, 1980



Gary and family


