Know all Men by these Presents,

That the City of Newton, in consideration of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$6,000)
paid by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, through the Metropolitan
Water Board, established by chapter 488 of the Acts of the year 1895, the
receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, does hereby give, grant, bargain,
sell, and convey unto the Commonwealth of Massachusetts a certain
tract of land situated in said Newton, together with the reservoir, pit
and works thereon and therein, containing five and nine one-hundredths
(5.09) acre, shown on a plan inscribed "Commonwealth of Massachusetts
Metropolitan Water Board, Plan of Haban Hill Reservoir Lot,
Newton, Mass," dated October 3, 1900, to be recorded herewith, and bound
ed and described as follows: Beginning at the point at which the
northwesterly line of Abenet road meets the northeasterly line of
Hard street, the said point being at the southwesterly end of the arc
of a circle forty-one and eighty-eight one-hundredths (41.88) feet in
length and having a radius of twenty-eight (28) feet, forming the
northwesterly extremity of said northwesterly line, and from said point
of beginning running north $71^{\circ} 23' 30''$ west by the northeasterly line of
said Hard street four hundred and two and seventy-one (402.71) feet;
then northwesterly forty-six and thirteen one-hundredths (46.13) feet by
the arc of a circle having a radius of twenty-eight (28) feet and
forming the northwesterly extremity of the southeasterly side of a
private street adjoining the granted premises on the west and north;
then northerly two hundred ninety-three and forty-three one-hundredths
(293.43) feet by a line curving to the left and having a radius of six
hundred seventy-seven and ninety-six one-hundredths (677.96) feet; then
northeasterly forty-four and forty-four one-hundredths (44.44) feet by a
line curving to the right and having a radius of forty (40) feet;
then easterly two hundred eighty-seven and eighty-seven one-hun-
dredths (287.87) feet by a line curving to the right and having a
radius of three hundred fifty (350) feet; then south 71° east two
hundred fifty-one and thirty-two one-hundredths (251.32) feet; then

southeasterly twenty-four and sixty-one one-hundredths (24.61) feet by a line curving to the right, having a radius of fifteen (15) feet, the last six courses being by the line of a private street upon the westerly and northwesterly sides of the granted premises; then running south 23° west by the northwesterly line of said Abenit road four hundred twenty-seven and forty-six one-hundredths (427.46) feet to the northeasterly end of the arc of a circle first herein mentioned, near the junction of Abenit road with Ward street; then northwesterly by said arc forty-one and eighty-four one-hundredths (41.84) feet to the point of beginning. Said Abenit road is forty (40) feet in width for the greater part of its length near Ward street, and the southeasterly side thereof is for the greater part of its length near Ward street a straight line running through the centre of two stone bounds as shown on said plan. Being the greater part of the premises conveyed by Frederick H. Langert to the City of Newton by deed dated October 4, 1875, and recorded with Middlesex South District Deeds, Book 1369, page 47; together with the right to use for all purposes of a public street in said Newton said Abenit road and the unnamed street shown on said plan on the westerly and northwesterly sides of the granted premises. It is understood and agreed that the covered reservoir situated northeasterly from the granted premises will be allowed by the grantee to overflow into the reservoir upon the granted premises as at present; and that the Metropolitan Water Board will, until such time as the City of Newton obtains a regular supply from the Metropolitan Water Works, furnish water to the City of Newton free from charge in all cases of emergency except a deficiency in the capacity of the sources of supply, and in each year a total quantity of water equal to the contents of the reservoir upon the granted premises, do have and to hold the granted premises, to the said Commonwealth of Massachusetts and its assigns, to its and their own use and benefit forever. And the City of Newton hereby covenants with the said Commonwealth and its assigns that it is lawfully seized in fee simple of the granted premises; that they are free from all incumbrances; that it has good right to sell and convey the same as aforesaid; and that it will warrant and defend the same to the said Commonwealth and its assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons. In witness whereof the City of Newton has caused its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed and there presents to be signed, acknowledged, and delivered in its name and behalf by Edward B. Hilton, its Mayor, hereto duly authorized, this twelfth day of October in the year one thousand nine, hundred City of Newton by Edward B. Hilton Mayor (Corporate seal).  That the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, by Henry H. Sprague, William R. Evans, and Henry P. Walcott, the Metropolitan Water Board, duly constituted and appointed under and according to the provisions of chapter 488 of the acts of the legislature of the Commonwealth of the year 1895, by virtue and in exercise of the power and authority of said act and of every other power and authority hereto enabling, and in partial execution of said powers and authorities, hereby takes in fee for the Metropolitan Water Works provided for by said act a certain tract of land situate in NEWTON, in the county of Middlesex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, together with the reservoir, pipes and works thereon and therein, containing five and nine one-hundredths (5.09) acres, shown on a plan inscribed "Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Metropolitan Water Board, Plan of Waban Hill Reservoir lot, NEWTON, Mass.", dated October 3, 1900, and recorded with Middlesex South District Deeds, book of plans 126, plan 36, and bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the point at which the northwesterly line of Manet road meets the northeasterly line of Ward street, the said point being at the southwesterly end of the arc of a circle forty-one and eighty-four one-hundredths (41.84) feet in length and having a radius of twenty-eight (28) feet, forming the southwesterly extremity of said northwesterly line, and from said point of beginning running north $71^{\circ} 23' 30''$ west by the northeasterly line of said Ward street four hundred and two and seventy-one one-hundredths (402.71) feet;

Then northwesterly forty-six and thirteen one-hundredths (46.13) feet by the arc of a circle having a radius of twenty-eight (28) feet and forming the southwesterly extremity of the southeasterly side of a private street adjoining the premises hereby taken on the west and north; then northerly two hundred ninety-three and forty-three one-hundredths (293.43) feet by a line curving to the left and having a radius of six hundred seventy-seven and ninety-six one-hundredths (677.96) feet; then northeasterly forty-four and forty-four one-hundredths (44.44) feet by a line curving to the right and having a radius of forty (40) feet; then easterly two hundred eighty-seven and eighty-seven one-hundredths (287.87) feet by a line curving to the right and having a radius of three hundred fifty (350) feet; then south 71° east two hundred fifty-one and thirty-two one-hundredths (251.32) feet; then southeasterly twentyfour and sixty-one one-hundredths (24.61) feet by a line curving to the right, having a radius of fifteen (15) feet, the last six courses being by the line of a private street upon the westerly and northerly sides of the premises hereby taken; then running south 23° west by the northwesterly line of

said Manet road four hundred twenty-seven and forty-six one-hundredths (427.46) feet to the northeasterly end of the arc of a circle first herein mentioned, near the junction of Manet road with Ward street; then southwesterly by said arc forty-one and eighty-four one-hundredths (41.84) feet to the point of beginning.

Said Manet road is forty (40) feet in width for the greater part of its length near Ward street, and the southeasterly side thereof is for the greater part of its length near Ward street a straight line running through the centres of two stone bounds as shown on said plan.

And the Commonwealth hereby further takes the right to use, in common with all other persons so entitled, for all purposes of a public street in said NEWTON, said Manet road and the unnamed street shown on said plan on the westerly and northerly sides of the premises hereby taken.

Being the same premises conveyed by the City of NEWTON to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts by deed dated October 12, 1900, and recorded as aforesaid, book 2853, page 42, and are hereby taken subject as therein mentioned, and especially to the agreement therein contained, that the waters in the covered reservoir situate northeasterly from the premises hereinbefore taken shall be allowed to overflow into the reservoir upon said premises, as at the date of said deed.

The lands, property, rights and easements herein described and hereby taken are deemed by said Board to be necessary for carrying out the powers and duties conferred upon it by said act.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the said Henry H. Sprague, Wilmot R. Evans, and Henry P. Walcott, the Metropolitan Water Board aforesaid, acting for the Commonwealth, hereto set their hands, this fourth day of March in the year one thousand nine hundred and one.


